The generous donations received this year have enabled us to provide much needed support and relief to the poverty-stricken people of Bangladesh.

Our primary focus is to provide relief through the distribution and assistance of food, skills, education, medical and social support for poor families.

This year we have also provided specific support for the poor due to very bad flooded conditions and have further supported cancer patients in Bangladesh.

We also, where possible, provide sustainable support for the poor by enabling them with resources and support to enable them to be self-sufficient.

Food

The charity provided a regular provision of food supplies to several villages and sponsored roughly 50 families all year round. During Ramadan 500 families were given food for the entire month.

Medical

We funded 33 life changing operations, which included removal of Tumors / Breast cancer / Hemorrhoids operation / cataract operations

Essentials

We have built 13 new homes & repaired / re-built homes by supplying materials, built 8 tube wells, providing much needed access to safe drinking water.

Roughly 800 items of clothing were distributed.

Education

Supporting children with books / clothes & school fee's

Extras

- Provided support for orphan children with Clothes / food etc
- We additionally promoted self-sufficiency by providing tools and cows for farming and cultivation
- Through the winter we provided warm clothing and distributed blankets for the needy
- Due to COVID we helped families with food & essentials
- During the recent floods in 2021 we provided aid to flood affected areas, which included food, medicine, and clean water.
