Save The Orphans Please - International Trustees' Report For the year ended 31 October 2021

The trustees of Save The Orphans Please - International present their report for the year ended 31st October 2021, together with the charity accounts.

The accounts and categories used are in line with the revised SORP (Statement of Recommended Practice revised 2015) and the summary is shown in the Statement of Receipts and Payments. Costs have been allocated directly where appropriate and duly apportioned where they cover more than one category; the notes to the accounts provide more details.

This Trustees' Report is not only to fulfil the legal and statutory requirements, but it is intended to explain the activities and future plans of this charity.

Structure, governance and management of Save The Orphans Please - International

The members of the charity are its Trustees, who are appointed by the Trustee body in accordance with the constitution, and who are responsible for the management of the charity.

Objectives, Activities and Public Benefit

The principal objectives of the charity are a) to provide relief of poverty, sickness and distress of orphans resulting from the effects of war, famine and other natural or man-made disasters world-wide, and b) the education of orphans up to 21 years of age.

In order to achieve these objectives, the Trustees are a) arranging and supervising the erection of facilities for the accommodation and education of orphans in India, b) responding to the needs of orphans in other parts of the world and c) raising monthly child sponsorships and remitting them to orphanages in which the sponsored children are housed.

Review of Activities

During the period November 2020 to October 2021 only a few of projects were carried out. This was mainly due to the pandemic. Restrictions were not lifted until the spring of 2021. The construction of the Girls dormitory at the BESSO Children's Home having been completed in October 2020 needed to be painted. This was carried out and the girls occupied the dormitory after the building was inaugurated in January 2021.

Due to the restrictions of the pandemic the charity did not organise Humanitarian Trips abroad to work on projects. However, instead of the humanitarian trips, STOP International supported a few projects financially. The support began in November 2020 with Christmas monetary gifts to all the Children in the five homes, either by MoneyGram transfer or by bank cheques. In addition to Christmas gifts, sponsorships were also sent to the homes by these channels during the period of this financial year. In May 2021 STOP International sponsored the building of classrooms and the digging of a bore well for the Sunshine Orchard Orphanage in Thailand. This was a major project which took several months to complete. The project was not completed in this financial year, but it is hoped that it will be finished early in the next financial year. The staff and 92 orphan children of the Sunshine Orchard Orphanage will be blessed by this new facility. In September 2021 STOP International received a request from Deafway, a UK registered charity, who were raising funds for St Anthony School in Uganda for deaf children. These funds would pay for education materials as well as shoes and toiletries.

The Charity continued to provide financial support through the reporting year, with the help of generous sponsors, to The BESSO Children's Home, Blessing Home, Love Home, The Way To Life Children's Home and the Captain Azariah Children's Home.

Public Benefit

In considering their strategies and exercising their duties, the Trustees have complied with their duty to have due regard to the guidance on public benefit published by the Charity Commission.

Fund-raising activities

The Covid restriction were still in place for the first half of the reporting year. As a result our fundraising activities ceased for the period of the reporting year.

However, the kind supporters of the Charity continued to make generous donations to make it possible to fulfil the objectives of the Charity. In addition, our regular sponsors continued their financial support to help care for the welfare of the orphans, for which we are profoundly grateful.

Financial Review

The trustees consider that a minimal level of general reserves is needed, since the Charity has few ongoing core costs, and projects are only undertaken when sufficient funds have been built up. At 31 October 2021, the unrestricted project funds amounted to £27,000 (2020: £59,000).

Future developments

The approach road at the Vocational training Centre Campus including drainage is desperately needed and is the major project pending.

The building which accommodates the Way To Life children needs to be painted internally and externally. This is being planned for but has been delayed due to a leaky roof. The roof repair of the boys dormitory needs to be carried out before the painting is done. Also, maintenance work needs to be carried out to the building.

For the security of the orphan girls a wall needs to be built around the girl's dormitory block of the Way to Life home.

A new accommodation for the boys of the Blessing Home is needed and discussion for this project is to be carried out to help raise funds to facilitate this. This is pending from the previous reporting year.

An action has been passed by the STOP Board to construct a kitchen and dining hall for the Love Children's Home.

A sign needs to be painted on the front of the Vocational Training Campus as per the regulations for local charities.

Some of the future plans mentioned in the previous review of activities could not be carried out during this reporting year due to the restrictions imposed by the pandemic.

However, the work of the charity has progressed steadily with Divine providence which is without a doubt a blessing to all.



1 Accounting Policies

Basis of preparation

The accounts have been prepared on a receipts and payments basis, as allowed for smaller charities.

Fund accounting

Restricted funds are those which are to be used for the specified purposes as laid down by the donor. Expenditure which meets these criteria is allocated to the appropriate fund.

Unrestricted funds are donations and other income received or generated for the furtherance of the objectives of the charity without specified purposes and, therefore, are available as general funds.

Risk mitigation

The charity's trustees have given consideration to the major risks to which the charity is exposed and have established systems or procedures to manage those risks.
