Reserves of £27,695 (2024- £52,378) represent the available funds at the year end. The present level of funding meets the charity's reserve policy to ensure that there is adequate income to support the continuation of the charity's activities.

Responsibilities of the Trustees

Company Law requires the trustees, who are also directors, to prepare a report and financial statements for each financial period which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the charitable company at the end of the year. 2. The accounts do not accord with those records; or
