The principal activity of Children in Hunger during the period under review was the relief of child poverty in Brazil, through the provision of food, education, medical care and clothing.

Projects

Children in Hunger funded and managed projects in 11 locations in Brazil during the period under review. They were in the city of Fortaleza and the towns of Ipueiras and Macambira in the state of Ceará, in the rural town of São Miguel do Araguaia, in the state of Goiás, the indigenous villages of Barreira Branca, Mirindiba, and Cachoeirinha, Weheria, Itxeó all in the state of Tocantins, and in the cities of Salvador and Lauro de Freitas in the state of Bahia.

To date over 17,000 children and young people have benefited from our work.

Chairman's Report

This year, as in recent years, we have found it very difficult raising funds, due to the poor economic situation in the UK, from where all our funding comes. We also have the problem of many funders no longer regarding Brazil as a poor country, despite the immense poverty to be found there. As well as this, child poverty in Brazil gets no media coverage at all in the UK, despite being a lot worse than in many countries which receive huge media coverage.

This year our income was £78,577, up slightly from last year. However, this included donations from the Trustees of £22,000, which they decided to make to cover the shortfall in funding received, thus enabling Children in Hunger to continue all its vital work, without having to reduce the number of children benefiting or avoid having to close any projects.

Another problem we had to contend with was increase in the cost of food in Brazil, caused by Brazil's out-of-control inflation, particularly in Fortaleza, our main area of operation, which has the country's highest inflation. However, we have been helped favourable exchange rate, due to a strong Pound.

Despite all of this, I am pleased to report that, to date, over 17,000 impoverished children and young people have benefited from our work in Brazil.

As in previous years, our main area of operation is in the city of Fortaleza, located in Brazil's poor north-east region, where we run feeding and education programs, and Vocational Training programs for unemployed teenagers and young people. We have also continued to give help to poor families suffering extreme hardship, by way of monthly food parcels and financial support.

We also continue to run feeding programs in the poor rural town of São Miguel do Araguaia in the state of Goiás, and in Ipeuiras and Macambira in rural Ceará, and for children from the indigenous villages of Barreira Branca, Weheria, Mirindiba, Itxeó and Cachoeirina, all located on Bananal Island in the state of Tocantins. We are also involved in feeding and education programs in the cities of Salvador and Lauro de Freitas, in the state of Bahia. These are in partnership with UK charity Children of Bahia.

I would like to thank our Project Co-ordinators and our small group of dedicated volunteers, both here and in Brazil, for all their hard work throughout the year, Along with everyone who has made donations, both large and small, without whom we would not be able to continue this vital work.

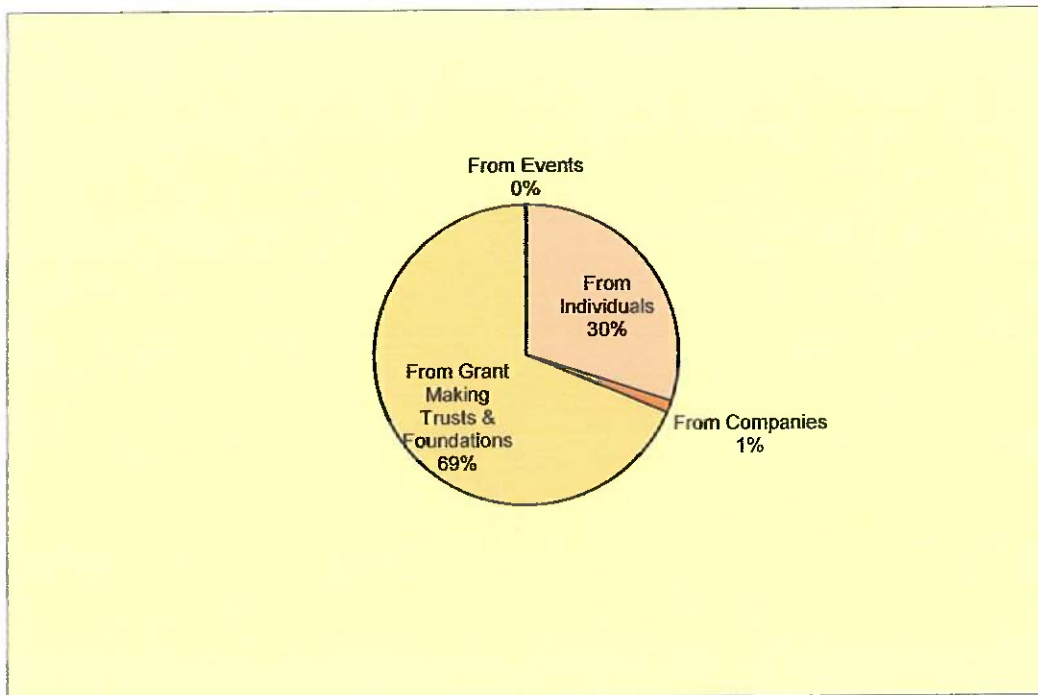

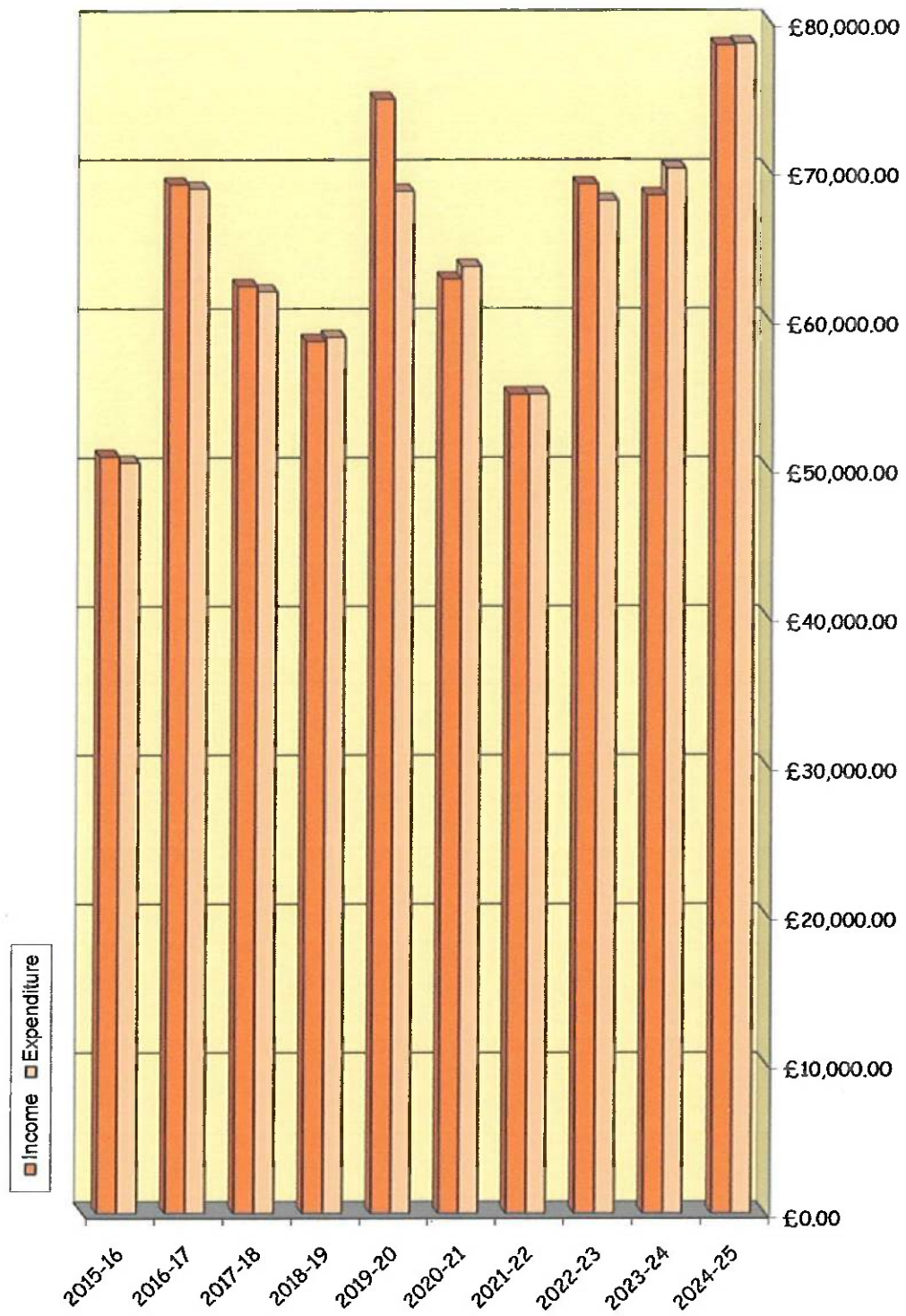



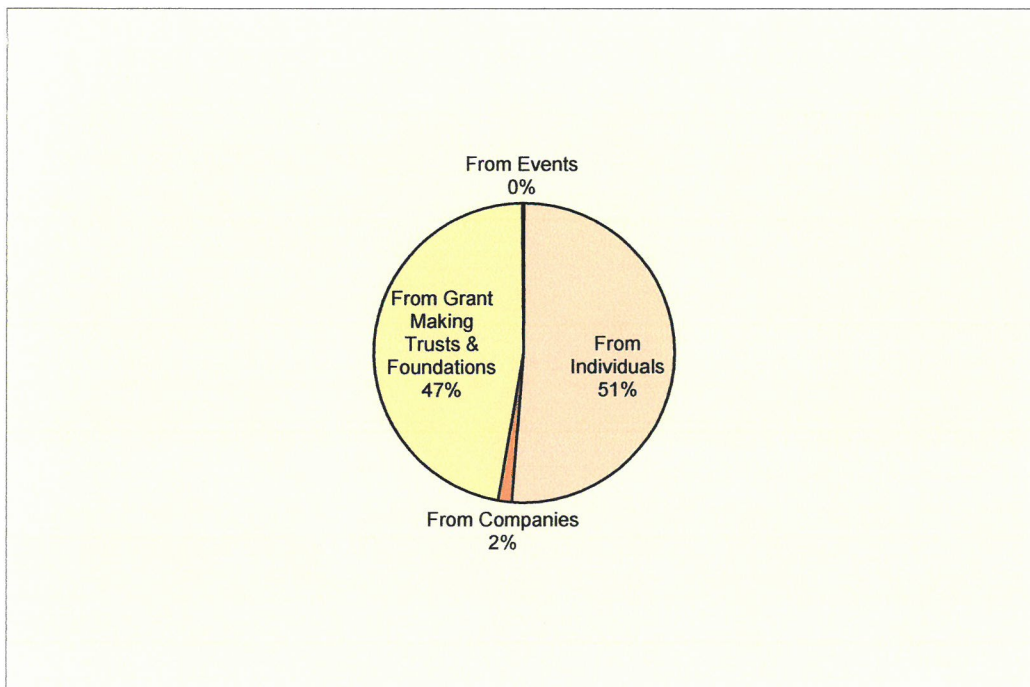

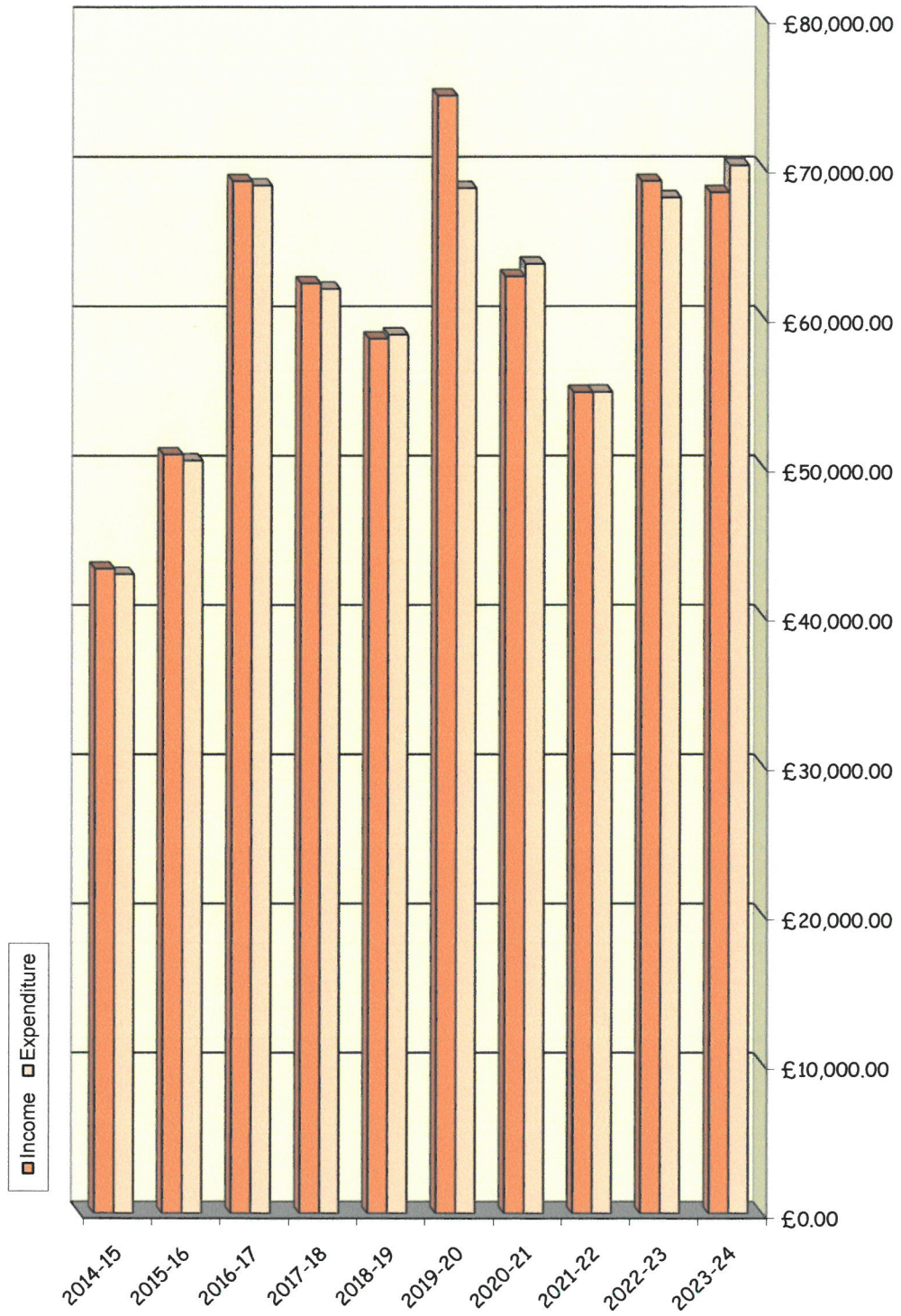

Chairman's Report

This year, as in recent years, we have found it very difficult raising funds, due to the ongoing poor economic situation in the UK, from where all our funding comes.

We also have the problem of many funders no longer regarding Brazil as a poor country, despite the immense poverty to be found there. As well as this, child poverty in Brazil gets no media coverage at all in the UK, despite being a lot worse than in many countries which receive huge media coverage.

Despite this, this year our income rose to £69,146. With this increase, along with the help of a relatively strong Pound we have been able to keep ahead of the out of control inflation in Brazil, particularly in Fortaleza, our main area of operation, which has the country's highest inflation, and continue running all of our projects.

I am pleased to report that, to date, over 12,500 impoverished children and young people have benefited from our work.

As in previous years, our main area of operation is in the city of Fortaleza, located in Brazil's poor north-east region, where we run feeding and education programs, which are both back to running normally since the reduction of COVID-19 cases there. We have also continued to supply Emergency Aid Fortaleza for families suffering extreme hardship since the pandemic, by way of monthly food parcels and financial support. We started this back in March 2020. Our Vocational Training program in Fortaleza remains on hold, but we hope to restart it next year.

We also continue to run feeding programs in the poor rural town of São Miguel do Araguaia in the state of Goiás, and in Ipeuiras and Macambira in rural Ceará, and for children from the indigenous villages of Barreira Branca, Weheria, Mirindiba and Cachoeirina, all located on Bananal Island in the state of Tocantins. This year we were also involved in feeding and education programs in Salvador, in the state of Bahia. This was in partnership with, and administered by UK charity Children of Bahia.

I would like to thank our Project Co-ordinators and our small group of dedicated volunteers, both here and in Brazil, for all their hard work throughout the year. I would also like to thank everyone who has made donations, both large and small, without whom we would not be able to continue this vital work. Last but not least, I would also like to thank our Appeal Patron, Phil Collins for all his support throughout the year.

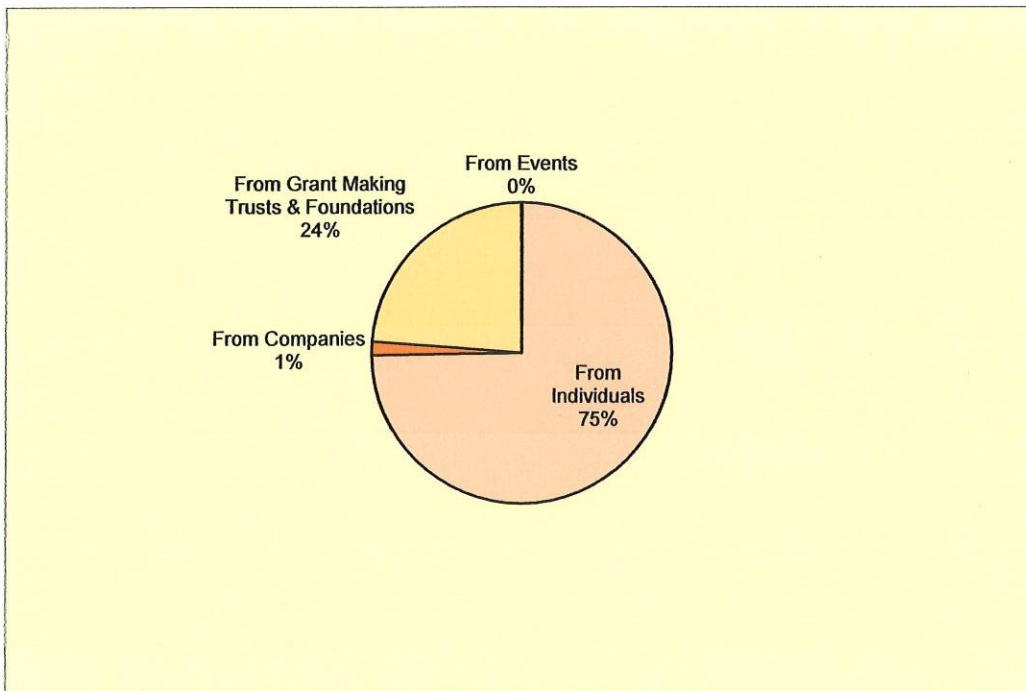

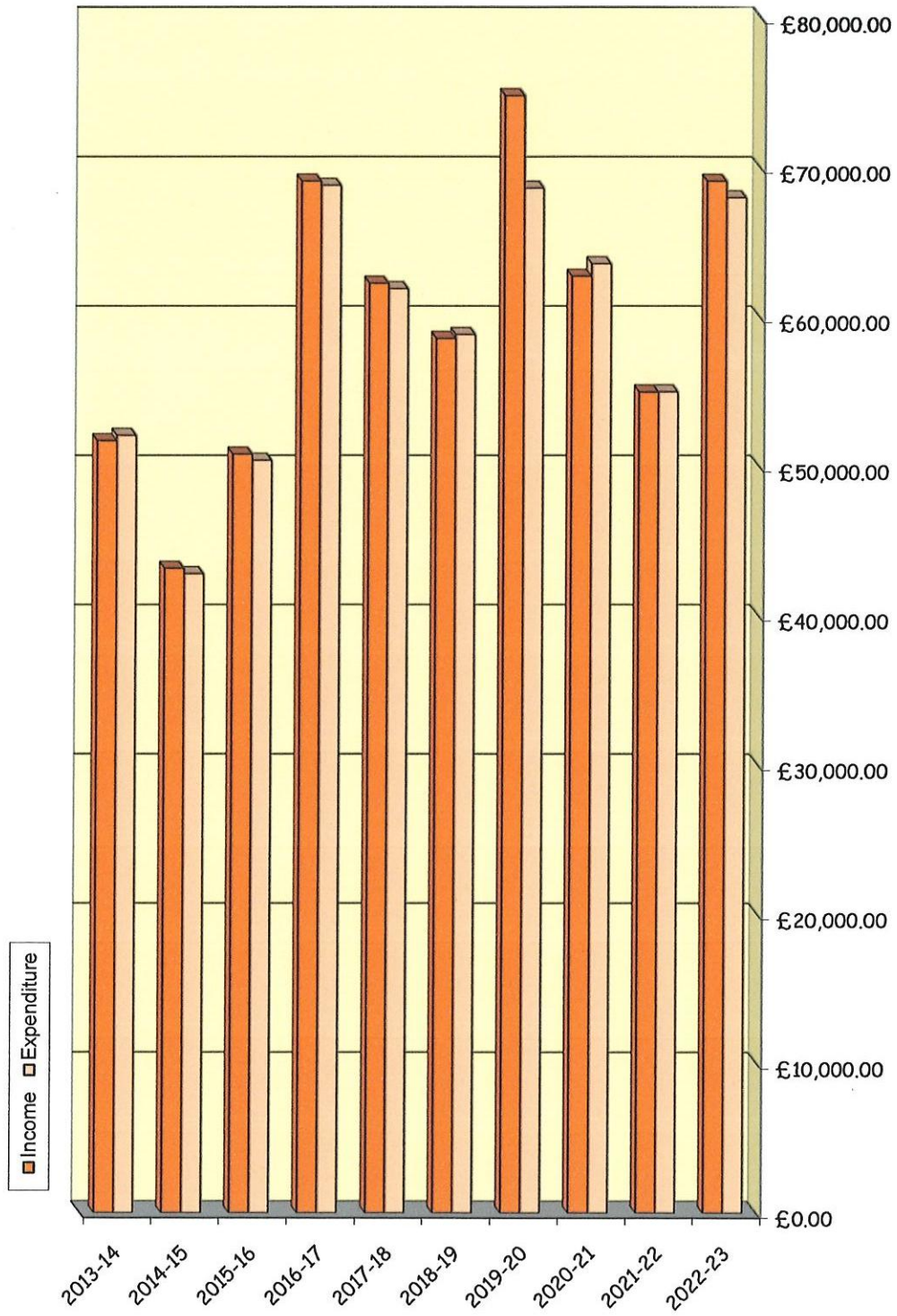

We also have the added problem of many funders no longer regarding Brazil as a poor country, despite the immense poverty to be found there, and as well as being one of the countries worst hit by COVID-19 pandemic. As well as this, child poverty in Brazil gets no media coverage at all in the UK, despite being a lot worse than in many countries which receive huge media coverage.

This year our income was down from last year to £55,017, this included £ 1,532 of donated children's and baby clothes. But with the help of a continuing strong Pound we have been able to keep ahead of the out of control inflation in Brazil, particularly in Fortaleza, our main area of operation, which has the country's highest inflation, and continue running all of our projects.

I am pleased to report that, to date, over 10,000 impoverished children and young people have benefited from our work.

As in previous years, our main area of operation is in the city of Fortaleza, located in Brazil's poor north-east region. However, due to the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic we had to adapt the way our projects operate there.

For most of the year, for our feeding program, we continued to prepare the food at our project kitchen, and deliver the cooked meals to the children's homes in containers for them to eat there. However, due to the drop in COVID cases in Brazil, and in particular in Fortaleza, our Feeding Program has returned the original format where the children come to the project centre for their meals.

Our Education Program is now also running as before, but we have reduced the number of children in each class.

We have also continued to supply COVID-19 Emergency Aid for families suffering extreme hardship due to the pandemic in the city of Fortaleza, by way of monthly food parcels and financial support. We started this back in March 2020.

Our Vocational Training program remains on hold, but we hope to restart it in 2023.

We also continue to run feeding programs in the poor rural town of São Miguel do Araguaia in the state of Goiás, and in Ipeuiras in rural Ceará, and for children from the indigenous villages of Barreira Branca, Weheria, Mirindiba and Cachoeirina, all located on Bananal Island in the state of Tocantins, which can all be carried out easily with social distancing.

The children no longer come to our project centre to eat, as in previous years, where they would sit next to each other on long benches at tables to eat.

Last year, due to the pandemic our Education Program was suspended in March 2020, but re-started in December 2020, when the pandemic had started to improve. Then due to another wave of the pandemic it was suspended from March to May 2021. Since the restart we have reduced the number of children in each class, and the children are seated 2 meters apart, and all wear masks, as do the teachers.

We have also continued to supply COVID-19 Emergency Aid for families suffering extreme hardship due to the pandemic in the city of Fortaleza, by way of monthly food parcels and financial support. We started this in March 2020.

Our Vocational Training program remains on hold until we consider it safe to resume this program.

We also continue to run feeding programs in the poor rural towns of São Miguel do Araguaia in the state of Goiás, and in Ipeuiras and Macambira in rural Ceará, and for children from the indigenous villages of Barreira Branca, Mirindiba and Cachoeirina, all located on Bananal Island in the state of Tocantins, which can all be carried out easily with social distancing.

I would like to thank our Project Co-ordinators and our small group of dedicated volunteers, both here and in Brazil, for all their hard work throughout the year. I would like to make a special mention to Liduina, our co-ordinator at our Fortaleza projects, who sadly passed away earlier this year from COVID, and to mention her tireless work over the last 20 years.



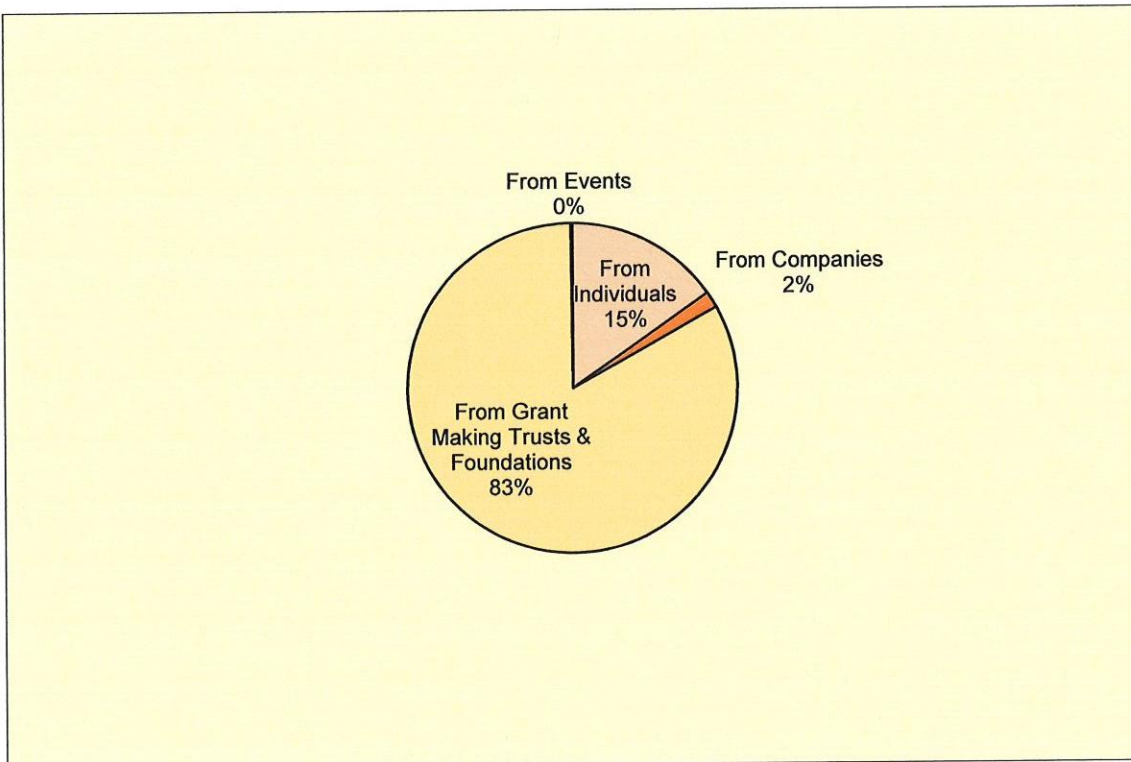

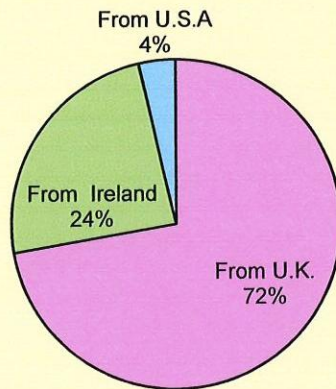
