## **The Frazer Nash Archives**

### **Trustees Report for the Year Ended 31st December 2024**

#### **Objects & Activities**

The objects of The Frazer Nash Archives (the Archives) are to advance public education in the history and development of motor sports cars, in particular the Frazer Nash marque and to further the study and understanding of specialist low volume car production.

The Archives were founded as a charitable trust in 1998 when settlements were made into the trust by John Aldington that included detailed technical and commercial records, sporting trophies, engineering drawings, commercial reports, photographs and four Frazer Nash cars. These relate to activities in building and supporting Frazer Nash cars and other engineering activities between the 1920s and 1950s by AFN Ltd and others.

The Frazer Nash car owes its derivation to Archie Frazer Nash and his great skills in developing advanced and sporting automobiles, beginning in partnership with Godfrey Nash producing the GN light cycle car in 1911 and leading to the Frazer Nash in 1925.

H J Aldington (John Aldington's father) took over the AFN business from Archie Frazer Nash in 1928 and continued to manufacture Frazer Nash cars into the late 1930s whilst also importing BMW cars under the Frazer Nash-BMW name. The business was supported by marketing other automobile, motorcycle, aircraft and industrial products. Post World War II, AFN Ltd developed a range of highly successful racing sports cars, whilst continuing to sustain income with non-automotive products and, ultimately, distributing Porsche cars from 1953. The AFN company was sold to Porsche AG in 1987 and the Archives retain Porsche historical records and memorabilia up to 1972.

Over a period of 75 years, GN, Frazer Nash, FN-BMW and Porsche cars enjoyed prodigious success in sporting events. Supporting this achievement, the Archives has the foremost collection of Frazer Nash cars, records, technical drawings, construction details, trophies, photographs, films, models, artwork, papers and associated memorabilia.

The trustees have readily accepted bequests from a number of families, individuals and in particular the family of Archie Frazer Nash. These have greatly extended the scope of the Archives holdings to include many documents and artefacts about the company producing the GN car, its founders and its products and activities during the period from 1911 to 1924, prior to the inception of the Frazer Nash. Also in the bequests is considerable documentation relating to the career of Archie Frazer Nash as a consulting engineer and innovator after his disassociation from AFN Ltd in 1928, including his personal diaries from 1932 to 1957.

Furthermore, donation of material from other sources relates to the Frazer Nash engineering companies with which Archie Frazer Nash was associated in the years following World War II, most of which is external to the automotive sector.

The Archives has embraced the interpretation of its objects to include both the GN period, Archie Frazer Nash's post-AFN activities and the early Porsche era and routinely collects material on these subjects. The Archives has published the definitive biography of Archie Frazer Nash covering his lifetime and career and supplies other printed material of significance.

The Archives also contains much related material of wider public interest, such as aircraft, agricultural machinery, motorcycles and other engineered products donated at the time of formation of the Trust.

## **Achievements & Performance**

Each year the archives puts on an exhibition around a central theme. 2024 told the story of the collaboration between AFN and BMW prior to WWII. The exhibition was open to the public, Frazer Nash car owners and enthusiasts together with members of the Vintage Sports Car Club. In addition the archives hosted a special day for the BMW Historic Motor Club.

The work of preserving, cataloguing and digitising the archives collection of photographs and documents continued to make progress. Some 250,000 images have now been digitized for future access and long-term preservation. Several groups of volunteers (Henley branch of The Arts Society and a number of car enthusiasts) meet up regularly to assist in conservation of material, cataloguing and getting ready for scanning.

The Trustees continued to provide information to owners, enthusiasts, commercial organisations and researchers in the UK and across the world. The Archives again was lucky to acquire and to be donated numerous artefacts of significance during the year from historic documents, trophies, unseen photographs to the early motorised bicycle where it all began. The ranks of willing volunteers has happily grown and we are also lucky to have a new trustee.

## **Financial Review**

The archives are making a big push to make its digitized material more available to a wider audience, investing time and money in computer equipment, software as well as the more mundane ongoing building maintenance etc.

The Archives are grateful to the members of the Frazer Nash; Historic BMW and Porsche Car and the Vintage Sports Car Clubs and to individuals for their physical and financial support during the year.

## **Structure Governance and Management**

The Frazer Nash Archives is constituted and governed by Declaration of Trust dated 12th November 1998.

## **Achievements & Performance**

The Archives held two public open days during the year which were a great success. Visitors included those from the local area, Frazer Nash car owners and enthusiasts together with members of the Vintage Sports Car Club. The highlight of the open days was an exhibition dedicated to the GN overhead valve engine. Four cars with this special engine were on display, together with otherwise unseen photographs and drawings.

The work of preserving, cataloguing and digitising the archives collection of photographs and documents continued to make progress and trustees have engaged a new scanning company with more advanced techniques and greater capacity. However, progress during the year has been frustratingly slow and the Archives seeks more volunteers and those with professional archival expertise. Nonetheless, the Archives very much appreciates the continued dedication of the volunteers from the Henley branch of The Arts Society in conserving archive material.

The Trustees continued to provide information to owners, enthusiasts and researchers in the UK and across the world. The Archives acquired numerous artefacts of significance during the year from various sources including the donation of an important collection of GN technical notes and material from previous owners of Frazer Nash cars.

## **Financial Review**

In addition to funding the maintenance of the collection and the property in which it is held, the Archives continues to invest in computer equipment and the continued digitisation of the collection to facilitate virtual access via the archives website.

The building continues to require ongoing maintenance the cost of which has and will continue to increase. During the year the physical security was upgraded to enhance the protection of the collection.

Fixture and fittings acquired for the GN engine exhibition includes materials which will be used for future exhibitions.

The Archives are grateful to the members of the Frazer Nash; Historic BMW and Porsche Car Clubs and to individuals for their financial support during the year.





#### Objects & Activities

The objects of The Frazer Nash Archives (the Archives) are to advance public education in the history and development of motor sports cars, in particular the Frazer Nash marque, and to further the study and understanding of mechanical science with reference to specialist low volume car production.

The Archives was founded as a charitable trust in 1998 when settlements were made into the trust by John Aldington of the Aldington family collection including four Frazer Nash cars, trophies and the records from the family entrepreneurial business AFN Ltd. John Aldington's father, H J Aldington had taken over the manufacture of Frazer Nash cars from Archie Frazer Nash in 1928 and continued this into the 1930s whilst also importing BMW cars under the FN-BMW name. Post World War II, AFN Ltd developed a range of highly successful racing sports cars, supporting the business with the marketing of automobile and industrial products and, ultimately, distributing Porsche cars from the mid 1950's. The AFN company was sold to Porsche AG in 1987 and the Archives retain Porsche historical records and memorabilia up to 1972.

Prior to the takeover of AFN in 1928, Archie Frazer Nash had great experience in developing and manufacturing advanced and sporting automobiles, beginning with the GN (Godfrey Nash) in 1911 and leading directly to the introduction of the Frazer Nash in 1925.

Over a period of 60 years, GN, Frazer Nash, FN-BMW and Porsche cars enjoyed prodigious success in sporting events. Supporting this achievement, the Archives has the foremost collection of Frazer Nash cars, records, technical drawings, construction details, trophies, photographs, films, models, artwork, papers and associated memorabilia.

The trustees have readily accepted bequests from the family of Archie Frazer Nash. These have greatly extended the scope of the Archives holdings to include many documents and artefacts about the company producing the GN car, its founders and its products and activities during the period from 1911 to 1924, prior to the inception of the Frazer Nash. The Archives were back to more normal activities in 2022 following the lifting of covid restrictions.

A public Open Day was a great success with visitors from the local area, friends and members of the Henley Arts Society mixing with Frazer Nash car owners and enthusiasts. All were delighted to see the arrival of a very early belt drive GN driven from the East Midlands on a cold and crisp October morning to join the gathering of other vintage cars.

The work of preserving, cataloguing and digitising the archives collection of photographs and documents continued to make progress although restricted by the lack of available scanning capacity. The Trustees continue to provide information to owners, enthusiasts and researchers in the UK and across the world.

The Archives continues to benefit from the assistance of volunteers from the Henley branch of The Arts Society in conserving archive material.

The Archives continued to acquire artefacts of significance during the year from various sources including an album of GN material and material from previous owners of Frazer Nash cars.

## **Financial Review**

In addition to funding the maintenance of the collection and the property in which it is held, the Archives continues to invest in computer equipment and the continued digitisation of the collection to facilitate virtual access via the archives website.

The Archives opened a PayPal account during the year which has facilitated the receipt of funds particularly from overseas. Income, via PayPal includes transfers from Australia, Eurozone and South America.

The Archives are grateful to the members of the Frazer Nash; Historic BMW and Porsche Car Clubs and to individuals for their financial support during the year.

## **Structure Governance and Management**

## **The Frazer Nash Archives**

Trustees Report for the Year Ended 31st December 2020

### **Objects & Activities**

The objects of The Frazer Nash Archives (the Archives) are to advance public education in the

history and development of sports cars, in particular the Frazer Nash marque, and to further the study

and understanding of mechanical science with reference to specialist low volume car production. The

Archives has the foremost collection of Frazer Nash cars, memorabilia, technical drawings and

company records of AFN Limited detailing the construction of these cars between 1924 and 1956

together with their prodigious success in sporting events of the period.

In the past decade, the trustees have readily accepted bequests from the family of Archie Frazer

Nash. These have greatly extended the scope of the Archives holdings to include many documents

and artefacts about the company producing the GN (Godfrey Nash) car, its founders and its products

and activities during the period from 1911 to 1924, prior to the inception of the Frazer Nash car. Also

in the bequests is considerable documentation relating to the career of Archie Frazer Nash as a

consulting engineer and innovator after his disassociation from AFN Ltd in 1928, including his

personal diaries from 1932 to 1957.

Furthermore, donation of material from other sources relates to Frazer Nash engineering companies

with which Archie Frazer Nash was associated in the years following World War II, most of which is

external to the automotive sector.

The Archives has embraced the interpretation of its objects to include both the GN period and Archie

Frazer Nash's post-AFN activities and routinely collects material on these subjects. It has published

the definitive biography of Archie Frazer Nash covering his lifetime and career.

The Archives also contains much related material of wider public interest, such as aircraft, agricultural

machinery, motorcycles and other engineered products donated at the time of formation of the Trust

by the Trust's Principal.

### **Achievements & Performance**

The Archives has made significant achievements in a number of areas in 2020 in spite of the

COVID 19 pandemic which resulted in the national lockdown and closure of the Archives.

The

Trustees look forward to reopening the Archives and once again engaging with visitors and

volunteers alike.

The work of preserving, cataloguing and digitising the archives collection of photographs and

documents continued to make progress. The Trustees were able to work from their homes and

a feature of 2020 was the number of queries from individuals who were researching their family

history as well as Frazer Nash owners seeking car information. They were delighted with the

information which was provided from the Archives. A few cases of interest to FNCC members were published in the Gazette.

The Archive collection remains in good condition but there was no participation in public events during the year due to the national lockdown. The Archives continued to acquire artefacts of significance during the year from various sources including the Maitland collection at auction.

### **Financial Review**

In addition to the continued maintenance of the collection and the property in which it is held, the Archives continues to invest to facilitate virtual access and this is now available online to Trustees.

The Archives are grateful to the members of Frazer Nash; Historic BMW and Porsche Car Clubs and to individuals for their support.
