The charity has two volunteers, excluding Trustees all of which are voluntarily working and receiving no financial gain from supporting the charity. DBS checks are made on all UK based individuals who will work unsupervised with children when visiting them in South Asia.

This keeps us up to date with day-to-day developments as well as the usual birthday and school/college celebrations.

SOUTH ASIAN DEVELOPMENTS

During the financial year the following visits took place:

September: Mark visited the projects in Bangladesh and held meetings with project leaders in Delhi.

October/November: Mark and Julie were accompanied by their granddaughter, Lily, who helped them visit projects in India. Later in the trip Mark travelled alone to Bangladesh and returned to India where he visited some of the projects.

January/February (25): Julie and Mark visited Bangladesh and India where they visited all of the projects.

CHILDS Trust gratefully received £68,595

Income Generation: The majority of financial gifts are given monthly from a large number of individual supporters, through our Child or Project sponsorship programmes, regular monthly donations and generous one off gifts. We have been amazed to see that our income has been maintained in such tough times. During this financial year we have continued to reduce the number of individual Child sponsorship transferring them into project sponsorship.

EXPENDITURE:

Supporting and developing CHILDS Trust existing projects cost £62,450 for the year.

Reserves: CHILDS Trust retains funds in reserve that enables all the educational projects to be funded for 1 year. Additionally there are funds reserved for the House of Hope projects to be supported for 2 years. We saw a significant increase in the cost to support children from our Houses of Hope projects. In the next few years, we are expecting to be supporting 6 -8 children though degree level education.

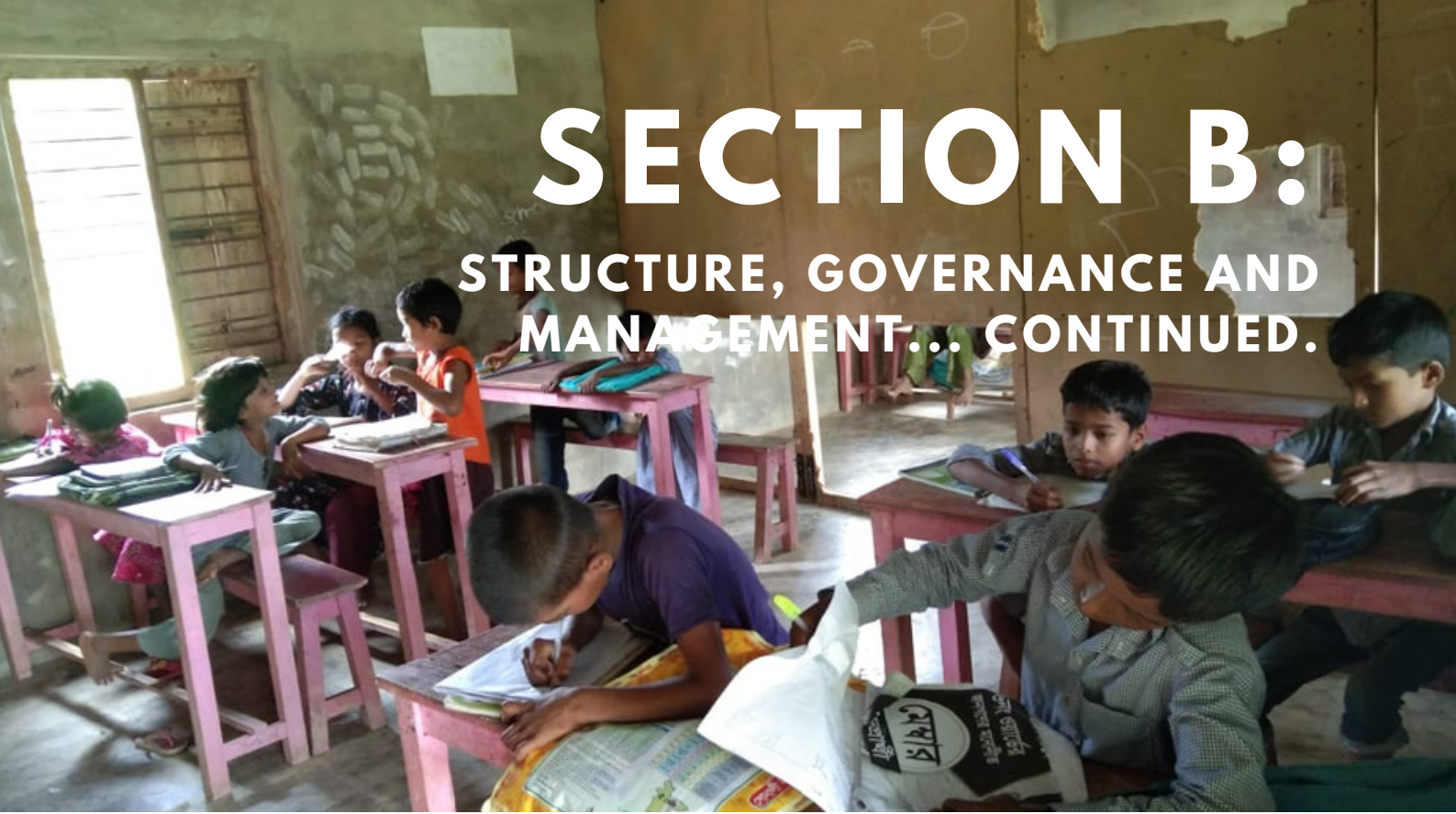

In addition to the above we have maintained close links with those who support us, updating them via phone calls and meetings with larger groups such as Churches. Several presentations have been made by the Founders both in person and via Zoom calls.



SOUTH ASIAN DEVELOPMENTS

During this financial year there have been two visits in South Asia. In November, Julie, and Mark (CT Founders) were joined by Maggie and Ian Thompson as they visited all of the projects in India and Nepal; it was an exhausting schedule for us all. In Feb 2023 Julie and Mark visited India and Bangladesh. They saw everyone from the projects in Bangladesh and some of the projects in India.

Income Generation: The majority of financial gifts are given monthly from a large number of individual supporters, through our Child or Project sponsorship programmes, regular monthly donations and generous one off gifts. We have been amazed to see that our income has grown in such a tough year with 35% of the previous year's income being achieved. This has been achieved with no formal fund raising activities except those undertaken by individuals. During this financial year we have continued to reduce the number of individual Child sponsorship transferring them into project sponsorship.

EXPENDITURE:


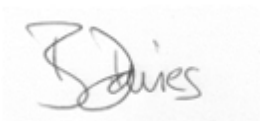
Supporting and developing CHILD's Trust existing projects cost £45,370 for the year.

Reserves: CHILD's Trust retains funds in reserve that enables all the educational projects to be funded for 1 year. Additionally there are funds reserved for the House of Hope projects to be supported for 2 years. We are predicting and expecting a significant increase in the cost to support children from our Houses of Hope projects. In the next few years, we are expecting to be supporting 6 -8 children though degree level education. This is a significant increase in our costs, on average £10,000/year.
