Chippenham Link provides a community transport service, helping people within our community get to their medical appointments. Most of our users are elderly or have infirmities that make accessing public transport difficult.

The charity is managed by a small team of Trustees, who meet regularly to ensure that the charity is operating in line with its constitution and is meeting the objects set out in its governing document. The Trustees believe that Chippenham Link provides public benefit in line with the guidance issued by the Charity Commission. The Trustees of Chippenham Link do not benefit from the services that the charity provides.

During 2024, Chippenham Link undertook 5,140 journeys, transporting people of Chippenham to medical appointments and social activities, travelling in excess of 104,000 miles. Our 38 volunteers gave an average of 292 hours each to support our local community.
