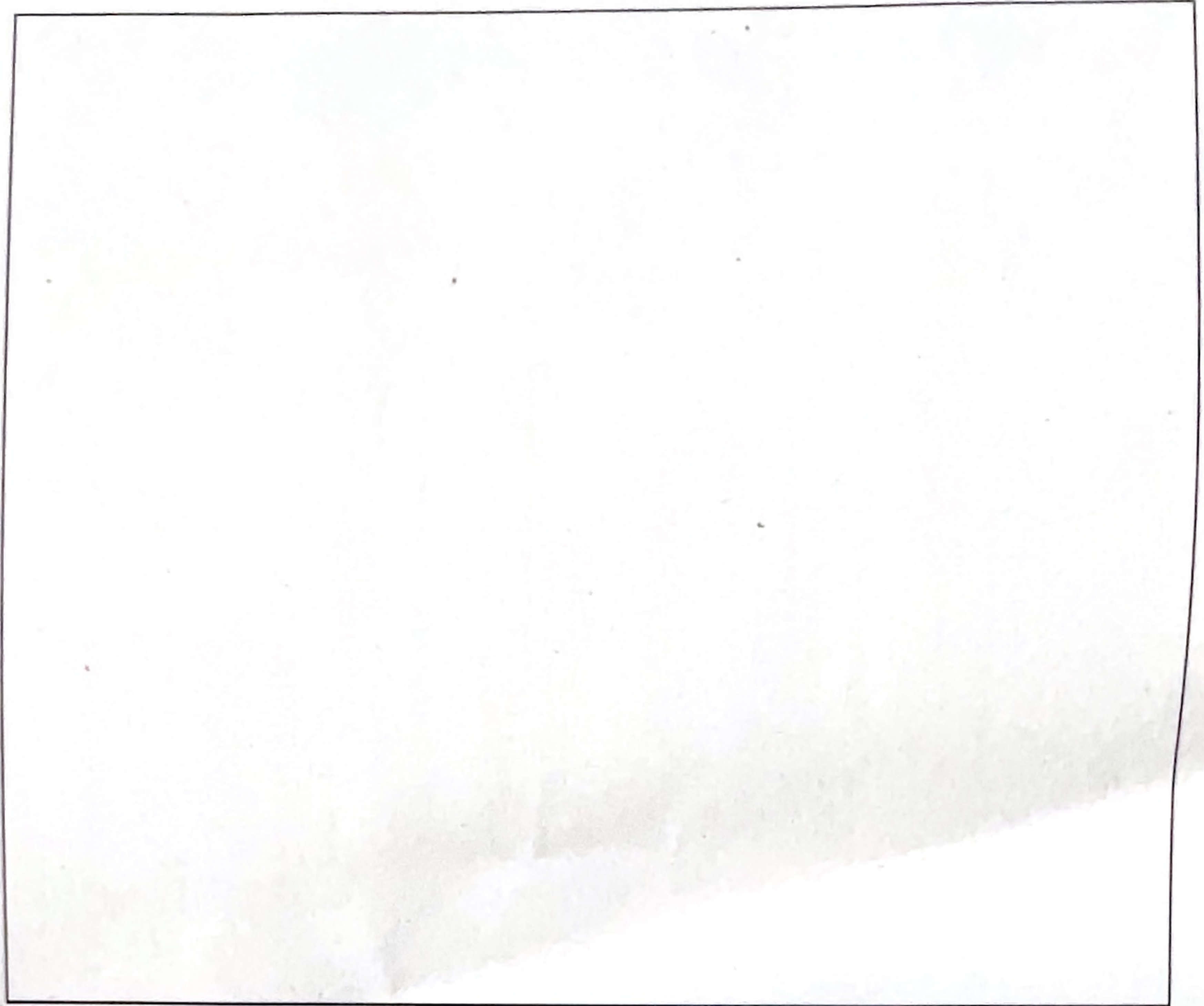

Donations and grants received have remained consistent, having received £24,801 in donations and grants in 2024 compared to £23,867 in 2023.

The shop income has increased considerably compared to the prior year. Introducing a card reader, rather than cash only has also helped increase sales.

The deficit in unrestricted funds this year is due to the renovation of the recently purchased (2023) premises with the intention to merge the existing community centre with the shop to enable all our activities to be run "under one roof".

During the year we helped 23 cancer sufferers and their families with financial support.





Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

Fundraising donations were up on last years figure of £10,576 (last year total donations included a bequest of £75,000) but were well below pre covid figures. However, the shop income increased greatly and continues to be a good source of funding. The community centre is being utilised more now and as well as providing a means to hold the regular monthly peer support meetings and bereavement support groups there are now regular monthly coffee mornings to help raise funds.

Events held by the group this year included a Movie Night, Bingo, a Cheese & Wine Evening (with the Rotary Club), a Light & Lantern Event and a Christmas Shopping Event.

During the year we have helped 31 cancer sufferers and their families with financial support.
