CHAIRMAN'S REPORT**

It has been a very hard year. Due to significant delays with our old building at 23-25 Broadway and its ongoing restoration, we have lost some of our valuable contacts. With no one to work in the office and a lack of dedicated volunteers willing to oversee all the different parts of the work, the situation has been difficult.

We were very aware that we needed more younger people to carry on the work of the charity, as we, the Trustees, are getting older now and, with some health issues, are finding the work heavy. This being the case, we were so very grateful that, in God's mercy, he brought us Paul Thomas, who consented to be a Trustee in our next financial year and, with his vast experience in IT & Business and faith, is an enormous asset to the Charity. Also, Heather Lewis has joined us, another very gifted and efficient worker, who has already made a big impact.

As our help base increases, we need to get back into speaking at churches, as we did before, to make people aware of the needs. We are finding so many people coming into Rainbow of Hope now to take drugs, which is an increasing problem. That being the case, we are very aware that much more dedicated intercessory prayer is needed. It is very easy to be busy, but without real, heartfelt, Spirit-led prayer, nothing changes. We need a breakthrough! Some years ago, 4 people came to faith here at Rainbow and were actually baptised in our old building. God has not changed. The gospel is still as powerful. We need to seek God. The onus is on us.

A few months ago, we started a meeting with all the volunteers together, where there was freedom to speak from the heart about all aspects of the work at Rainbow. This was followed by a lovely buffet meal. We will continue with these meetings every 3 months.

We are most grateful to Veronica Camilleri for all her dedicated financial work for the charity over many years, and Paul has now found someone to take on this vital work. We are living in hard times in the world today, and we need God more than we have ever needed Him.

RESULTS FOR 2025

Income – Overall decrease over previous year.

Expenditure – Overall increase over previous year, this was mainly due to the rental costs between the two buildings, at 23-25 Broadway and 30-33 Broadway.

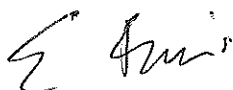

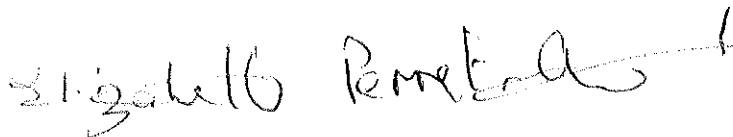

CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

This has actually been quite a disruptive year for Rainbow of Hope. It started out, as usual, with being open on Mondays, Wednesdays, Thursday and Friday and also Tuesday and Saturday evenings. We met for monthly Prayer on first Thursday of the month and the Trustees that were able to also meet on a weekly basis, for Prayer and to discuss the work. The Farsi meetings continued for food and fellowship and their numbers started to increase. The English classes continued on Thursday afternoons, from 2-3-30. We held an Alpha course on Saturdays from 12 -2pm. We had an amazing visit from the Christian Bikers, who shared the Gospel, which was so enjoyed. All the Harley bikes really impressed the men from the hostel across the road. The Hope Rehab Centre also sent a couple of their representatives, who gave an amazing testimony of how they came to Faith and how their lives were wonderfully changed, off all the drugs etc. We had an amazing Christmas get together for all the volunteers, which was held in our building with a great buffet and a very amusing Quiz, and a great time was had by all.

For some considerable time the owners of the building wanted to sell it and it was eventually bought by Green Pastures another charity that has provided homes for the homeless over very many years. This was intended for the mutual benefit of both our charities, helping to provide both homes and sustenance for those in need. On 2nd June the purchase was made and we had an enormous job to clear everything out of the building. Unfortunately it was found to have Asbestos, and so that all had to be dealt with. Then the building was found to be unsafe, as some of the girders were unstable, so this meant that it would be a considerable time before we could get back to normal. We then had to look for an alternative venue, to continue the work. We approached many different Churches, but nothing was forthcoming. We were able to take in food donations and give them out during this time and were able to meet in various homes to continue the office work. Everything needed to go into storage, so we had to find somewhere for that also.

All in all this has been a challenging year, but the work has continued, we were still able to give help where needed and our faithful supporters continued to give financially and with food donations, for which we were most grateful and thank God for their faithfulness. Thankfully by the end of the year, by God's Grace a new temporary venue was found.

This financial year we struggled to get as many consistent volunteers as we would have liked. We continued to open the drop-in every Wednesday evening and also on a Saturday evening. We started a Farsi group for the Iranian people that meet Tuesday fortnightly for food and fellowship.

We started meeting every Thursday evening for prayer and to discuss the Word. Once a month this was open to any church leader who might like to join us to pray for our community which has drug and alcohol problems. The drop-in was open on Monday, Wednesday and Friday for a hot meal and friendship. Every Thursday it opened to the Asylum seekers, who all received a food parcel and enjoyed the singing. The charity shop opened each Monday, Wednesday and Friday and we continued to receive many donations. On Thursday afternoons we held an English class from 2:00pm to 3:30pm. We also started a craft group, which was enjoyed by many. We started renting the upstairs one bedroom flat, as our office.

We are profoundly grateful to every volunteer who selflessly dedicates their time and effort to support our cause. Your hard work and commitment are the backbone of our organization, enabling us to reach out and make a real difference in the lives of those in need. We also extend our deepest thanks to everyone who donates, whether it be funds, resources, or even just a word of encouragement. CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

During the year to 15th October 2022, the pandemic was starting recede, but many still had to come to the centre for food parcels. Unfortunately, due to the Pandemic approximately 200 volunteers who had worked on the Paradise Run decided that they were no longer able to volunteer, many being elderly, others due to health problems. In any case, the Paradise Run had to be stopped during the lockdowns and it was not re-started. Later in the year we began to open on a Wednesday night to replace Paradise Run.

During this financial year we were able to slowly open the centre, as the pandemic had caused much disruption, for the after effects of Covid were still being felt and many were fearful. As we began to get volunteers back in, we opened the centre 3 mornings, Mondays, Wednesdays, and Thursdays, for a lunchtime meal. We continued to give out many food parcels in the centre and kept deliveries going with parcels to the homes of those who were not able to come in.

The English classes started back later in the year as soon as people felt able to attend.

The charity shop reopened much to everyone's delight, and we had many donations of clothing and bric-a-brac, etc. as during the pandemic we were not able to accept donations due to infection safety measures.

The Thursday asylum seekers came back straight away with approximately 30-35 each week coming in, hearing the Gospel message, receiving lunch, and each given a food parcel.

A group of us began to meet every Thursday evening for Prayer and discussion of the work.

We are very grateful to all our supporters and volunteers for their continued support.

Income – Overall slight increase over previous year.

Expenditure – Overall slight decrease over previous year, this was mainly due to our food costs were down on the previous year.

The work of Rainbow of Hope changed during the course of the pandemic. Whilst the Paradise Run had stopped at the start of the pandemic we continued to provide food parcels. When circumstances allowed and as lockdown eased we were able to open our centre on Broadway to offer meals and to carry on with providing support in ways permitted under the circumstances.

Our volunteers were amazing, they carried on throughout, never grumbling but quietly getting on with whatever was needed and always smiling and cheerful. To meet with the demand food parcels were delivered seven days a week and sometimes into the evenings to cope with the increased demand.

It was a very emotional time as our volunteers found it hard to drop off food parcels and walk away without the normal human interactions.

We are very grateful to all our supporters and volunteers as well the supermarkets and Churches for their continued support.

CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

From the beginning of the financial year until March 2020 the work continued without any major problems. The Paradise Run continued to operate nightly and the centre continued to be open 5½ days a week for fellowship meals, praying and sharing of the gospel. The English language classes continued to meet on a Wednesday despite one of the teachers having moved away. We also started a Wednesday Fellowship group and a monthly Sunday service.

When the first lockdown started the Paradise Run had to be stopped and it was decided to try and support as many people as possible in their own homes/places they were being accommodated due to the pandemic. The centre closed to the public and instead we had volunteers sorting out the food donations and packing food parcels. We also had many other volunteers delivering the food parcels. This took place on five days a week and approximately 200-250 parcels were delivered each week. Many were delivered to asylum seeker families of four or five people; others were people whose benefit payments had stopped or those in shared housing belonging to the hostels for those who were homeless.

We are very grateful to all the supermarkets who have been donating food to us. We are also grateful to the Churches who have also collected food and provided volunteers and donations to help us to continue with our work.

We are also grateful to all our amazing supporters and volunteers who make this work possible.

We give all praise and glory to God.
