Miss Phillips has continued to meet with Church and Ministry leaders world-wide, offering Prayer Ministry and Mentoring. Miss Phillips has been preparing and developing new resources and materials and continued to oversee their distribution. In addition, she has planned and begun preparation for speaking engagements to take place later in 2025. We continue to hear testimony to the healing people have received from God because of the ministry. Lazarus Healing Trust is grateful to all those who have supported and been involved in this work over the last 25 years.

The charity's principal sources of funds during the year continued to be from grants and donations. Generous donations this year brought in £9,278 which was slightly less than the previous year's total, but some support from the USA with a grant of £3,950 and the regular grant from Verein Lazarus Switzerland of £15,671, made up for it, so that with the tax recovered under the Gift Aid Scheme, the total receipts for the year came to £29,621 which was more than the £26,681 achieved previously. On the payments side, £22,200 was paid in fees to the Ministry Director, which was less than the previous year. Other costs were the usual postage, stationery, IT expenses, but no travel costs this year due to Miss Philip's ongoing lack of mobility. The total of the payments was then £22,356 compared with £27,083 in the previous year. The overall result was a surplus for the year of £7,265, which increased the balance of the reserves at the year end to £13,372. To maintain the current level of operation, the charity is dependent on the continued support from grants given by Verein Lazarus Switzerland.

In addition, Miss Phillips has been preparing and developing new resources and materials and continued to oversee their distribution.

The charity's principal sources of funds during the year continued to be from grants and donations. Generous donations brought in a total of £10,552 which is similar to the previous year. In addition, a £15,458 grant was received from Verein Lazarus Switzerland and £573 of tax was recovered under the Gift Aid Scheme bringing the total receipts for the year to £26,681 compared with £25,647 previously.

On the payments side, £26,640 was paid in fees to the Ministry Director, which was less than the previous year because of the backpay of £6,500 paid in February 2023. Other costs were the usual postage, stationery, IT expenses, and travel, although the latter was minimal due to Miss Philip's lack of mobility.

The total of the payments was therefore £27,083 compared with £36,837 in the previous year.



The overall result was then a deficit for the year of £402, which reduced the balance of the reserves, at the year end, from £6,509 to £6,107.

Prayer Ministry, Mentoring and general meetings were also mostly conducted online. People continue to give testimony to the healing they have received from God. Miss Phillips continued to create new resources alongside training and prayer ministry appointments. She continued to develop the work internationally, including mentoring those Lazarus previously trained in healing prayer in Africa and Switzerland through video conferencing. Miss Phillips took over the distribution of Lazarus' resources and relocated the office.




The charity's principal sources of funds during the year continued to be from grants and donations. Generous donations during the year brought in a total of £10,211, but this was slightly less the previous year. In addition, £14,489 of grants was received from Verein Lazarus Switzerland which was higher than the £11,301 received in 2021/22 and £675 tax was recovered under the Gift Aid Scheme which brought the total receipts for the year to £25,647 compared with £24,063 previously. On the payments side, the level of the Ministry Director fees increased to £33,140 compared with the £20,165 in 2021/22, which was largely due to a back payment of £6,500 to Miss Philips. There were also the costs of the office move and related storage in the sum of £3,181 which brought the total payments to £36,837 compared with only £20,166 in the previous year. The result was therefore a deficit for the year of £11,190, which reduced the balance of the reserves at the year-end down from £17,699 to £6,509. To maintain the current level of operation, the charity is dependent on the continued support of grants from Verein Lazarus Switzerland.
