Report of the Trustees

The trustees present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31st December 2022. The trustees have adopted the provisions of the Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities' issued in March 2005.

Constitution of the Charity

The Foundation is regulated by Articles of Constitution, which were submitted to the Charity Commission on 3rd August 2001. The Foundation became a registered charity on 16th July 2002, Charity Registration number 1092974.

Objects of the Charity

The furtherance of the Christian faith and the understanding of the Word of God (the Bible) to all people. With regard to the following principal areas of support:

- a) Support of Christian workers who are engaged in the historical biblical, Christian faith and occupied either full time or part time in either missionary or local work.
- b) Support for literature and other media projects.

Relief of poverty, sickness and distress of people within Christian Communities through:

- c) Support for projects such as church building, medical, educational, care for the elderly and conferences.
- d) Supply relief for people in need due to natural disasters, poverty or persecution with special consideration for Christian communities but not solely restricted to such.

These objects have been approved after consultation with the Charity Commission.

Policies & Governance of the Charity

The Charity employs no staff and all work is carried out on a voluntary basis. The Trustees hold regular meetings as necessary for the purpose of considering the needs of the work and for agreeing the distribution of funds. Reserves are only created for short term needs. No specific policy to build reserves exists. Funds are received by way of gifts and are allocated at the discretion of the trustees unless the donor specifies the purpose of the gift which must be in accordance with the objects stated above.

Appointment of any future Trustees shall be by resolution passed at a special meeting called for the purpose. Any new Trustee has to be able by either personal or professional qualifications to make a "contribution to the pursuit of the objects or management of the Charity". Should there be a default in this power the statutory power to appoint a Trustee will be exercisable.

Report of the Trustees

Review of the Activities of the Charity

The general income fund is made up of all gifts received plus deposit interest. The total for the year ended 31st December 2022 amounted to £73,684. The specific fund received donations of £41,535.

The Foundation made gifts of £94,499, of which £32,835 were made for specific purposes. The fluctuation of gifts made reflects the differing requests for assistance in spreading the Word of God.

The Foundation magazine continued during the year and incurred costs of £3,675.

The Foundation maintains one central fund including the specific funds with donations being paid to specific parties as required by the donors.

This year the general fund shows an increase of £6,564 in the balance. The specific fund has increased by £8,700 with the remaining funds distributable in the next year.

Independent Examiner's Report
to the Trustees of UK Foundation for Christian Service

I report on the accounts for the year ended 31 December 2022 set out on pages five to seven.

Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner

The charity's trustees are responsible for the preparation of the accounts. The charity's trustees consider that an audit is not required for this year (under Section 144(2) of the Charities Act 2011 (the 2011 Act)) and that an independent examination is required. It is my responsibility to:

The procedures undertaken do not provide all the evidence that would be required in an audit, and consequently no opinion is given as to whether the accounts present a 'true and fair view' and the report is limited to those matters set out in the statements below.

Notes for the Accounts

1. Accounting Policies

Accounting convention

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, with the exception of investments which are included at market value, as modified by the revaluation of certain assets and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008), the Charities Act 2011 and the requirements of the Statement of Recommended Practice, Accounting and Reporting by Charities

2. Employees Remuneration
