The church appointed Mr Rob Parson as pastor who serves along with three other elders: Mr A Fairnington, Mr. S Hawkin and Mr. M. Fulton.

Independent examiner's report to the trustees of Wooler Evangelical Church

I report on the accounts of the Trust for the period 1st September 2021 to 31st August 2022.

Respective Responsibilities of Trustees and Examiner
