2024 OVERVIEW

2024 had a full calendar of events planned into it.



March saw our annual Leaders gathering at St George's House, Georgeham, North Devon. Our sincere thanks go to Baz and the team there for welcoming and hosting us so faithfully. We gathered 30 volunteer leaders to share, encourage, equip and send back out into our surf community mission field. We are always blown away with God's goodness towards the work of Christian Surfers and feel so blessed to have such a great dedicated team across the UK.

April saw the 16th Jesus Longboard Classic take place in Polzeath, with the generous support of our friends at Tubestation. Over two days we saw 80 competitors join us in this much loved surf competition that brings a beautiful community of longboard surfers together from across the UK, serving them and speaking Jesus into surfing.



June had us carry out our National Gathering at a new location - Menadue Farm, North Cornwall- which was an incredible blessing for all who came. Our opportunity to connect as the wider Christian family around worship, word, surfing and fire pit conversation. This year we hosted 80 attendees from the UK and Holland. Members and friends alike joined in an awesome weekend of fun and fellowship.





August saw a dedicated team of 12 volunteers serving at the World Surf League Boardmasters Surf Competition, Fistral Beach, Newquay Cornwall. 250 competitors eating through nearly 300 breakfast and lunches over 5 days, the partnership with the surf competition over 20 years has continued to grow and we were thrilled once again to serve and outreach at such a prestigious event.

September saw our long standing Jesus Surf Classic Competition at Croyde being postponed due to unsurfable conditions. Where were pleased to have gained 120 competitors and 30 volunteers for the two day event, each where sad not to see it go ahead but look forward to the next one.



October saw our 2nd Mens Weekend at OA Surf Club in Widemouth Bay. This three day event had 25 men enjoy fellowship, teaching and surfing together, building community and faith.

November saw our 7th annual Women's weekend taking place at St George's House, Georgham, North Devon. With a full house of 32 women of mixed surf ability, this three day event brought joy and spiritual nourishment to those that attended. Thanks to our 6 volunteer female leaders we celebrated another year of new members and friends into Christian Surfers.



Behind all these events is a raft of faithful, generous, beautiful volunteers, partnerships and collaborations. You know who you are and we thank you for helping to make CSUK what it is.

Beyond all the CSUK main events, Phil continued to serve and support the wider UK surf community in a variety of ways.

The Future: *2025 and beyond*

2024 has been a pivotal year for CSUK with the announcement from Phil Williams of his intention to step down from the role of CSUK National Director. The Trustee body is confident in its ability to establish an appropriate transition board and to successfully recruit a new National Director into the role during 2025. We look forward to all that God will reveal in this process. As ever our eyes are on Him who calms the wind and the waves (Matthew 8:27).



CSUK ACCOUNTS FINANCIAL NOTES



Summary

In summary net contribution to reserves of £27,613, of which £20,931 was unrestricted and £6,682 was restricted. Total reserves as at 31 December 2024 were £149,580, of which £123,305 is unrestricted and £26,275 is restricted. Details of the restricted funds are in the notes to the accounts.

Reserves

Since 31st December 2024, there have been significant changes in staff and structure. The unusually large reserves are to support the new staff and other costs while a sustainable income strategy is developed. A full review of structures, processes and ways of working will be undertaken to ensure we are using CSUK funds effectively. It is anticipated that once this transition period is over the reserves policy will be reviewed again.

2023 HIGHLIGHTS



It was great to get back to full activities working closely with so many different parts of the UK surfing community for which we continue to be hugely appreciative of the opportunities, and of all the volunteers that make serving at these events possible.

Jesus Longboard Classic

As a result of many of the leadership been involved with the Christian surfers Europe Middle East and Africa gathering which was scheduled for early October it was decided for the first time to move the very popular longboard classic to an earlier spring date in April. This event attracted around 80 of the U.K.'s top longboard community and was supported by around 30 of the CSUK members and friends ensuring a really well-run event. Some great waves and a positive weekend, moving the date worked well and enabled us to continue to invest in the longboard community.



National Gathering:

The national gathering took place at Polzeath with an internal focus very much based at growing the UK mission, reconnecting and focusing on our core values and key leaders as well as welcoming many new faces. Events throughout the weekend included a beach clean on the Saturday and an open-air communion on the beach on Sunday, before joining with the Tubestation community to close a fantastic weekend in bright sunshine.



Jesus Surf Classic

The Jesus Surf classic was a bit of a challenge in the year with the first scheduled date being postponed due to flat conditions, and then the second weekend it literally was a weekend of two halves. The first day was small clean conditions and sunny and took place at Croyde, whereas on the Sunday conditions grew significantly and therefore the contest had to be transferred to

Putsborough for the remainder of the contest; the finals were held in excellent conditions. These circumstances impacted our finances as we incurred a number of additional costs and lost out on some revenues. The event still attracted around 140 competitors with others turned away and a great crew of around 50 CSUK volunteers and friends.



CS EMEA Gathering

With national director Phil Williams also the director of CS Europe it was a busy October for Phil and many of the others involved with CSUK leadership as they helped and attended the Europe Middle East Africa gathering in south-west France. A really encouraging time with around 160 surf missionaries from throughout the region, where the vision for 2030 was shared by Roy Harley, the international director, of having CS missions in a hundred affiliated countries, with a thousand core groups and 2% of the online surfing content, quite a challenge.

So, for CSUK how can we best contribute to that vision more of that in the coming years.



Men's Gathering

Following on of the success of the women's gathering 2023 saw the launch of the first men's gathering in November. It was great to gather like-minded men, to have time to share faith and surf. We will build on the success of this year for future years. We continued to pray for opportunities to serve and to pray for surfers within this UK surfing community during this year and were amazed at the number of opportunities that continue to develop. From feedback received CSUK's support of British surfing was widely appreciated, and we could not do that without the support of so many of our members, volunteers, trustees and wider leadership



CSUK ACCOUNTS FINANCIAL NOTES



Summary

Overall another positive year financially with both income and expenditure similar to 2022 which meant a net contribution to ongoing reserves of around £11.2 K.

At the end of the 2023 year the total reserves in the bank amounted to just over £122k of which £18k of this is restricted and mainly connected with Phil Williams European role.

With regards to our membership it continued to show slow growth, with around 350 members but numerous other people on the fringes who are actively involved in the ministry.

Reserves

At this stage the amount of reserves is above what we would normally expect. Over the course of 2024/25 the volunteer national director will be stepping down it is anticipated that the new national director will be employed, the reserves will be used to ‘pump prime’ this role and develop a sustainable income strategy. A full review of structures, processes and ways of working will be undertaken to ensure we are using CSUK funds effectively. It is anticipated that once this transition period is over the reserves policy will be reviewed again.



Main Events

Christian surfers undertake numerous national and local events, both internally and serving the wider surfing community.

The aim of these events is to continue to integrate ourselves into the surfing community by supporting the organisers, as well as was running our own competitions and gatherings. Our Jesus Surf Series competitions are regarded as outreach opportunities and therefore there is always a cost to these; combined in 2023 this amounted to a £1540 deficit, but the benefits are far wider than purely financial.

Externally we get involved in serving the Welsh and Scottish surf federations at their national gathering as well as serving at the Boardmasters in Newquay. Overall, these tend to breakeven or provide a small contribution to be invested in the ongoing mission.

The Future 2024 and beyond

Looking ahead to 2024 and beyond the charity will be going through a period of change as the national director of over 30 years has indicated he will be stepping down in the summer of 2025. A transition board will be established to oversee this process.

We believe that the organisation is now focusing more on building the ministry, we have a really strong base of trustees as well as a leadership team and the organisation is all set for a period of growth.

2021 ANNUAL REPORT SUMMARY

Unfortunately 2021 continued with lockdowns as in the previous year and continued to take the ministry of Christian Surfers UK through circumstances which we never anticipated.

The good news was that we continued to find ways of connecting remotely and as the year moved on it was so good to be able to slowly build back and meet again face to face in our various regional communities. A big thank you to our members, friends, and church partners for your continued support and for sticking with us through what has been the unusual and challenging 12 months covered by this annual report.

INTRODUCTION

The vision of CSUK is 'to give every surfer and every surfing community the opportunity to know and follow Christ.' That vision statement is traditionally carried out through initiatives ranging from individual discipleship, to serving at high profile surfing contests throughout the UK and beyond.

We have been focused on that mission for just over 30 years, and I am pleased to say that it is as relevant today as it was at the start. The enthusiasm, passion and willingness to serve the surfing community, remains at the heart of the charity.

Last year really was a tale of two halves, with the various lockdowns restricting what we did up until July, and then from the summer onwards a whole raft of events were condensed into a few short months, which meant that the staff and volunteer events team were kept really busy right up until the end of October. The organisation was fortunate to have a strong trustee and leadership team, and whilst we were anticipating some really tough financial challenges, strangely enough, because of the pandemic we actually ended the year in quite a positive position, as most of our events cost us money to put them on.

SOME HIGHLIGHTS FROM 2021

REGIONAL GATHERINGS

Unfortunately, we were unable to hold our single site national gathering on its traditional June weekend due to Covid restrictions. However, one of the highlights of the year was to encourage lots of small CSUK gatherings around the country. We ended up having around 20 such gatherings from as far south as Cornwall, into Scotland, East Anglia, West Wales and indeed over in Northern Ireland. Some were on a very small scale with three or four, with others up to 20 to 25 people; a fantastic and encouraging time which reminded us of the importance of community.

THE LONG PADDLE

A great partnership which evolved during the year was with the Above Water charity whose founder, Brendon Prince, was trying to be the first person to stand up paddle board around the whole of the UK coast.

The focus of the event was water safety, and Phil, CSUK National Director, and Brendon connected to use the CS network to help support this venture which involved paddling over 4000 km in 141 days, starting and ending in Torquay. CS members around the country were able to support Brendon in all sorts of practical ways, and in addition to CS supporting the event, Above Water chose CSUK as one of their charities to benefit from funds raised on this epic voyage. A fantastic example of partnership.

JESUS SURF SERIES - BACK ON THE BEACHES

After 2020's online version of the Jesus Surf Series, it was great to get back to being able to organise and host both the Jesus Surf Classic and the Jesus Longboard Classic in person during the autumn, at Croyde Bay and Polzeath respectively.

However, conditions for the 29th Jesus Surf Classic were very challenging due to wildly varying surf forecasts, which meant in the end we could only run the older categories on the Saturday, with no

junior categories. A tough call and a real shame, but the right decision in the end. One week later we ran the Jesus longboard Classic in great conditions with a record number of entrants and quality surf. The gospel was shared through the surfers blessing, and it reminded us of the importance of events such as this.

We continued to pray for opportunities to serve and to pray for surfers within this UK surfing community during this year, and despite the obvious challenges were amazed at the number of opportunities that continue to develop. From feedback received, CSUK's support of British surfing is widely appreciated, and we could not do that without the support of so many of our members, volunteers, trustees, and wider leadership team.

2020 ANNUAL REPORT SUMMARY

I don't think any of us realised quite what a huge change 2020 would be. It was a year when we had great plans to celebrate our 30th anniversary of the mission; it was a year in the ministry that we will never forget, with the vast majority of our events not taking place in the traditional way. Yet we believe that we were able to continue to invest in the surfing community we are there to serve, but in a completely fresh way. We have learnt things which we will carry forward and include in future years. Massive thanks are due to our members, friends and church partners for their continued support and for sticking with us through what has been a completely different and challenging 12 months, details of which are summarised in this Annual Report.

INTRODUCTION

The vision of CSUK is 'to give every surfer and every surfing community the opportunity to know and follow Christ.' This vision statement is traditionally carried out through initiatives ranging from individual discipleship, to serving at high profile surfing contests throughout the UK and beyond.

Despite the many months of lockdown, the quality and numbers of our members in the year continued to increase, so finding ways to connect, which we did, was key to the success of the year. The organisation was fortunate to have a strong trustee and a leadership team, and whilst we were facing some really tough financial challenges, thankfully, despite the pandemic, we actually ended the year in quite a positive position.

SOME HIGHLIGHTS FROM 2019

30 years of the ministry 2020 was completely different to how we had anticipated it to be, but it would have been wrong not to celebrate our 30th anniversary and give thanks for this in the Annual report. From those very early days, with just a few individuals meeting in North Devon and a couple of other UK contacts, the mission has moved on considerably and continues to develop. The vision, however, remains the same, to reach out to the surfers in our communities, with a message of hope, love, and faith to those that want to know about it. To all those who have played a role in our history, we thank you and ask for your continued prayers as we move forward.

Adapting to working and communicating remotely

As we were unable to engage with the most important aspects of our mission, learning to communicate and move forward remotely became a key priority, thereby remaining in contact with the surfing community and our members. We were fortunate enough to be able to hold our Leaders' Gathering in person just before the March lockdown, but the Annual Gathering, the AGM and the International Gathering of Christian Surfers were all held online using various media and platforms, with live as well as pre-recorded elements. The positive thing was that we were able to engage with many of those who wouldn't otherwise have been able to travel to some of our gatherings. We also held regular catch-ups within various groups around the country, for those who were struggling or just wanted to remain connected, especially during the lockdown when many of our members were not allowed to surf.

Jesus Surf Series online The Jesus Surf Series remains one of our most high-profile initiatives, but we realised that in reality we couldn't run these events face-to-face. Rather than give up and do nothing for 2020 we investigated a number of options and came up with a

really exciting online surf competition format. We engaged both the longboard and shortboard communities by using a platform called Clippero, and set up a period of one month during which surfers of different age groups and different genres could upload videos of themselves surfing throughout the UK. On deadline day they were judged by a panel of judges and there was an awards presentation, in the same way as normal. There was lots of interest generated, some great entries, and the presentation evening was a lot of fun. The great news was that we remained connected to the competitive surfing community.

30th anniversary Second Day magazine

One of the initiatives we didn't want to miss was to celebrate our 30th year by looking back at our history and some of the key events which shaped where we are today. It was a lot of fun going back through all the archives, finding original pictures, contacting some of the original members, and pulling together a bumper 30th year anniversary colour edition of Second Day magazine. It was also a pleasure to be able to give a copy to those in the surf industry who have been part of our story, not only just to those who have faith but also our surf industry partners and friends, with whom we have worked during these first 30 years. Reading through the magazine made us realise how many lives have been changed as a result of our message of hope, love and faith.

We continued to pray for opportunities to serve and for surfers within the UK surfing community during the year, and despite the obvious challenges were amazed at the number of opportunities that arose. From feedback received CSUK's support of British surfing was widely appreciated, and we could not do that without the support of so many of our volunteers. We are so thankful.

STRUCTURE OF CHRISTIAN SURFERS UK

CSUK is part of Christian Surfers International, which is reaching out to surfers in over 30 countries around the world. It has been a registered charity since 1999 (charity number 1070830).

BOARD OF TRUSTEES

A board of trustees oversees the work and these individuals come from a variety of backgrounds, from ordained ministers to significant individuals within the surfing community.

STAFF TEAM

CSUK does not employ any staff. The organisation is run by a national director, a media director, these two key people live by faith and give their time freely. We are also fantastically supported by a part time, self-employed administrator.
