A number of Local Authority contracts are also undertaken, involving the transportation of children and young adults to school and college.

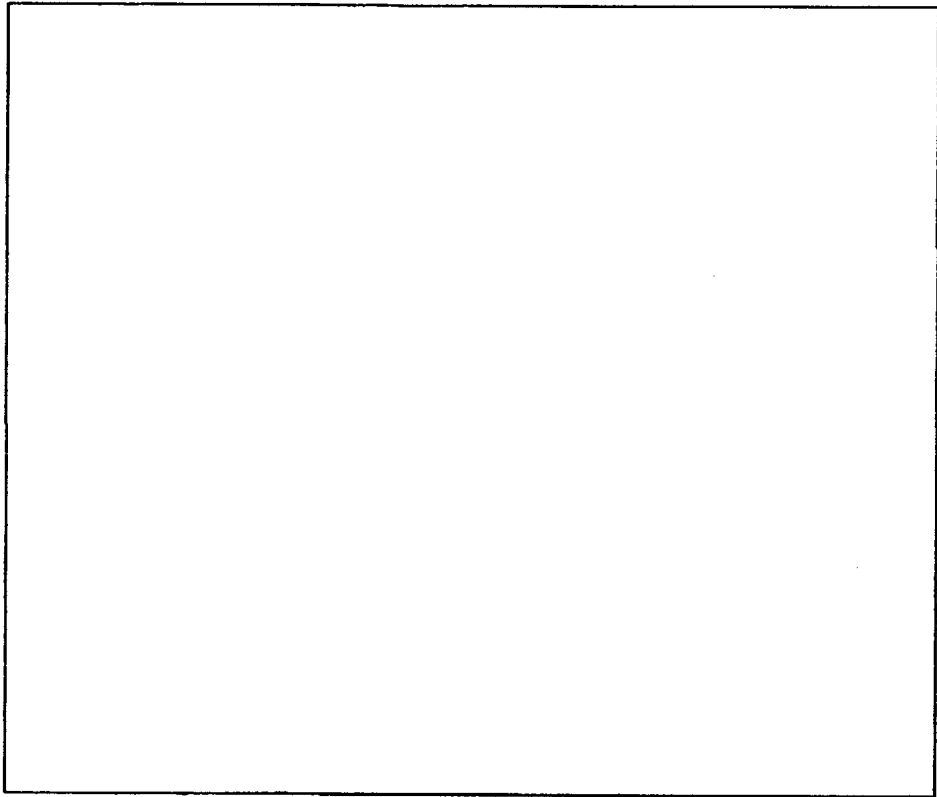


