TRUSTEES' REPORT

The Trustees present their report and financial statements for the year ended 31 March 2025. The information on page 2 forms part of the Trustees' Report.

The Trustees confirm that the annual report and financial statements of the charity have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) - Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019) and the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102).

Structure, Governance and Management

The Cumberland Building Society Charitable Foundation ('the Foundation') was incorporated on 12 November 1998 as a company limited by guarantee. It is governed by a Memorandum and Articles of Association. On 7 October 2019, the Foundation converted to a community interest organisation, and its existing Trustees either resigned by virtue of their ineligibility to hold office under the Foundation's new constitution, or subsequently resigned after appointing replacement Trustees. As at 31 March 2025 there are five Trustees, whom are employees of the Cumberland Building Society ('the Society').

The Trustees who have served during the year are set out on page 2.

Objectives and Activities for the Public Benefit

The objectives of the foundation are to hold the capital and income on trust, to apply the income and/or capital for charitable purposes and to make donations to charitable causes for the benefit of persons living within the Society's operating region of Cumbria, Dumfriesshire, Lancashire (Preston and Lancaster area) and Northumberland (Haltwhistle area). The current policy of the Trustees is to make a relatively large number of small donations across the whole of the geographical areas above, with a view to reaching local community groups, where often small donations of funds can have significant impacts. The Trustees confirm that they have referred to the guidance contained in the Charity Commission's general guidance on public benefit when reviewing the Foundation's objectives and in planning future activities and setting the grant making policy for the year ahead.

Achievements and Future Plans

The Foundation aims to distribute all funds, depending on the number and suitability of requests received.

In line with its objectives, the Foundation made 172 donations for public benefit in the year (2024: 163), with an average value of £137 (2024: £149). The Foundation reviewed 196 requests for funding in the year (2024: 171). Donations were made throughout the Foundation's geographical area and were monitored to make sure that all areas were appropriately covered.

Two examples of the donations made for public benefit are:

- A donation was made to CancerCare North Lancashire and South Cumbria to support its annual Santa Dash. This is a fundraising event which helps generate funds for the charity which is used to help support visitors to the centre as well as providing therapies and counselling for people in the area who have been affected by cancer and bereavement.

- A donation was made to Kendal Community First Responders which helped purchase a defibrillator for use in the local community. Community First Responders are volunteers who give time freely to help care for people and save lives in their community.

Financial Review

During the year, the Foundation received income of £23,602 (2024: £24,333) and made donations to charitable causes totalling £23,602 (2024: £24,333). No administrative expenditure was incurred in the year (2024: £nil).

Reserves Policy

The Foundation is able to distribute all remaining funds after paying any administrative expenses incurred which have not been paid for by the Cumberland Building Society. The Trustees consider all reserves to be free reserves.

Grant Making Policy

The Foundation has an established grant making policy to achieve its objects as stated above for the public benefit. To make donations to charitable institutions and causes within the local area as specified above in such a manner that the Trustees in their absolute discretion see fit.

Risk Management

The Trustees have identified and considered the major risks to which the Foundation is exposed and reviewed the procedures in place to manage the risks.

Trustee Appointment and Removal

The power for the appointment or removal of Trustees lies with the Board of Trustees and is set out in rules 10 and 12 of the Foundation's Constitution.

NOTES (FORMING PART OF THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS)

1. Accounting Policies

The following accounting policies have been applied consistently in dealing with items which are considered material in relation to the financial statements.

1.1 Basis of Preparation

The financial statements are prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) - Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019) and the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102).

Cumberland Building Society Charitable Foundation meets the definition of a public entity under FRS 102. Assets and liabilities are recognised at historical cost or transaction value.

In accordance with the FRS 102 SORP the charity is not required to include a statement of cash flows.

The financial statements are presented in sterling which is the functional currency of the charity and rounded to the nearest £ sterling.

1.2 Donations

Donations are accounted for as they are received. Any related tax credits are accounted for on an accruals basis.

1.3 Charitable Expenditure

Charitable grants and donations are included in the Statement of Financial Activities when Trustees convey their intention to pay a donation to a recipient.

1.4 Unrestricted Funds

Unrestricted funds are donations and other incoming resources receivable or generated for the objects of the charity without further specified purpose and are available as general funds. These funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objects at the discretion of the Trustees.

1.5 Taxation

The charitable foundation is exempt from taxation on its charitable activities falling within Chapter 3 of Part 11 of the Corporation tax Act 2010 or Section 256 of the Taxation of Chargeable Gains Act 1992 to the extent that these are applied to its charitable objects. All of the charity's income is applied for charitable purposes.

2. Critical Accounting Adjustments and Key Sources of Estimation Uncertainty

In the application of the charity's accounting policies, which are described in note 1, the Trustees are required to make judgements, estimates and assumptions about the carrying amounts of assets and liabilities that are not readily apparent from other sources. The estimates and associated assumptions are based on historical experience and other factors that are considered to be relevant. Actual results may differ from these estimates.

The estimates and underlying assumptions are reviewed on an ongoing basis. Revisions to accounting estimates are recognised in the period in which the estimate is revised if the revision affects only that period or in the period of the revision and future periods if the revision affects both current and future periods.

The Trustees do not consider there to be any critical judgements or sources of estimation uncertainty requiring disclosure beyond the accounting policies listed above.

In line with its objectives, the Foundation made 163 donations for public benefit in the year (2023: 159), with an average value of £149 (2023: £155). The Foundation reviewed 171 requests for funding in the year (2023: 162). Donations were made throughout the Foundation's geographical area and were monitored to make sure that all areas were appropriately covered.

Two examples of the donations made for public benefit are:

- A donation was made to Derian House Children's Hospice which covers South Lakeland and Lancashire. Derian House are a specialist service providing respite and end-of-life care to more than 400 babies, children and young people who have life limiting conditions (for which there is no reasonable hope of cure, and from which they will ultimately die prematurely). Funding was allocated for six end of life comfort packs. These packs are given to children and young people who

choose to die at home and contain various items including lip balm, handheld fans and silk to provide comfort during this time.

- A donation was made to Egremont Cricket Club who were running a summer cricket school for local children. They were focused on hosting a 2-day event to support children in the local community, providing children with a free nutritious meal to help tackle the holiday hunger crisis and 100 children benefited from the event.

Financial Review

Trustees' Report

The Trustees present their report and financial statements for the year ended 31 March 2023. The information on page 2 forms part of the Trustees' Report.

The Trustees confirm that the annual report and financial statements of the charity have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) - Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019) and the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102).

Structure, Governance and Management

The Cumberland Building Society Charitable Foundation ('the Foundation') was incorporated on 12 November 1998 as a company limited by guarantee. It is governed by a Memorandum and Articles of Association. On 7 October 2019, the Foundation converted to a community interest organisation, and its existing Trustees either resigned by virtue of their ineligibility to hold office under the Foundation's new constitution, or subsequently resigned after appointing replacement Trustees. As at 31 March 2023 there is one Trustee, whom is an employee of the Cumberland Building Society ('the Society').

The Trustees who have served during the year are set out on page 2.

Objectives and Activities for the Public Benefit

The objectives of the Foundation are to hold the capital and income on trust, to apply the income and/or capital for charitable purposes and to make donations to charitable causes for the benefit of persons living within the Society's operating region of Cumbria, Dumfriesshire, Lancashire (Preston and Lancaster area) and Northumberland (Haltwhistle area). The current policy of the Trustees is to make a relatively large number of small donations across the whole of the geographical areas above, with a view to reaching local community groups, where often small donations of funds can have significant impacts. The Trustees confirm that they have referred to the guidance contained in the Charity Commission's general guidance on public benefit when reviewing the Foundation's objectives and in planning future activities and setting the grant making policy for the year ahead.

Achievements and Future Plans

The Foundation aims to distribute all funds, depending on the number and suitability of requests received.

Local donations totalling £24,643 were made in the year (2022: £7,369). The large increase in local donations during 2023 is due to prior year donations through the branch network being significantly lower as a result of Covid-19 restrictions impacting local groups and organisations activities. Due to this, in 2022 additional donations of £15,000 were directed to support other community projects.

In line with its objectives, the Foundation made 159 donations for public benefit in the year (2022: 63), with an average value of £155 (2022: £355). The Foundation reviewed 162 requests for funding in the year (2022: 69). Donations were made throughout the Foundation's geographical area and were monitored to make sure that all areas were appropriately covered.

Two examples of the donations made for public benefit are:

- A donation was made to Whitehaven First Responders to purchase a Laerdal Little Anne QCPR upgrade kit which attaches to 'Anne'. Anne is used for providing CPR training to children and local community groups.
- A donation to Sight Advice South Lakes based in Kendal towards their One Stop Hub which helps local people that have lost their sight. They provide practical advice on equipment for the home, emotional support and promote independence, life skills and social inclusion.

Financial Review

During the year, the Foundation received income of £24,643 (2022: £22,369) and made donations to charitable causes totalling £24,643 (2022: £22,369). No administrative expenditure was incurred in the year (2022: £nil).

Reserves Policy

The Foundation is able to distribute all remaining funds after paying any administrative expenses incurred which have not been paid for by the Cumberland Building Society. The Trustees consider all reserves to be free reserves.

Grant Making Policy

The Foundation has an established grant making policy to achieve its objects as stated above for the public benefit. To make donations to charitable institutions and causes within the local area as specified above in such a manner that the Trustees in their absolute discretion see fit.

Risk Management

The Trustees have identified and considered the major risks to which the Foundation is exposed and reviewed the procedures in place to manage the risks.

Trustee Appointment and Removal

The power for the appointment or removal of Trustees lies with the Board of Trustees and is set out in rules 10 and 12 of the Foundation's Constitution.

Due to Covid-19 restrictions impacting the activities of local groups and organisations, a lower value of donations were made directly through the branch network. As a result, funds were directed to support other projects in the community such as the £1,250 donation to the Brathay Trust. Donations totalling £15,000 were made to Cumbria Community Foundation (CCF); £10,000 to support the resettlement of Ukrainian refugees in the local area and £5,000 was added to a strategic community fund with CCF.

In line with its objectives, the Foundation made 63 donations for public benefit in the year (2021: 48), with an average value of £355 (2021: £498). The Foundation reviewed 69 requests for funding in the year (2021: 231). Donations were made throughout the Foundation's geographical area and were monitored to make sure that all areas were appropriately covered.

Two examples of the donations made for public benefit are:

- A donation was made to Richard Rose Academy to fund a day trip for vulnerable students to visit a Forest School.
- Sponsorship of the A-Level Maths awards at the Queen Elizabeth Grammar School in Penrith. The local Branch Manager presented the award to the winner who had outstanding achievements in maths during the academic year

The following accounting policies have been applied consistently in dealing with items which are considered material in relation to the financial statements.

Basis of Preparation

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention modified to include certain items at fair value, in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice "Accounting and Reporting by Charities (SORP 2019)" applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) and the Charities Act 2011.

Trustees' report

The Trustees present their report and financial statements for the year ended 31 March 2021. The information on page 2 forms part of the Trustees' Report.

The accounts in the current year are prepared under FRS 102 "The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland".

Structure, governance and management

The Cumberland Building Society Charitable Foundation ('the Foundation') was incorporated on 12 November 1998 as a company limited by guarantee. It is governed by a Memorandum and Articles of Association. On 7 October 2019, the Foundation converted to a community interest organisation, and its existing trustees either resigned by virtue of their ineligibility to hold office under the Foundation's new constitution, or subsequently resigned after appointing replacement trustees. At 31 March 2021 there are three trustees, all of whom are employees of Cumberland Building Society.

The Trustees who have served during the year are set out on page 2.

Objectives and activities for the public benefit

The objectives of the Foundation are to hold the capital and income on trust, to apply the income and/or capital for charitable purposes and to make donations to charitable causes for the benefit of persons living within the Society's operating region of Cumbria, Dumfriesshire, Lancashire (Preston and Lancaster area) and Northumberland (Haltwhistle area). The current policy of the Trustees is to make a relatively large number of small donations across the whole of the geographical areas above, with a view to reaching local community groups, where often small donations of funds can have significant impacts. The Trustees confirm that they have referred to the guidance contained in the Charity Commission's general guidance on public benefit when reviewing the Foundation's objectives and in planning future activities and setting the grant making policy for the year ahead.

Achievements and future plans

The Foundation aims to distribute all funds, depending on the number and suitability of requests received.

In line with its objectives above the Foundation has made 48 donations for public benefit with an average value of approximately £508. In the period the Foundation reviewed 231 requests for funding. Donations were made throughout the Foundation's geographical area and were monitored to make sure that all areas were appropriately covered.

Two examples of the many grants made for public benefit are:

- A donation of £250 was given to Carlisle Covid-19 Community Action Group to help provide food parcels for families (circa 2000) in the local area who were severely impacted during school holidays because of the pandemic and would have been eligible for a free school meal during term time.
- A donation of £200 was given to a local West Cumbrian Rotary Club to purchase outdoor bikes for Mayfield School and a specialist Autism school, both schools are based in West Cumbria, the donation was to help children build confidence and motor skills outdoors.

Financial Review

The Foundation has received income of £23,875, made donations of £23,875 to charitable causes during the year in line with the Foundation's objectives and incurred no administrative expenses.

Reserves policy

The Foundation is able to distribute all remaining funds after paying any administrative expenses incurred which have not been paid for by the Cumberland Building Society. The Trustees consider all reserves to be free reserves.

The Trustees believe that a Building Society deposit account is the most appropriate form of investment because in line with the reserves policy noted above monies are held for relatively short periods and grants are made as quickly as possible after the receipt of applications. Monies available for investment therefore need to be easily accessible, to be low risk and have low transaction costs all of which are met by a deposit account strategy.

Grant making policy

The Foundation has an established grant making policy to achieve its objects as stated above for the public benefit. To make donations to charitable institutions and causes within the local area as specified above in such a manner that the Trustees in their absolute discretion see fit.


Risk management

The Trustees have identified and considered the major risks to which the Foundation is exposed and reviewed the procedures in place to manage the risks.

Trustee appointment and removal

The power for the appointment or removal of Trustees lies with the Board of Trustees and is set out in rules 10 and 12 of the Foundation's Constitution.
