REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2025

The trustees, who are also directors of the charity for the purposes of the Companies Act 2006, submit their report with the financial statements for the year ended 31 March 2025. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic and Ireland (FRS 102) (effective January 2019).

The charity is a charitable company limited by guarantee. It is governed by a Memorandum and Articles of Association.

Trustees responsibilities statement

The trustees (who are also directors of Moxley Peoples Centre Charity for the purposes of company law) are responsible for preparing the Report of the Trustees and the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and United Kingdom Accounting Standards (United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice) including Financial Reporting Standard 102 "The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic and Ireland".

Company law requires the trustees to prepare financial statements for each financial year, which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the charitable company and of the incoming resources and application of resources including the income and expenditure, of the charitable company for that period. In preparing these financial statements, the trustees are required to:-

- Select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
- Observe the methods and principles in the Charity SORP;
- Make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- State whether applicable accounting standards have been followed, subject to any material departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements;
- Prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charitable company will continue in operation.

The trustees are responsible for keeping proper accounting records that disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charitable company and enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 2006. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charitable company and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

Company Objects, policies and organisation

Moxley Peoples Centre Charity was established to promote the benefit of the inhabitants of Moxley and its neighbourhood without discrimination of sex, race, political or religious opinion, by associating together with local statutory and voluntary organisations in a common effort to advance education and provide facilities in the interest of social welfare for recreation and leisure time occupation with the object of improving the conditions of life of the said inhabitants.

The charity has its main base at 3 Queen Street, Moxley, where it has access to a wide variety of specialist accommodation and facilities.

The charity is pledged to prioritise and make provision for:

Lifelong learning, care, youth work, play activities, sport, leisure and recreation and community development.

The charity also supports a wide range of affiliated groups, clubs and societies.

The directors of the company are served by a Community Manager, who is charged with the planning, development and delivery of the agreed programme. The manager is supported by a team of administrative and supervisory staff in order to implement and maintain the smooth running of the activities of the charity.

REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2025/cont...

Company Objects, policies and organisation /cont...

Directors regularly review the programme content and priority in the context of the particular needs of the community and have established a number of key areas of work as set out below:-

Lifelong learning focused on those returning to learn. Those who may be most disadvantaged and disengaged, regardless of age or ability.

Care for the elderly, frail, disadvantaged and isolated from within the community.

Support for young people in assisting them beyond their formal education by providing alternative learning environments, to assist them to take ownership of their personal development, particularly in their social time and to assist young unemployed in the community to develop the skills necessary to improve their employment prospects.

To provide a range of sport, leisure and recreational opportunities for local individuals and groups.

The directors of Moxley Peoples Centre Charity through their hard work and dedication feel that they have achieved the majority of their targets.

Events have been targeted to reach the most disadvantaged people within the area and we have reached as many of these people as we can, given the limited staff that we currently have.

The feedback from the local community has been very positive and suggestions for future activities have been taken on board.

The volunteers, who give their time freely, are greatly appreciated and we would request that this support continues during the next financial year.

Financial review

The Charity had balances of £779 on restricted funds and £120,988 on unrestricted funds at the year-end.

Review of the Year 2024 - 2025

Following on from last year's review, the year just ended has once again proved to be a period of further consolidation within the Centre.

Activities within the Centre include Line Dancing, Fitness groups, a Golden 55 Club and events organised with our partners, Moxley Community Care.

Moxley Community Care, based within the Centre and funded by the National Lottery have during the course of the year organised a number of projects including drop-in sessions, youth clubs, day trips and special events within the Centre, they have on behalf the Centre liaised with and contacted vulnerable people from our community to ensure they are not forgotten.

The local community library based at the Centre, continues to provide a valuable service to the community.

Public and Private organisations, have once again used the Centre for meetings and other functions during the year.

As in previous years general maintenance has been carried out on the buildings and surrounds.

Future Plans

Looking forward, and from September this year 2025, two private organisations have agreed terms to hire various rooms within the Centre, and with future plans in mind we shall consider what we can offer our local residents, although the Board does recognise that whatever plans and whatever the future holds must be structured within our financial situation.

A full listing of the Boards Trustees is shown within these accounts.

Reserves

The directors have reviewed the reserves of the company. Their review included a consideration of the nature of the income and expenditure streams, the requirement to match variable income with fixed commitments and a consideration of the nature of the reserves. As a result of this review, it was concluded that, in order to allow the company to be managed efficiently and to ensure sufficient reserves were available to provide uninterrupted services, an unrestricted income fund of at least 3 months of the company's operating costs should be maintained.

In addition, amounts are to be set aside out of reserves in order to ensure funds are available for specific expenditure envisaged in the next financial year if appropriate.

Risk Management

The Trustees have a duty to identify and review the risks to which the Charity is exposed and to ensure appropriate controls are in place to provide reasonable assurance against fraud and error.

The Trustees are satisfied that adequate systems and procedures are in operation to mitigate against the potential impact on the Charity should any of those risks materialise.

Public Benefit

The Trustees have complied with their duty in Section 17 of the Charities Act 2011 to have regard to public benefit guidelines published by the Commission in exercising their powers or duties

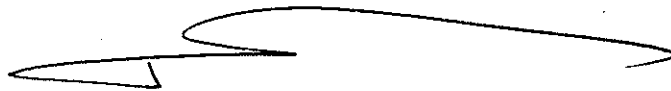

1. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

General information and basis of preparation

Moxley Peoples Centre Charity is a company limited by guarantee registered in England and Wales. In the event of the charity being wound up, the liability in respect of the guarantee is limited to £1 per member of the charity. The address of the registered office is given in the charity information on page 1 of these financial statements.

The financial statements of the charitable company, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102 have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019), Financial Reporting Standard 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Companies Act 2006.

The financial statements are prepared on a going concern basis under the historical cost convention. The financial statements are presented in sterling which is the functional currency of the charity and rounded to the nearest £1.

The significant accounting policies applied in the preparation of these financial statements are set out below. These policies have been consistently applied to all years presented unless otherwise stated.

Funds

Unrestricted funds are available for use at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of the general objectives of the charity and which have not been designated for other purposes.

Restricted funds are funds which are to be used in accordance with specific restrictions imposed by donors or which have been raised by the charity for particular purposes. The cost of raising and administering such funds are charged against the specific fund. The aim and use of each restricted fund is set out in the notes to the financial statements.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

1. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES / cont...

Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included in the Statement of Financial Activities (SOFA) when the charity has entitlement to the income after any performance conditions have been met, the amount can be measured reliably and it is probable that the income will be received.

For donations to be recognised the charity will have been notified of the amounts and the settlement date in writing. If there are conditions attached to the donation and this requires a level of performance before entitlement can be obtained then income is deferred until those conditions are fully met or the fulfilment of those conditions is within the control of the charity and it is probable that they will be fulfilled in the reporting period.

For legacies, entitlement is the earlier of the charity being notified of an impending distribution or the legacy being received. At this point income is recognised. On occasion legacies will be notified to the charity however it is not possible to measure the amount expected to be distributed. On these occasions the legacy is treated as a contingent asset and disclosed.

Income from government and other grants are recognised at fair value when the charity has entitlement after any performance conditions have been met, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably. If entitlement is not met then these amounts are deferred.

Expenditure

All expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all costs related to the category. Expenditure is recognised where there is a legal or constructive obligation to make payments to third parties, it is probable that the settlement will be required and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably.

Irrecoverable VAT is charged as an expense against the activity for which expenditure arose.

Support costs allocation

Support costs are those that assist the work of the charity but do not directly represent charitable activities and include office costs, governance costs and administrative payroll costs. They are incurred directly in support of expenditure on the objects of the charity. Where support costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to cost of raising funds and expenditure on charitable activities on a basis consistent with use of the resources.

1. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES /cont...

Tangible fixed assets

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation and accumulated impairment losses. Cost includes costs directly attributable to making the asset capable of operating as intended.

Depreciation is provided from the date of acquisition on all tangible fixed assets, at rates calculated to write off the cost, less estimated residual value, of each asset on a systematic basis over its expected useful life as follows:-

Fixtures, fittings and equipment 33% p.a. straight line

Debtors and creditors receivable/payable within one year

Debtors and creditors with no stated interest rate and receivable or payable within one year are recorded at transaction price. Any losses arising from impairment are recognised in expenditure.

Employment benefits

When employees have rendered service to the charity, short-term employee benefits to which the employees are entitled are recognised at the undiscounted amount expected to be paid in exchange for that service.

Tax

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2024

The trustees, who are also directors of the charity for the purposes of the Companies Act 2006, submit their report with the financial statements for the year ended 31 March 2024. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic and Ireland (FRS 102) (effective January 2019).

The charity is a charitable company limited by guarantee. It is governed by a Memorandum and Articles of Association.

Trustees responsibilities statements

The trustees (who are also directors of Moxley Peoples Centre Charity for the purposes of company law) are responsible for preparing the Report of the Trustees and the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and United Kingdom Accounting Standards (United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice) including Financial Reporting Standard 102 "The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic and Ireland".

Company law requires the trustees to prepare financial statements for each financial year, which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the charitable company and of the incoming resources and application of resources including the income and expenditure, of the charitable company for that period. In preparing these financial statements, the trustees are required to:-

- Select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
- Observe the methods and principles in the Charity SORP;
- Make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- State whether applicable accounting standards have been followed, subject to any material departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements;
- Prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charitable company will continue in operation.

The trustees are responsible for keeping proper accounting records that disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charitable company and enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 2006. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charitable company and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

Company Objects, policies and organisation

Moxley Peoples Centre Charity was established to promote the benefit of the inhabitants of Moxley and its neighbourhood without discrimination of sex, race, political or religious opinion, by associating together with local statutory and voluntary organisations in a common effort to advance education and provide facilities in the interest of social welfare for recreation and leisure time occupation with the object of improving the conditions of life of the said inhabitants.

The charity has its main base at 3 Queen Street, Moxley, where it has access to a wide variety of specialist accommodation and facilities.

The charity is pledged to prioritise and make provision for:

Lifelong learning, care, youth work, play activities, sport, leisure and recreation and community development.

The charity also supports a wide range of affiliated groups, clubs and societies.

The directors of the company are served by a Community Manager, who is charged with the planning, development and delivery of the agreed programme. The manager is supported by a team of administrative and supervisory staff in order to implement and maintain the smooth running of the activities of the charity.

REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2024/cont...

Company Objects, policies and organisation /cont...

Directors regularly review the programme content and priority in the context of the particular needs of the community and have established a number of key areas of work as set out below:-

Lifelong learning focused on those returning to learn. Those who may be most disadvantaged and disengaged, regardless of age or ability.

Care for the elderly, frail, disadvantaged and isolated from within the community.

Support for young people in assisting them beyond their formal education by providing alternative learning environments, to assist them to take ownership of their personal development, particularly in their social time and to assist young unemployed in the community to develop the skills necessary to improve their employment prospects.

To provide a range of sport, leisure and recreational opportunities for local individuals and groups.

The directors of Moxley Peoples Centre Charity through their hard work and dedication feel that they have achieved the majority of their targets.

Events have been targeted to reach the most disadvantaged people within the area and we have reached as many of these people as we can, given the limited staff that we currently have.

The feedback from the local community has been very positive and suggestions for future activities have been taken on board.

The volunteers, who give their time freely, are greatly appreciated and we would request that this support continues during the next financial year.

Financial review

The Charity had balances of £7,058 on restricted funds and £161,681 on unrestricted funds at the year-end.

Review of the Year 2023 - 2024

Following on from last year's review, the year just ended has once again proved to be a period of further consolidation within the Centre.

Activities within the Centre include Line Dancing, Fitness groups, a Golden 55 Club and events organised with our partners, Moxley Community Care.

Moxley Community Care, based within the Centre and funded by the National Lottery have during the course of the year organised a number of projects including drop-in sessions, youth clubs, day trips and special events within the Centre, they have on behalf the Centre liaised with and contacted vulnerable people from our community to ensure they are not forgotten.

The local community library based at the Centre, continues to provide a valuable service to the community.

Public and Private organisations, have once again used the Centre for meetings and other functions during the year.

As in previous years general maintenance has been carried out on the buildings and surrounds.

Future Plans

Looking forward, and from September this year 2024, two private organisations have agreed terms to hire various rooms within the Centre, and with future plans in mind we shall consider what we can offer our local residents, although the Board does recognise that whatever plans and whatever the future holds must be structured within our financial situation.

A full listing of the Boards Trustees is shown within these accounts.

REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2024/ cont...

Reserves

The directors have reviewed the reserves of the company. Their review included a consideration of the nature of the income and expenditure streams, the requirement to match variable income with fixed commitments and a consideration of the nature of the reserves. As a result of this review, it was concluded that, in order to allow the company to be managed efficiently and to ensure sufficient reserves were available to provide uninterrupted services, an unrestricted income fund of at least 3 months of the company's operating costs should be maintained.

In addition, amounts are to be set aside out of reserves in order to ensure funds are available for specific expenditure envisaged in the next financial year if appropriate.

Risk Management


The Trustees have a duty to identify and review the risks to which the Charity is exposed and to ensure appropriate controls are in place to provide reasonable assurance against fraud and error.

The Trustees are satisfied that adequate systems and procedures are in operation to mitigate against the potential impact on the Charity should any of those risks materialise.

Public Benefit

The Trustees have complied with their duty in Section 17 of the Charities Act 2011 to have regard to public benefit guidelines published by the Commission in exercising their powers or duties

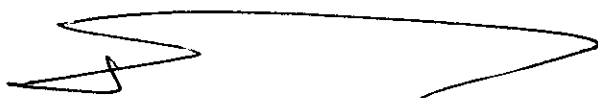

1. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

General information and basis of preparation

Moxley Peoples Centre Charity is a company limited by guarantee registered in England and Wales. In the event of the charity being wound up, the liability in respect of the guarantee is limited to £1 per member of the charity. The address of the registered office is given in the charity information on page 1 of these financial statements.

The financial statements of the charitable company, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102 have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019), Financial Reporting Standard 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Companies Act 2006.

The financial statements are prepared on a going concern basis under the historical cost convention. The financial statements are presented in sterling which is the functional currency of the charity and rounded to the nearest £1.

The significant accounting policies applied in the preparation of these financial statements are set out below. These policies have been consistently applied to all years presented unless otherwise stated.

Funds

Unrestricted funds are available for use at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of the general objectives of the charity and which have not been designated for other purposes.

Restricted funds are funds which are to be used in accordance with specific restrictions imposed by donors or which have been raised by the charity for particular purposes. The cost of raising and administering such funds are charged against the specific fund. The aim and use of each restricted fund is set out in the notes to the financial statements.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

1. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES / cont...

Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included in the Statement of Financial Activities (SOFA) when the charity has entitlement to the income after any performance conditions have been met, the amount can be measured reliably and it is probable that the income will be received.

For donations to be recognised the charity will have been notified of the amounts and the settlement date in writing. If there are conditions attached to the donation and this requires a level of performance before entitlement can be obtained then income is deferred until those conditions are fully met or the fulfilment of those conditions is within the control of the charity and it is probable that they will be fulfilled in the reporting period.

For legacies, entitlement is the earlier of the charity being notified of an impending distribution or the legacy being received. At this point income is recognised. On occasion legacies will be notified to the charity however it is not possible to measure the amount expected to be distributed. On these occasions the legacy is treated as a contingent asset and disclosed.

Income from government and other grants are recognised at fair value when the charity has entitlement after any performance conditions have been met, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably. If entitlement is not met then these amounts are deferred.

Expenditure

All expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all costs related to the category. Expenditure is recognised where there is a legal or constructive obligation to make payments to third parties, it is probable that the settlement will be required and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably.

Irrecoverable VAT is charged as an expense against the activity for which expenditure arose.

Support costs allocation

Support costs are those that assist the work of the charity but do not directly represent charitable activities and include office costs, governance costs and administrative payroll costs. They are incurred directly in support of expenditure on the objects of the charity. Where support costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to cost of raising funds and expenditure on charitable activities on a basis consistent with use of the resources.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

1. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES /cont...

Tangible fixed assets

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation and accumulated impairment losses. Cost includes costs directly attributable to making the asset capable of operating as intended.

Depreciation is provided from the date of acquisition on all tangible fixed assets, at rates calculated to write off the cost, less estimated residual value, of each asset on a systematic basis over its expected useful life as follows:-

Fixtures, fittings and equipment 33% p.a. straight line

Debtors and creditors receivable/payable within one year

Debtors and creditors with no stated interest rate and receivable or payable within one year are recorded at transaction price. Any losses arising from impairment are recognised in expenditure.

Employment benefits

When employees have rendered service to the charity, short-term employee benefits to which the employees are entitled are recognised at the undiscounted amount expected to be paid in exchange for that service.

Tax

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2023

The trustees, who are also directors of the charity for the purposes of the Companies Act, submit their annual report and financial statements for the year ended 31 March 2023. The trustees have adopted the provisions of the Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP) "Accounting and Reporting by Charities" in preparing the annual report and financial statements of the charity.

The charity is a charitable company limited by guarantee. It is governed by a Memorandum and Articles of Association.

Trustees responsibilities statements

The trustees (who are also directors of Moxley Peoples Centre Charity for the purposes of company law) are responsible for preparing the Directors' Report and the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and United Kingdom Accounting Standards (United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice)

Company law requires the directors to prepare financial statements for each financial year, which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the charitable company and of the incoming resources and application of resources including the income and expenditure, of the charitable company for the year.

In preparing these financial statements, the trustees are required to:-

Select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
Observe the methods and principles in the charities SORP;
Make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
Prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charitable company will continue in operation.

The directors are responsible for keeping proper accounting records that disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charitable company and enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 2006. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charitable company and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

Company Objects, policies and organization

Moxley Peoples Centre Charity was established to promote the benefit of the inhabitants of Moxley and its neighbourhood without discrimination of sex, race, political or religious opinion, by associating together with local statutory and voluntary organisations in a common effort to advance education and provide facilities in the interest of social welfare for recreation and leisure time occupation with the object of improving the conditions of life of the said inhabitants.

The charity has its main base at 3 Queen Street, Moxley, where it has access to a wide variety of specialist accommodation and facilities.

The charity is pledged to prioritise and make provision for:

Lifelong learning, care, youth work, play activities, sport, leisure and recreation and community development.

The charity also supports a wide range of affiliated groups, clubs and societies.

The directors of the company are served by a Community Manager, who is charged with the planning, development and delivery of the agreed programme. The manager is supported by a team of administrative and supervisory staff in order to implement and maintain the smooth running of the activities of the charity.

Directors regularly review the programme content and priority in the context of the particular needs of the community and have established a number of key areas of work as set out below:-

Lifelong learning focused on those returning to learn. Those who may be most disadvantaged and disengaged, regardless of age or ability.

Company Objects, policies and organisation /cont...

Care for the elderly, frail, disadvantaged and isolated from within the community.
Support for young people in assisting them beyond their formal education by providing alternative learning environments, to assist them to take ownership of their personal development, particularly in their social time and to assist young unemployed in the community to develop the skills necessary to improve their employment prospects.

To provide a range of sport, leisure and recreational opportunities for local individuals and groups.

The directors of Moxley Peoples Centre Charity through their hard work and dedication feel that they have achieved the majority of their targets.

Events have been targeted to reach the most disadvantaged people within the area and we have reached as many of these people as we can, given the limited staff that we currently have.

The feedback from the local community has been very positive and suggestions for future activities have been taken on board.

The volunteers, who give their time freely, are greatly appreciated and we would request that this support continues during the next financial year.

Financial review

The Charity had balances of £7,845 on restricted funds and £190,218 on unrestricted funds at the year-end.

Review of the Year 2022 - 2023

As stated on last years review the year just ended has indeed been a further period of consolidation within the Centre.

Although during the year Moxley Tots Nursery, who had been utilising rooms at the Centre, closed, with the obvious shortfall in income, all other activities such as Parent & Toddlers Group, Line Dancing and Fitness activities continued apace with good attendances in all sectors.

Our Partners, Moxley Community Care, based within the Centre and funded by the National Lottery have during the course of the year organised a number of projects including drop in sessions, youth clubs, day trips, and special events at the Centre, with all being very well attended. They have also on behalf the Centre liaised with and contacted vulnerable people within our Community to ensure they are not forgotten.

A new local community Library has been established at the Centre, for use by all.

Both Public and Private organisations have used the Centre for meetings and other functions during the Year.

As in previous years general maintenance has been carried out on the building and surrounds.

As previously stated last year our Chairman of the Board and Manager continues to be Cllr. Christine Bott, albeit without voting rights, and although we recognise this to be a unique situation, her knowledge, expertise and through her Council work, contacts, has provided excellent value for money for the Centre

Future Plan

We shall once again consider what we can offer our local residents, although it is recognised by the Board, that whatever the future holds all plans must be structured within our financial situation.

Reserves

The directors have reviewed the reserves of the company. Their review included a consideration of the nature of the income and expenditure streams, the requirement to match variable income with fixed commitments and a consideration of the nature of the reserves. As a result of this review, it was concluded that, in order to allow the company to be managed efficiently and to ensure sufficient reserves were available to provide uninterrupted services, an unrestricted income fund of at least 3 months of the company's operating costs should be maintained.

In addition, amounts are to be set aside out of reserves in order to ensure funds are available for specific expenditure envisaged in the next financial year if appropriate.

Risk Management

The Trustees have a duty to identify and review the risks to which the Charity is exposed and to ensure appropriate controls are in place to provide reasonable assurance against fraud and error.

The Trustees are satisfied that adequate systems and procedures are in operation to mitigate against the potential impact on the Charity should any of those risks materialise.

Public Benefit

The Trustees have complied with their duty in Section 17 of the Charities Act 2011 to have regard to public benefit guidelines published by the Commission in exercising their powers or duties

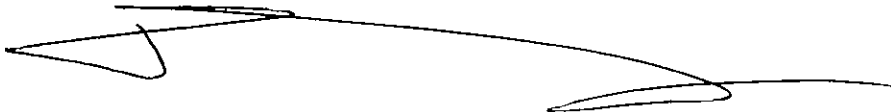

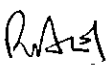

1. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

General information and basis of preparation

Moxley Peoples Centre Charity is a company limited by guarantee registered in England and Wales. In the event of the charity being wound up, the liability in respect of the guarantee is limited to £1 per member of the charity. The address of the registered office is given in the charity information on page 1 of these financial statements.

The charity constitutes a public benefit entity as defined by FRS 102. The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Accounting and Reporting Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) issued on 16 July 2014 (as updated through Update Bulletin 1 published on 2 February 2016), the Charities Act 2011, the Companies Act 2006 and UK Generally Accepted Practice as it applies from 1 January 2015.

The charity has applied Update Bulletin 1 as published on 2 February 2016 and does not include a cash flow statement on the grounds that it is applying FRS 102 Section 1A.

The financial statements have been prepared to give a "true and fair" view and have departed from the Charities (Accounts and Reports) Regulations 2008 only to the extent required to provide a "true and fair view". This departure has involved following the Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) issued on 16 July 2014 rather than the Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice effective from 1 April 2005 which has since been withdrawn.

The financial statements are prepared on a going concern basis under the historical cost convention. The financial statements are presented in sterling which is the functional currency of the charity and rounded to the nearest £1.

The significant accounting policies applied in the preparation of these financial statements are set out below. These policies have been consistently applied to all years presented unless otherwise stated.

Funds

Unrestricted funds are available for use at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of the general objectives of the charity and which have not been designated for other purposes.

Restricted funds are funds which are to be used in accordance with specific restrictions imposed by donors or which have been raised by the charity for particular purposes. The cost of raising and administering such funds are charged against the specific fund. The aim and use of each restricted fund is set out in the notes to the financial statements.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS
For the year ended 31 March 2023 /cont...

1. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES / cont...

Income recognition

All incoming resources are included in the Statement of Financial Activities (SOFA) when the charity is legally entitled to the income after any performance conditions have been met, the amount can be measured reliably and it is probable that the income will be received.

For donations to be recognised the charity will have been notified of the amounts and the settlement date in writing. If there are conditions attached to the donation and this requires a level of performance before entitlement can be obtained then income is deferred until those conditions are fully met or the fulfilment of those conditions is within the control of the charity and it is probable that they will be fulfilled.

No amount is included in the financial statements for volunteer time in line with the SORP (FRS 102).

For legacies, entitlement is the earlier of the charity being notified of an impending distribution or the legacy being received. At this point income is recognised. On occasion legacies will be notified to the charity however it is not possible to measure the amount expected to be distributed. On these occasions the legacy is treated as a contingent asset and disclosed.

Income from government and other grants are recognised at fair value when the charity has entitlement after any performance conditions have been met, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably. If entitlement is not met then these amounts are deferred.

Expenditure recognition

All expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all costs related to the category. Expenditure is recognised where there is a legal or constructive obligation to make payments to third parties, it is probable that the settlement will be required and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably.

Irrecoverable VAT is charged as an expense against the activity for which expenditure arose.

Support costs allocation

Support costs are those that assist the work of the charity but do not directly represent charitable activities and include office costs, governance costs and administrative payroll costs. They are incurred directly in support of expenditure on the objects of the charity. Where support costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to cost of raising funds and expenditure on charitable activities on a basis consistent with use of the resources.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

1. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES /cont...

Tangible fixed assets

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation and accumulated impairment losses. Cost includes costs directly attributable to making the asset capable of operating as intended.

Depreciation is provided from the date of acquisition on all tangible fixed assets, at rates calculated to write off the cost, less estimated residual value, of each asset on a systematic basis over its expected useful life as follows:-

Fixtures, fittings and equipment 33% p.a. straight line

Debtors and creditors receivable/payable within one year

Debtors and creditors with no stated interest rate and receivable or payable within one year are recorded at transaction price. Any losses arising from impairment are recognised in expenditure.

Employment benefits

When employees have rendered service to the charity, short-term employee benefits to which the employees are entitled are recognised at the undiscounted amount expected to be paid in exchange for that service.

Tax

The charity is an exempt charity within the meaning of schedule 3 of the Charities Act 2011 and is considered to pass the tests set out in Paragraph 1 Schedule 6 Finance Act 2010 and therefore it meets the definition of a charitable company for UK corporation tax purposes.

Going concern

The financial statements have been prepared on a going concern basis as the trustees believe that no material uncertainties exist. The trustees have considered the level of funds held and the expected level of income and expenditure for 12 months from authorising these financial statements. The budgeted income and expenditure is sufficient with the level of reserves for the charity to be able to continue as a going concern.

REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2022

The trustees, who are also directors of the charity for the purposes of the Companies Act, submit their annual report and financial statements for the year ended 31 March 2022. The trustees have adopted the provisions of the Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP) "Accounting and Reporting by Charities" in preparing the annual report and financial statements of the charity.

The charity is a charitable company limited by guarantee. It is governed by a Memorandum and Articles of Association.

Trustees responsibilities statements

The trustees (who are also directors of Moxley Peoples Centre Charity for the purposes of company law) are responsible for preparing the Directors' Report and the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and United Kingdom Accounting Standards (United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice)

Company law requires the directors to prepare financial statements for each financial year, which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the charitable company and of the incoming resources and application of resources including the income and expenditure, of the charitable company for the year.

In preparing these financial statements, the trustees are required to:-

Select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
Observe the methods and principles in the charities SORP;
Make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
Prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charitable company will continue in operation.

The directors are responsible for keeping proper accounting records that disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charitable company and enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 2006. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charitable company and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

Company Objects, policies and organization

Moxley Peoples Centre Charity was established to promote the benefit of the inhabitants of Moxley and its neighbourhood without discrimination of sex, race, political or religious opinion, by associating together with local statutory and voluntary organisations in a common effort to advance education and provide facilities in the interest of social welfare for recreation and leisure time occupation with the object of improving the conditions of life of the said inhabitants.

The charity has its main base at 3 Queen Street, Moxley, where it has access to a wide variety of specialist accommodation and facilities.

The charity is pledged to prioritise and make provision for:

Lifelong learning, care, youth work, play activities, sport, leisure and recreation and community development.

The charity also supports a wide range of affiliated groups, clubs and societies.

The directors of the company are served by a Community Manager, who is charged with the planning, development and delivery of the agreed programme. The manager is supported by a team of administrative and supervisory staff in order to implement and maintain the smooth running of the activities of the charity.

Directors regularly review the programme content and priority in the context of the particular needs of the community and have established a number of key areas of work as set out below:-

Lifelong learning focused on those returning to learn. Those who may be most disadvantaged and disengaged, regardless of age or ability.

REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2022/cont...

Company Objects, policies and organisation /cont...

Care for the elderly, frail, disadvantaged and isolated from within the community.
Support for young people in assisting them beyond their formal education by providing alternative learning environments, to assist them to take ownership of their personal development, particularly in their social time and to assist young unemployed in the community to develop the skills necessary to improve their employment prospects.

To provide a range of sport, leisure and recreational opportunities for local individuals and groups.

The directors of Moxley Peoples Centre Charity through their hard work and dedication feel that they have achieved the majority of their targets.

Events have been targeted to reach the most disadvantaged people within the area and we have reached as many of these people as we can, given the limited staff that we currently have.

The feedback from the local community has been very positive and suggestions for future activities have been taken on board.

The volunteers, who give their time freely, are greatly appreciated and we would request that this support continues during the next financial year.

Financial review

The Charity had surpluses of £9,073 on restricted funds and £181,833 on unrestricted funds at the year-end.

Review of the Year 2021 - 2022

Following on from the shackles and disruption to services caused by the Covid Pandemic, the year from April 2021 to March 2022, has seen a period of consolidation and reflection on what we can offer to local residents within the community.

Some services that were previously offered have due to circumstances not been continued, although our basic core services and events have not been affected, with support for events such as the Parent & Toddlers Group, Line Dancing and Fitness activities continuing apace.

One notable highlight during the later part of the year has been funding, for a period of 3 years, by the National Lottery of Moxley Community Care, who by use of this funding are able to employ 3 staff, who on behalf of the Centre, liaise and contact elderly and vulnerable people within our community to ensure they are not forgotten, visit homes and organise events at the Centre.

Moxley Tots Nursery continues to be based here at the Centre, and to utilise the rooms defined for their purposes. Other organisations have utilised our facilities during this period and continue to do so.

As with the previous years, only general maintenance has been carried out on the building, during the period, although we have updated computers and IT room facilities.

Our Chairman of the Board, continues to be Cllr. Christine Bott, albeit without voting rights, and although we recognise this as being a unique situation, it is believed Christine's knowledge expertise and through her Council work, contacts, has provided excellent value for money for the Centre.

Future Plan

As previously noted, consolidation and reflection on what we can offer to our local residents is our main consideration with future planning, although it is recognised by the Board that whatever the future holds, all plans must be structured within our financial situation.

Reserves

The directors have reviewed the reserves of the company. Their review included a consideration of the nature of the income and expenditure streams, the requirement to match variable income with fixed commitments and a consideration of the nature of the reserves. As a result of this review, it was concluded that, in order to allow the company to be managed efficiently and to ensure sufficient reserves were available to provide uninterrupted services, an unrestricted income fund of at least 3 months of the company's operating costs should be maintained.

In addition, amounts are to be set aside out of reserves in order to ensure funds are available for specific expenditure envisaged in the next financial year if appropriate.

Risk Management

The Trustees have a duty to identify and review the risks to which the Charity is exposed and to ensure appropriate controls are in place to provide reasonable assurance against fraud and error.

The Trustees are satisfied that adequate systems and procedures are in operation to mitigate against the potential impact on the Charity should any of those risks materialise.

Public Benefit

The Trustees have complied with their duty in Section 17 of the Charities Act 2011 to have regard to public benefit guidelines published by the Commission in exercising their powers or duties

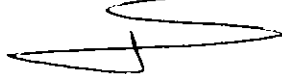

Moxley Peoples Centre Charity is a company limited by guarantee registered in England and Wales. In the event of the charity being wound up, the liability in respect of the guarantee is limited to £1 per member of the charity. The address of the registered office is given in the charity information on page 1 of these financial statements.

The charity constitutes a public benefit entity as defined by FRS 102. The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Accounting and Reporting Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) issued on 16 July 2014 (as updated through Update Bulletin 1 published on 2 February 2016), the Charities Act 2011, the Companies Act 2006 and UK Generally Accepted Practice as it applies from 1 January 2015.

The charity has applied Update Bulletin 1 as published on 2 February 2016 and does not include a cash flow statement on the grounds that it is applying FRS 102 Section 1A.

The financial statements have been prepared to give a "true and fair" view and have departed from the Charities (Accounts and Reports) Regulations 2008 only to the extent required to provide a "true and fair view". This departure has involved following the Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) issued on 16 July 2014 rather than the Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice effective from 1 April 2005 which has since been withdrawn.

The financial statements are prepared on a going concern basis under the historical cost convention. The financial statements are presented in sterling which is the functional currency of the charity and rounded to the nearest £1.

The significant accounting policies applied in the preparation of these financial statements are set out below. These policies have been consistently applied to all years presented unless otherwise stated.

Funds

Unrestricted funds are available for use at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of the general objectives of the charity and which have not been designated for other purposes.

Restricted funds are funds which are to be used in accordance with specific restrictions imposed by donors or which have been raised by the charity for particular purposes. The cost of raising and administering such funds are charged against the specific fund. The aim and use of each restricted fund is set out in the notes to the financial statements.

1. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES / cont...

Income recognition

All incoming resources are included in the Statement of Financial Activities (SOFA) when the charity is legally entitled to the income after any performance conditions have been met, the amount can be measured reliably and it is probable that the income will be received.

For donations to be recognised the charity will have been notified of the amounts and the settlement date in writing. If there are conditions attached to the donation and this requires a level of performance before entitlement can be obtained then income is deferred until those conditions are fully met or the fulfilment of those conditions is within the control of the charity and it is probable that they will be fulfilled.

No amount is included in the financial statements for volunteer time in line with the SORP (FRS 102).

For legacies, entitlement is the earlier of the charity being notified of an impending distribution or the legacy being received. At this point income is recognised. On occasion legacies will be notified to the charity however it is not possible to measure the amount expected to be distributed. On these occasions the legacy is treated as a contingent asset and disclosed.

Income from government and other grants are recognised at fair value when the charity has entitlement after any performance conditions have been met, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably. If entitlement is not met then these amounts are deferred.

Expenditure recognition

All expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all costs related to the category. Expenditure is recognised where there is a legal or constructive obligation to make payments to third parties, it is probable that the settlement will be required and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably.

Irrecoverable VAT is charged as an expense against the activity for which expenditure arose.

Support costs allocation

Support costs are those that assist the work of the charity but do not directly represent charitable activities and include office costs, governance costs and administrative payroll costs. They are incurred directly in support of expenditure on the objects of the charity. Where support costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to cost of raising funds and expenditure on charitable activities on a basis consistent with use of the resources.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

1. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES /cont...

Tangible fixed assets

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation and accumulated impairment losses. Cost includes costs directly attributable to making the asset capable of operating as intended.

Depreciation is provided from the date of acquisition on all tangible fixed assets, at rates calculated to write off the cost, less estimated residual value, of each asset on a systematic basis over its expected useful life as follows:-

Fixtures, fittings and equipment 33% p.a. straight line

Debtors and creditors receivable/payable within one year

Debtors and creditors with no stated interest rate and receivable or payable within one year are recorded at transaction price. Any losses arising from impairment are recognised in expenditure.

Employment benefits

When employees have rendered service to the charity, short-term employee benefits to which the employees are entitled are recognised at the undiscounted amount expected to be paid in exchange for that service.

Tax

The charity is an exempt charity within the meaning of schedule 3 of the Charities Act 2011 and is considered to pass the tests set out in Paragraph 1 Schedule 6 Finance Act 2010 and therefore it meets the definition of a charitable company for UK corporation tax purposes.

Going concern

The financial statements have been prepared on a going concern basis as the trustees believe that no material uncertainties exist. The trustees have considered the level of funds held and the expected level of income and expenditure for 12 months from authorising these financial statements. The budgeted income and expenditure is sufficient with the level of reserves for the charity to be able to continue as a going concern.

REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2021

The trustees, who are also directors of the charity for the purposes of the Companies Act, submit their annual report and financial statements for the year ended 31 March 2021. The trustees have adopted the provisions of the Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP) "Accounting and Reporting by Charities" in preparing the annual report and financial statements of the charity.

The charity is a charitable company limited by guarantee. It is governed by a Memorandum and Articles of Association.

Trustees responsibilities statements

The trustees (who are also directors of Moxley Peoples Centre Charity for the purposes of company law) are responsible for preparing the Directors' Report and the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and United Kingdom Accounting Standards (United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice)

Company law requires the directors to prepare financial statements for each financial year, which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the charitable company and of the incoming resources and application of resources including the income and expenditure, of the charitable company for the year.

In preparing these financial statements, the trustees are required to:-

Select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
Observe the methods and principles in the charities SORP;
Make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
Prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charitable company will continue in operation.

The directors are responsible for keeping proper accounting records that disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charitable company and enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 2006. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charitable company and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

Company Objects, policies and organization

Moxley Peoples Centre Charity was established to promote the benefit of the inhabitants of Moxley and its neighbourhood without discrimination of sex, race, political or religious opinion, by associating together with local statutory and voluntary organisations in a common effort to advance education and provide facilities in the interest of social welfare for recreation and leisure time occupation with the object of improving the conditions of life of the said inhabitants.

The charity has its main base at 3 Queen Street, Moxley, where it has access to a wide variety of specialist accommodation and facilities.

The charity is pledged to prioritise and make provision for:

Lifelong learning, care, youth work, play activities, sport, leisure and recreation and community development.

The charity also supports a wide range of affiliated groups, clubs and societies.

The directors of the company are served by a Community Manager, who is charged with the planning, development and delivery of the agreed programme. The manager is supported by a team of administrative and supervisory staff in order to implement and maintain the smooth running of the activities of the charity.

Directors regularly review the programme content and priority in the context of the particular needs of the community and have established a number of key areas of work as set out below:-

Lifelong learning focused on those returning to learn. Those who may be most disadvantaged and disengaged, regardless of age or ability.

Company Objects, policies and organisation /cont...

Care for the elderly, frail, disadvantaged and isolated from within the community.
Support for young people in assisting them beyond their formal education by providing alternative learning environments, to assist them to take ownership of their personal development, particularly in their social time and to assist young unemployed in the community to develop the skills necessary to improve their employment prospects.

To provide a range of sport, leisure and recreational opportunities for local individuals and groups.

The directors of Moxley Peoples Centre Charity through their hard work and dedication feel that they have achieved the majority of their targets.

Events have been targeted to reach the most disadvantaged people within the area and we have reached as many of these people as we can, given the limited staff that we currently have.

The feedback from the local community has been very positive and suggestions for future activities have been taken on board.

The volunteers, who give their time freely, are greatly appreciated and we would request that this support continues during the next financial year.

Financial review

The Charity had surpluses of £30,799 on restricted funds and £164,632 on unrestricted funds at the year-end.

Review of Year 2020-2021

This last year has seen, in line with many other local organisations, a period of disruption to the overall plans and events, due to the worldwide Covid 19 pandemic.

However, as in the words of our previous statement, 'all was not doom and gloom', the Centre becoming a major hub in the distribution of food parcels and other items to the old and vulnerable, also during this period and through the auspice of Lottery funding 3 staff have been employed to run 'Moxley Community Care', who on behalf of the Centre liaise and contact elderly members of our community to ensure they are not forgotten, visit homes and where and when feasible organise 'distance controlled' events at the Centre.

Despite challenges presented by the various lockdowns and enforced closures caused by the pandemic, Moxley Tots Nursery, based here at the Centre has continued apace.

It should be noted though, that once again due to the pandemic, only general maintenance has been carried out on the building, during this period, although we do not envisage any structural work to be needed in the new financial year.

As previously advised, the Board appointed 3 years ago, Mrs. Christine Bott, to the position of full time Manager. Christine was and still is the Chairman of the Board, albeit without voting rights and whilst it is recognised as being a unique situation, whereby a Board member becomes an employee, it is believed Christine's knowledge expertise and through her Council work, contacts, has provided excellent value for money for the Centre.

It is wished to be noted that all throughout the period of the pandemic and various lockdowns, Mrs. Christine Bott, our manager, has maintained a dedicated and substantial control of events within the Centre, liaising where practical and possible with other Board members, to ensure the Centre's governance.

Future Plans

Whilst it is essential to forward plan within any organisation to ensure a successful future, events of this last year have left a shadow over future plans and we need a period of consolidation to assess what is needed. Although the Board do recognise that whatever the future holds all plans must be structured within our financial situation.

Reserves

Their review included a consideration of the nature of the income and expenditure streams, the requirement to match variable income with fixed commitments and a consideration of the nature of the reserves. As a result of this review, it was concluded that, in order to allow the company to be managed efficiently and to ensure sufficient reserves were available to provide uninterrupted services, an unrestricted income fund of at least 3 months of the company's operating costs should be maintained.

In addition, amounts are to be set aside out of reserves in order to ensure funds are available for specific expenditure envisaged in the next financial year if appropriate.

Risk Management

The Trustees have a duty to identify and review the risks to which the Charity is exposed and to ensure appropriate controls are in place to provide reasonable assurance against fraud and error.

The Trustees are satisfied that adequate systems and procedures are in operation to mitigate against the potential impact on the Charity should any of those risks materialise.

Public Benefit

The Trustees have complied with their duty in Section 17 of the Charities Act 2011 to have regard to public benefit guidelines published by the Commission in exercising their powers or duties

1. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

General information and basis of preparation

Moxley Peoples Centre Charity is a company limited by guarantee registered in England and Wales. In the event of the charity being wound up, the liability in respect of the guarantee is limited to £1 per member of the charity. The address of the registered office is given in the charity information on page 1 of these financial statements.

The charity constitutes a public benefit entity as defined by FRS 102. The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Accounting and Reporting Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) issued on 16 July 2014 (as updated through Update Bulletin 1 published on 2 February 2016), the Charities Act 2011, the Companies Act 2006 and UK Generally Accepted Practice as it applies from 1 January 2015.

The charity has applied Update Bulletin 1 as published on 2 February 2016 and does not include a cash flow statement on the grounds that it is applying FRS 102 Section 1A.

The financial statements have been prepared to give a "true and fair" view and have departed from the Charities (Accounts and Reports) Regulations 2008 only to the extent required to provide a "true and fair view". This departure has involved following the Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) issued on 16 July 2014 rather than the Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice effective from 1 April 2005 which has since been withdrawn.

The financial statements are prepared on a going concern basis under the historical cost convention. The financial statements are presented in sterling which is the functional currency of the charity and rounded to the nearest £1.

The significant accounting policies applied in the preparation of these financial statements are set out below. These policies have been consistently applied to all years presented unless otherwise stated.

Funds

Unrestricted funds are available for use at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of the general objectives of the charity and which have not been designated for other purposes.

Restricted funds are funds which are to be used in accordance with specific restrictions imposed by donors or which have been raised by the charity for particular purposes. The cost of raising and administering such funds are charged against the specific fund. The aim and use of each restricted fund is set out in the notes to the financial statements.

1. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES / cont...

Income recognition

All incoming resources are included in the Statement of Financial Activities (SOFA) when the charity is legally entitled to the income after any performance conditions have been met, the amount can be measured reliably and it is probable that the income will be received.

For donations to be recognised the charity will have been notified of the amounts and the settlement date in writing. If there are conditions attached to the donation and this requires a level of performance before entitlement can be obtained then income is deferred until those conditions are fully met or the fulfilment of those conditions is within the control of the charity and it is probable that they will be fulfilled.

No amount is included in the financial statements for volunteer time in line with the SORP (FRS 102).

For legacies, entitlement is the earlier of the charity being notified of an impending distribution or the legacy being received. At this point income is recognised. On occasion legacies will be notified to the charity however it is not possible to measure the amount expected to be distributed. On these occasions the legacy is treated as a contingent asset and disclosed.

Income from government and other grants are recognised at fair value when the charity has entitlement after any performance conditions have been met, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably. If entitlement is not met then these amounts are deferred.

Expenditure recognition

All expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all costs related to the category. Expenditure is recognised where there is a legal or constructive obligation to make payments to third parties, it is probable that the settlement will be required and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably.

Irrecoverable VAT is charged as an expense against the activity for which expenditure arose.

Support costs allocation

Support costs are those that assist the work of the charity but do not directly represent charitable activities and include office costs, governance costs and administrative payroll costs. They are incurred directly in support of expenditure on the objects of the charity. Where support costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to cost of raising funds and expenditure on charitable activities on a basis consistent with use of the resources.

1. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES /cont...

Tangible fixed assets

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation and accumulated impairment losses. Cost includes costs directly attributable to making the asset capable of operating as intended.

Depreciation is provided from the date of acquisition on all tangible fixed assets, at rates calculated to write off the cost, less estimated residual value, of each asset on a systematic basis over its expected useful life as follows:-

Fixtures, fittings and equipment 33% p.a. straight line

Debtors and creditors receivable/payable within one year

Debtors and creditors with no stated interest rate and receivable or payable within one year are recorded at transaction price. Any losses arising from impairment are recognised in expenditure.

Employment benefits

When employees have rendered service to the charity, short-term employee benefits to which the employees are entitled are recognised at the undiscounted amount expected to be paid in exchange for that service.

Tax

The charity is an exempt charity within the meaning of schedule 3 of the Charities Act 2011 and is considered to pass the tests set out in Paragraph 1 Schedule 6 Finance Act 2010 and therefore it meets the definition of a charitable company for UK corporation tax purposes.

Going concern

The financial statements have been prepared on a going concern basis as the trustees believe that no material uncertainties exist. The trustees have considered the level of funds held and the expected level of income and expenditure for 12 months from authorising these financial statements. The budgeted income and expenditure is sufficient with the level of reserves for the charity to be able to continue as a going concern.
