Within the academic year, grants of £17,858 have been made to Stanley Primary School to support projects including furnishing refurbished classrooms, preparing outdoor areas to expand outdoor play space, providing book bags to Reception families, trikes for Pre-school children, upkeep and maintenance of an outdoor living classroom area, donation to year 6 residential trip and leavers activities.


