Para 1.20	<p>Little Acorns Playgroup is open for 50 weeks of the year, with 10 playgroup sessions run every week during term time. During the school holidays, sessions are reduced to 3 sessions per week to ensure viability, this provides continuity for the children and their families.</p> <p>Staff development continues to be a focus, training and support are given to all staff members. 1 staff member has completed their NVQ Level 3 in Childcare, Learning and Development during this financial year, another member of staff has begun to work towards her Level 2 qualification.</p> <p>We continue to support training and experience opportunities for childcare students and also vocational opportunities for students still within the school system.</p>
