The Trustees submit their report and the examined accounts for the year ended 30th April 2022. The accounts have been prepared in accordance with current statutory requirements and the Charity's governing documents.

The Charity's Governing document

The Charity is governed by its Constitution which was adopted on 27th May 1997 with amendments on 15th December 1998 and 16th May 2019.

Objectives and activities

To provide facilities for recreation, relaxation and leisure time for the inhabitants of High Bickington and its neighbourhood in the County of Devon.

Achievements and Performance

During the year the Charity continued to manage land on the outskirts of the village containing a sports pavillion and a childrens playground. Due to the pandemic there were restrictions which limited the use of the Pavillion and the opportunity was taken to carry out repairs to both the pavillion and the Childrens Playground. The Charity operates an annual 200 Club to raise funds and during the year had the benefit of £33,361 in grant income which enabled it to carry out the repairs and also to modernise the Childrens Playground equipment.

Reserves policy

The Trustees aim to manage the Reserves to retain sufficient to cover maintenance and upgrades to property and equipment as and when they are required.

b) There has been no change to the accounting policies


c) These financial statements have been prepared on the receipts and payments basis.
