The Mount Moriah Trust is a Christian Charity providing relief from hardship and suffering for believers in Jesus Christ in Israel, Gaza and the West Bank. Every penny donated goes to the needy – nothing is taken out. Administration, operational costs, travel and expenses are all funded privately. MMT operates with due regard to the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit but does not operate a reserves policy as there are no staff, overheads or operational costs.

The war with Hamas in Gaza, involving thousands of reservists being called up, has had a severe impact on family life and has created financial hardship for many. Many small businesses have gone to the wall. Arab Christians in Judea and Samarea (the West Bank) have suffered through the withdrawal of permits to work inside Israel. Iranian missiles inflicted considerable damage and around 10,000 people have been left homeless. The Christians in Gaza have been sheltering in two church compounds but have managed to do extraordinary work to feed thousands of people each week. We have been privileged to provide funds to support them and their outreach.

MMT's primary focus remains on providing humanitarian support to the needy, particularly the elderly, widows, the sick, single mothers, children, the youth and new immigrants. We have partnerships with around forty Pastors, Congregations and Christian Organisations. The Lord has touched hearts across the world to give generously and we have been able to provide significant help through our partners.

We continue to receive amazing support from overseas and this year 52% of our income originated from outside the UK. Income this year was £180,714 and gifting to the Land was £175,420. We carry a healthy balance of £26,299 into FY25/26. The Administration & Projects account, which is funded privately and not taken from donations, carried forward a balance of £54.

Every penny donated goes to the needy – nothing is taken out. Administration, operational costs, travel and expenses are all funded privately. MMT operates with due regard to the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit but does not operate a reserves policy as there are no staff, overheads or operational costs.

The evil massacre by Hamas of 1,200 Israelis in towns and villages along the Gaza border on October 7<sup>th</sup> 2023 plunged Israel into war with Hamas in Gaza and Hezbollah in Lebanon. Over 150,000 people had to leave their homes to escape the rocket and missile fire. Immediately, 360,000 reservists were called up for service in the Israeli Defence Force (IDF) and tourism, which had been booming, came to a sudden end causing mass unemployment.

MMT's primary focus remains on providing humanitarian support to the needy, particularly the elderly, widows, the sick, single mothers, children, the youth and new immigrants. We have partnerships with around forty Pastors, Congregations and Christian Organisations. The Lord has touched hearts across the world to provide extra funds for MMT to be able to respond to the increased needs of His people during this time of war. We are blessed to have been able to provide, through our partner pastors, food and other necessities to everyone including the Christians in Gaza sheltering in two Church compounds in northern Gaza.

This amazing response to the crisis has resulted in record levels of income and gifting to the Land. Incoming donations amounted to £208,544 including £91,297 (44%) from overseas This enabled us to provide outgoing gifting of £220,560. We carry a healthy balance of £21,161 into FY24/25. The Administration & Projects account, which is funded privately and not taken from donations, carried forward a balance of £375.

Praise the Lord, the economic situation in the Holy Land improved as tourists started to return and people were able to get back to work. However, some businesses, hotels and restaurants never reopened.

MMT's primary focus remains on providing humanitarian support to the needy, particularly the elderly, widows, the sick, single mothers, children, the youth and new immigrants. We have partnerships with around forty Pastors, Congregations and Christian Organisations.

For the first time since Covid, we were able to visit Israel in October/November 2022 to review and revise our programmes with each of the partners. This was followed by a January/February 2023 visit to Australia and Singapore to update our supporters. We were blessed to be able to visit, not only existing partners, but also a number of new churches and widen the support for God's work. We were rewarded with a substantial boost to MMT's finances.

This financial year has seen MMT pass a significant milestone – the Lord has used MMT to channel over £2 million to those in need in His Land.

This has been another strong year. Incoming donations amounted to £170,395 including £107,743 (63%) from overseas This enabled us to provide outgoing gifting of £153,060. We carry a healthy balance of £33,347 into FY23/24. The Administration & Projects account, which is funded privately and not taken from donations, carried forward a balance of £202.

The Mount Moriah Trust, founded in 2002, is a Christian Charity providing relief from hardship and suffering for believers in Jesus Christ in Israel, Gaza and the West Bank. Every penny donated goes to the needy – nothing is taken out. Administration, operational costs, travel and expenses are all funded privately. MMT operates with due regard to the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit but does not operate a reserves policy as there are no staff, overheads or operational costs.

The effects of the COVID pandemic pushed the number of families in Israel living in poverty to 932,000 by December 2021 which translates to over 2.5 million people including 1.1 million children. Israel is the developed country with the largest gap between rich and poor according to the OECD. The situation has improved since travel and tourism recommenced early in 2022 but many tourism related businesses including hotels, restaurants and tour companies which closed during the pandemic have not reopened.

MMT's focus remains on providing humanitarian support to the needy, particularly the elderly, widows, the sick, single mothers, children, the youth and new immigrants. We have increased the number of Fellowships that we support and have started a new partnership with the International Christian Embassy in Jerusalem (ICEJ) to sponsor 8 children in orphanages, providing for their everyday needs. We have continued to support needy Arab Christians in Gaza and the West Bank and to provide food coupons for refugees in Jordan in partnership with Christian Mission to Gaza.

God has continued to touch hearts across the world to give very generously and we have received some amazing one-off gifts during the year. These have enabled us to increase the value of our gifts to offset the increase in poverty.

This has been another record year for donations and gifting. Incoming donations of £199,093 (up 16% on FY20/21) together with our substantial balance carried forward of £28,425, enabled us to provide outgoing gifting of £208,560 (up 46% on FY20/21) leaving a balance of £16,719 to be carried forward into FY22/23. The Administration & Projects account which is funded privately and not taken from donations, carried forward a balance of £300.16.

We continue to enjoy strong support from overseas especially Australia, Singapore, USA and Sri Lanka.

## Annual Report for the year ended 31 May 2021

The Mount Moriah Trust is constituted by Deed of Trust and was first registered on 28<sup>th</sup> May 2002. The charity trustees during the year to 31<sup>st</sup> May 2021 were:

The Mount Moriah Trust, founded in 2002, is a Christian Charity providing relief from hardship and suffering for believers in Jesus Christ in Israel, Gaza and the West Bank. Every penny donated goes to the needy – nothing is taken out. Administration, operational costs, travel and expenses are all funded privately. MMT operates with due regard to the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit but does not operate a reserves policy as there are no staff, overheads or operational costs.

The COVID pandemic and the shutdown of the tourism sector meant that during 2020 an additional 268,000 families in Israel were pushed into poverty bringing the total to 850,000 families living below the poverty line. 38.6% of the population were living in economic distress including 1 million children and over 180,000 elderly. Israel is the developed country with the largest gap between rich and poor according to the OECD. The situation could have been worse had the Israeli government not extended and increased unemployment benefits but many were unable to claim this as their companies placed them on unpaid leave rather than making them redundant. The Christian Arab community throughout the Holy Land have been very badly affected.

MMT's focus remains on helping the needy, particularly the elderly, widows, the sick, single mothers, children, youth and new immigrants. Our help has extended to providing food coupons for Syrian Christian refugee families in Jordan during these especially difficult times.

In response to the increased need, God touched hearts across the world to give more generously both through regular giving and some amazing one-off gifts. In November we were able to increase our help to the needy by 20% and three months later by another 20%. Our incoming donations and outgoing gifting reached record levels at £170,987 and £143,168 respectively and a balance of £28,425 has been carried forward into FY21/22. The Administration & Projects Account carried forward a balance of £308.02.

We are so blessed to have the generous support of our overseas partners, 63% of our income this year was received from overseas - Australia, Singapore, USA and Sri Lanka in particular.

**Independent examiner's statement**


