### Structure, Governance and Management

The charity is an unincorporated charitable trust and is constituted and governed by its Trust Deed dated 3 April 1998 as amended by a supplemental deed dated 26 February 1999, and administered by its Trustees.

There are no custodian trustees or connected charities.

New Trustees are appointed on the invitation of the existing Board of trustees based on the skills required. The chairman explains to potential trustees the purpose of the Charity, the responsibilities of trustees and confirms the suitability of the candidates. Potential trustees are provided with a copy of the Charity Commission's document "The essential trustee: what you need to know, what you need to do". New Trustees sign a "Trustee Eligibility Declaration" and a "HMRC Fit and Proper Persons Declaration".

Meetings are conducted face-to-face and online to meet the lifestyle commitments of current and potential trustees.

### Objectives and Activities

The Charity's aims are to advance Christian principles in Education. This is carried out by providing useful resources (hard copy and online) for children, parents and those involved in education as well as arranging an annual national conference which covers current issues affecting the teaching education of children. Online meetings are arranged to cover particular topics and extend the outreach of the Charity.

The main charitable activities in providing public benefit, as identified in the accounts, have been to provide regular communications (such as the Newsletter and email updates), maintain a website to provide trusted information for parents and those involved in education together with arranging and delivering the National Conference. The other major expenditure was the employment of a part-time Business and Development Manager to build on and further the work of CViE.

In carrying out its activities in the year under review, the trustees have had regard to the public relevant guidance issued by the Charity Commission, and are satisfied that the activities mentioned above have all been for public benefit.

## **Achievements and Performance**

During the year a number of interactive webinar events were held online, building on the success of this relatively new avenue of communication for our supporters from previous years. These allowed a far wider scope of attendees and enabled an efficient and open dialogue. In March, Julie Maxwell from Lovewise spoke about the ongoing government consultation on Gender Identity in Schools and provided some information about new Lovewise resources. In November, a zoom presentation was given by David Kay about the cultural challenges facing Christians in education and how they can approach these.

In September, the National Conference was once again held at the King's Centre in Chessington. This was well attended by families, grandparents and supporters, with over 350 delegates in attendance. The focus of the day was Foundations, looking at the Biblical worldview on: design in nature (by Professor Stuart Burgess), dinosaurs (by Professor Steve Taylor) and the importance of Genesis 1-11 (by Professor Andy McIntosh). The conference was put on in partnership with Truth in Science. A full programme of separate breakout groups were also held for different the age groups of children and teens. A wide range of bookstalls, exhibitors and resource stands from a number of organisations were available including: Christian Bookshop Ossett, Christian Concern, Christian Institute, Answers in Genesis, Creation Ministries International, Lovewise and Truth in Science. We were able again to run our 'Cultivate a Reading Habit' scheme whereby we sponsor a £10 book voucher for all children attending the conference to spend at the bookstalls.

During 2024 there has been no change in the officers of the charity who remain as follows, Dan Sayers (Chair), James Skelton (Vice-Chair) and Graham Cottingham (Treasurer).

We give thanks that our needs as a charity have been met through 2024, especially the receipt of a large grant that has secured the future of the charity for several years and also enabled us to continue employing a part time Business and Development Manager. This role has continued to prove useful and enabled the more regular issue of updates to supporters, as well as the increase of our social media reach. Through the more regular engagement with supporters, we have seen our mailing list growing steadily through the year.

As a very small organisation, we are conscious of our limited resources. However, we also are reminded that all of our needs are provided by One who is greater than any of the obstacles we encounter and we trust the Lord to go before us in the future.

## **Financial Review**

Overall receipts for the year increased from £17,843 in 2023, to £79,636 in 2024, boosted by a large grant. Total expenditure was £26,775 in 2024, very similar to £24,378 in 2023. The main items of

expenditure have been the continued employment of our business and development manager, and our national conference.

## Reserves

It is the policy of trustees to maintain sufficient funds to enable them to continue the current work of CViE and also to expand the volume of resources and their accessibility both physically and online.

Reserves for the year end 31<sup>st</sup> December 2024 amounted to £68,336 and these are considered a more than sufficient basis to continue the work of CViE into 2025 and beyond.

## Going concern

The Charity has sufficient reserves to continue as a going concern. Trustees continue to monitor our income requirements in order to continue to sustain the employment of a part-time employee and to fulfil our wider goals.

The other major expenditure was the employment of a part-time Business and Development Manager to build on and further the work of CViE.

In carrying out its activities in the year under review, the trustees have had regard to the public relevant guidance issued by the Charity Commission, and are satisfied that the activities mentioned above have all been for public benefit

## **Achievements and Performance**

During the year a number of events were held online, building on this relatively new avenue of communication for our supporters. These allowed a far wider scope of attendees and enabled an efficient and open dialogue. In February, the focus was on home education and a group of over 60 devices from across the UK and Ireland attended. This led to a family starting to home school their children and facilitated a strong level of encouragement. Following the meeting, a network was established to enable the home school community present to get in touch more easily. In May, a forum style evening was held discussing state education, especially on the impact for Christian families with new ideology being promoted. Finally in November, a zoom presentation was given by Tim Kingham, one of our Trustees, on the impact we can have as Christians in being a school Governor.

In September, the National Conference was held for the second time at the King's Centre in Chessington. This was well attended by families, grandparents and supporters. The event also attracted a wider range of stands including a number of Christian publishers and organisations, including Christian Concern, Christian Institute, The Association of Christian Teachers, Lovewise and Truth in Science. The focus of the event was on two themes, "Issues Faced in Education Today" and "Worldviews in Education: Standing on Biblical Truth". Breakout groups were also held for young children through to mid teens, including a talk entitled 'That Almighty Hand' which complemented a new booklet of the same title, focusing on the hand of God seen in World War II.

During 2022 there has been a change of officers. Our Chair, Michael Ridout retired at the end of the year after serving since the start of charity in 1998. A presentation was made to mark Michael's retirement at the National Conference in September, together with the grateful thanks of Trustees and supporters for his tireless efforts on behalf of CViE. From January 2023, the new Officers are Dan Sayers (Chair), James Skelton (Vice-Chair) and Graham Cottingham (Treasurer). The year also saw the appointment of a new Trustee, Mark Seymour at the end of the year.

We give thanks that our needs as a charity have been met through 2022. The Business and Development Officer role has proved useful and enabled the more regular issue of updates to supporters, as well as the increase of social media reach. More funds will be needed for the this to be sustainable going forward.

As a very small organisation, we are conscious of our limited resources. However, we also are reminded that all of our needs are provided by One who is greater than any of the obstacles we encounter and we trust the Lord to go before us in the future.

## **Financial Review**

Overall receipts for the year increased from £25,492 in 2021 to £29,983 in 2022, this was primarily due to an increase in donations and contributions from supporters. The Providence Chapel

Croydon Charity has continued to provide funds enabling CViE to continue engaging a part-time employee to help further the work of CViE. Total payments also increased from £21,853 in 2021 to £24,573 in 2022. The increase in expenditure in 2022 was attributable primarily to booklets, newsletters and advertising, as CViE continue to endeavour to expand our reach and support to Christians in education.

## Reserves

It is the policy of trustees to maintain sufficient funds to enable them to continue the current work of CViE and also to expand the volume of resources and their accessibility both physically and online.

Reserves for the year end 31 December 2022 amounted to £22,010 and these are considered a sufficient basis to continue the work of CViE in 2023.

## Going concern

The Charity has sufficient reserves to continue as a going concern. Trustees have identified the need to further promote the work of CViE in order to continue to sustain the employment of a part-time employee once grant funding ceases in 2023. This is an area of major focus for the charity throughout 2023.

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The main charitable activities in providing public benefit, as identified in the accounts, have been to provide regular communications (such as the Newsletter and email updates), maintain a website to

provide trusted information for parents and those involved in education together with arranging and delivering the National Conference. The other major expenditure was the employment of a part-time Business and Development Manager to build on and further the work of CViE.

In carrying out its activities in the year under review, the trustees have had regard to the public relevant guidance issued by the Charity Commission, and are satisfied that the activities mentioned above have all been for public benefit

## **Achievements and Performance**

In the Lord's Providence, 2021 saw the appointment of a part-time Business and Development Manager. The need for this post had been previously identified in helping raise awareness of the work of CViE to wider groups and also build on the work that had been undertaken to encourage and equip Christian parents and others involved in education to deal with the challenges faced. The appointment was also very timely in view of the COVID-19 restrictions and the need to maintain contact with the Charity's beneficiaries. This included providing email updates and bulletins together with regular blog posts on topical issues impacting on the responsibility of parents and the education of their children.

The trustees would also acknowledge answers to their prayers in the provision of a suitable spacious, safe and secure venue for its National Conference in September 2021. This was at a time when COVID-19 restrictions were being relaxed and appropriate infection, prevention and control (IPC) processes were put in place to underpin the risk assessment for the event. The National Conference provided an opportunity for parents, children, young people and those with an interest in the work of the CViE to come together and listen to topical presentations as well as take part in activities for younger age groups. The other social benefit of the event was providing the opportunity for people of like minds to meet together and develop contacts for future mutual support. The Conference was attended by 191 individuals comprising of 97 adults and 94 children and young people. CViE was also able to fund, once more, the successful 'Cultivate a reading habit' scheme. This scheme provides 5-18 year olds with a 'book voucher' up to the value of £10 that can be used to purchase books at the bookstalls present at the event. Feedback from the event was positive and, if the Lord will, trustees will continue with this aspect of the CViE's work in future years.

During the year, CViE also developed links with likeminded organisations/charities such as Christian Concern, Christian Institute, The Association of Christian Teachers, Lovewise and Truth in Science. These linkages have proved useful in disseminating the work of CViE and also in raising awareness of these organisations with CViE's supporters in helping their understanding of issues being faced in education today.

In November 2021, CViE held its first online meeting "Issues in Education Today", this was well received and supported. The event was made possible as more people are conversant with online meeting technology and the event provided the opportunity to attract those from distant parts of the country which may not necessarily have been able to attend a physical meeting. The intention is to develop this activity further in 2022.

The provision of resources and access to meetings continues to be made available free of charge and the trustees' desire is for this to continue so they are accessible to all.

The Trustees would acknowledge the truth of the Apostle Paul's words: "But my God shall supply all your need according to his riches in glory by Christ Jesus". (Philippians 4:19)

## Financial Review

Overall receipts for the year increased from £9,282 in 2020 to £25,492 in 2021, this was primarily due to a grant from the Providence Chapel Croydon Charity towards engaging a part-time employee to help further the work of CViE. Total payments also increased from £3,295 in 2020 to £21,853 in 2021. In 2020, the meeting and outreach activity of the Charity was limited by the government's COVID-19 guidance and restrictions. The increase in expenditure in 2021 was attributable to the payment of the part-time member of staff (£13,738) and the face-to-face National Conference held in September 2021 (£5091).

## Reserves

It is the policy of trustees to maintain sufficient funds to enable them to continue the current work of CViE and also to expand the volume of resources and their accessibility both physically and online.

Reserves for the year end 31 December 2021 amounted to £16,600 and these are considered a sufficient basis to continue the work of CViE in 2022.


## Going concern

The Charity has sufficient reserves to continue as a going concern. Trustees have identified the need to further promote the work of CViE in order to continue to sustain the employment of a part-time employee once grant funding ceases in 2023.

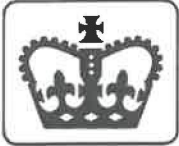
