**Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year**

**1st April 2024 to 31st March 2025**

We employ two researchers/lecturers, Paul Garner – PG (full time) and Dr Stephen Lloyd – SL (also now full time), as well as Matthew Pickhaver (MP) as our Communications Manager (part time). An associate researcher, Dr William Worraker (WW), is supported but not employed by the charity. We summarise our main activities below.

**Study centre.**

In this reporting period we launched our “Cambridge House” project, with the long-term goal of establishing a residential study centre in the heart of Cambridge, as a base for research and outreach. In May 2024, SL and PG were interviewed about the project on Christian TV. In September, SL relocated to Cambridge to lead the project and is now employed full time by the charity. In February, SL and PG began a series of student meetings that will be held regularly during term times and we continued to support other students in a mentoring capacity. MP represented the charity at an educational conference in April 2024.

**Speaking engagements.**

Between April 2024 and March 2025 PG, SL and MP gave about 30 talks, lectures and seminars. These meetings included church services, public events, training seminars and conferences. In June, PG was invited to address the West Sussex Geological Society and in August PG and SL spoke to about 140 students at a summer school in Staffordshire. In July PG was invited to participate in a private dialogue with other academics in Dayton, Tennessee, which culminated in a public event chaired by PG. In March 2025, SL was one of the main speakers at a public conference in Springfield, Massachusetts.

**Online outreach and media.**

The audience for our fortnightly podcast, co-hosted by PG and Dr Todd Wood, continued to grow. By March 2025, we had released more than 100 episodes and reached about 2,900 subscribers on

YouTube, with a similar number on other streaming platforms. PG and SL were also interviewed by a number of other podcasters. By the end of the reporting period, our own YouTube channel had about 780 subscribers and our Facebook page about 950 followers. We also maintained an active social media presence on X. We continued to communicate regularly with supporters by way of a newsletter issued three times a year alongside an email update, moving from a monthly to twice-monthly schedule.

### Research.

WW continued to receive support from our organisation for his work on a quantitative geophysics project, and is working on further papers for publication. In July, PG attended two academic conferences in the USA, giving a plenary talk at one of them. In September he also participated in a geoscience conference in Reims, France, giving one of the keynote talks. He was also editor and reviewer for a number of conference abstracts, papers and scholarly manuscripts throughout the year.

### Other activities.

Editorial work continued on submissions to our own open-access online journal with the second paper of the fifth volume published in May 2024. We also contributed articles to other publications and released a new educational resource in the form of an interpretive geological column chart. PG and SL continued work on a major book project, with a contract signed with a major publishing house.




An associate researcher, Dr William Worraker (WW), is supported but not employed by the charity. We summarise our main activities below.

**Speaking engagements.** From April 2023 to March 2024 PG, SL and MP gave over 30 talks, lectures and seminars. These meetings included church services, public events, training seminars, conferences, and youth meetings. In August, PG and SL spoke to more than 100 students and young people at a summer school in Staffordshire and, in September, they participated in a scholarly symposium in Rome, Italy, at the invitation of the St Basil Institute for the Study of the Theology of Creation. In December, SL gave a series of lectures to students at London Seminary.

**Online outreach and media.** The audience for our fortnightly podcast, co-hosted by PG and Dr Todd Wood, continued to grow. By March 2024, we had released 78 episodes and had reached about 2,250 subscribers on YouTube, as well as a similar number on other streaming platforms. PG and SL were interviewed on a number of other podcasts and PG also featured in two episodes of the TV programme 'Digging for Truth'. By the end of the reporting period our own YouTube channel had about 660 subscribers and our Facebook page about 870 followers. We also maintained an active social media presence on Twitter. We continued to communicate regularly with supporters by way of a newsletter issued three times a year alongside a monthly email update.

**Research.** WW continued to receive support from our organisation for his work on a quantitative geophysics project, and in May 2023 published a fourth paper based on his research. In July, PG with co-authors presented two research papers at an international conference in the USA, one comparing the order of branching in published phylogenies with the order of fossil appearances and the other a quantitative analysis of a large geochronological database. Both studies were published in the conference proceedings. He also served as an editor for the conference and participated at the meeting in a scholarly roundtable discussion with a number of other scientists. In September, PG also participated in a geoscience conference in Germany, giving one of the keynote talks. He was an expert reviewer for a number of other abstracts, papers and scholarly manuscripts throughout the year.

**Other activities.** Editorial work continued on submissions to our own open-access online journal with the first paper of the fifth volume published in February 2024. We also contributed articles to other publications. PG and SL continued their work on a major book project, with a contract signed with a publishing house. We continued to support students in a mentoring capacity and work was begun on plans to establish a residential study centre in Cambridge.






**1 April 2022 to 31 March 2023**

We employ two researchers/lecturers, Paul Garner – PG (full time) and Dr Stephen Lloyd – SL (part time), as well as Matthew Pickhaver (MP) as our Communications Manager (part time). An associate researcher, Dr William Worraker (WW), is supported but not employed by the charity. We summarise our main activities below.

**Speaking engagements.** From April 2022 to March 2023 PG, SL and MP gave around 30 talks, lectures and seminars. Some of these were delivered online but most were in-person meetings, including church services, public meetings, training seminars, conferences, and youth events. In April, PG gave an online lecture about his geological research to students at Truett McConnell University in Georgia, USA, and in September, PG and SL spoke to more than 100 students and young people at a summer school in Staffordshire. In December, PG gave a live-streamed lecture and Q&A session about the Dutch translation of his book for the publisher in the Netherlands.

**Online outreach and media.** By the end of the reporting period our YouTube channel had almost 600 subscribers and our Facebook page almost 800 followers. We also maintained an active social media presence on Twitter. The audience for our fortnightly podcast, co-hosted by PG and Dr Todd Wood, continued to grow. By March 2023, we had released 55 episodes and had gained about 1,600 subscribers on YouTube, as well as hundreds more on other streaming platforms. PG was interviewed on a couple of other podcasts and also featured in an educational video about an ice age site near St Louis, Missouri. We continued to communicate regularly with supporters by way of a newsletter issued three times a year alongside a monthly email update.

**Research.** WW continued to receive support from our organisation for his work on a quantitative geophysics project, and a fourth paper based on his research was completed and submitted for expert peer review. PG continued to work with colleagues and students on two research projects, one comparing the order of branching in published phylogenies with the order of fossil appearances, the other a quantitative analysis of a large geochronological database. PG and WW served as expert reviewers for a number of other abstracts, papers and research proposals throughout the year.

**Other activities.** Editorial work continued on submissions to our own open-access online journal with the fourth volume being published in November 2022. We also contributed articles to other publications. PG's latest book was translated into Dutch and published in the Netherlands in November 2022. Both PG and SL continued to work on other ongoing book projects. We also continued to support students in a mentoring capacity.

We employ two researchers/lecturers, Paul Garner – PG (full time) and Dr Stephen Lloyd – SL (part time), as well as Matthew Pickhaver (MP) as our Communications Manager (part time). An associate researcher, Dr William Worraker (WW), is supported but not employed by the charity. We summarise our main activities below.

**Speaking engagements.** From April 2021 to March 2022 PG, SL and MP delivered around 30 talks and lectures. The number of “in-person” speaking engagements started to pick up with the easing of covid restrictions, although some continued to take place online. They spoke at public meetings, conferences, church services, training seminars, theological colleges and youth events. Among the engagements were talks at a student conference attended by about 80 young people and lectures to theological students at a London-based seminary. Other meetings took place in Yorkshire, Lancashire, Worcestershire, the Midlands, Cambridgeshire, Suffolk and Kent. PG also recorded talks for a virtual meeting being hosted in the Netherlands and two conferences taking place in the USA.

**Online outreach and media.** We continued to post videos to our YouTube channel, which by the end of the reporting period had about 500 subscribers and had received about 20,000 views. The audience for our fortnightly podcast, co-hosted by PG and Dr Todd Wood, has also continued to grow. By March 2022, we had released about 30 episodes and had gained about 850 subscribers on YouTube. The podcast is also available on several other streaming platforms. SL was interviewed twice for TalkRadio, in May and July 2021, and in January 2022 PG recorded an interview with an independent production company for a forthcoming documentary. We continued to communicate regularly with supporters by way of a newsletter issued three times a year alongside a monthly email update. We also maintained an active social media presence on Facebook and Twitter.

**Research.** WW continued to receive support from our organisation for his work on a quantitative geophysics project, with the fourth in a series of peer-reviewed papers based on this research nearing completion. PG worked on three research projects, with research assistance from students. One is a comparison of the order of branching in published phylogenies with the order of fossil appearances, another is a morphological study of fossil horses, and the third is a statistical analysis of a large geochronological database. We hope to publish peer-reviewed papers reporting the results of these research projects in 2023. PG and WW acted as reviewers for a number of other academic papers and conference abstracts throughout the year.

**Other activities.** Editorial work continued on submissions to our own open-access online journal and the third volume was published in November 2021. We also contributed articles to a number of other print and online publications. A new book by PG, a large-format, full-colour hardback with over 200 watercolour illustrations, was published in the USA (in December 2021) and UK (in January 2022). Both PG and SL are working on other book projects. We have also continued to support students in a mentoring capacity.

**April 2020 to March 2021**

We employ two researchers/lecturers, Paul Garner – PG (full time) and Dr Stephen Lloyd – SL (part time), as well as Matthew Pickhaver (MP) as our Communications Manager (part time). An associate researcher, Dr William Worraker (WW), is supported but not employed by the charity. This report covers the period of the national covid lockdown, which had a significant impact on our activities, though none of our staff needed to be furloughed. We summarise our main activities below.

**Speaking engagements.** Apart from a few meetings before the lockdown was imposed, all in-person engagements were cancelled or moved online. Cancellations included a conference at a theological seminary in Warsaw, Poland; a geological conference in Germany; and a regional meeting for supporters of our work in East Anglia. We hope to re-schedule these events. Among the online meetings that took place during the report period, SL delivered lectures to students at a British theological college; PG and MP gave several talks to a group in Cambridge; and PG gave talks to groups in Peterborough, Newark and Norwich. In July 2020, PG recorded a plenary lecture for Origins, an academic conference for scientists and other scholars, which was held online for the first time in its history. In September 2020, PG and SL were invited to give talks to an online summer school for students, with about 50 in attendance. In November 2020, PG, SL and MP recorded talks for an online conference hosted by Core Academy of Science in the USA, with proceeds going to a student support fund. PG also recorded lectures for an online conference in the Netherlands hosted in February 2021 by the Logos Institute.

**Online outreach.** During the lockdown, we extended our online outreach in other significant ways. We established a YouTube channel, where we have posted a range of recorded talks, interviews and other items. At the beginning of March 2021, we launched a new fortnightly podcast, with PG as one of the hosts alongside Dr Todd Wood of Core Academy of Science. The podcast is freely available on all the usual streaming platforms, as well as YouTube, and is attracting a growing and appreciative audience.

**Research.** WW continued to receive support from our organisation for his work on a quantitative geophysics project. The third in a series of peer-reviewed papers based on this research was published in August 2020, and others are in preparation. PG began work on a research project looking at patterns in the fossil record, including co-supervising an undergraduate doing a pilot study. PG acted as reviewer for a number of other academic papers and conference abstracts throughout the year.

**Other activities.** We contributed articles to a number of print and online publications, including a paper by SL in the British theological journal, 'Foundations'. Editorial work continued on submissions to our own open-access online journal and the second volume was published in August 2020. In addition, we published a UK edition of a new booklet written by Dr Todd Wood. Both PG and SL worked on book projects, with publication of PG's new book anticipated in late 2021. Preliminary meetings about cataloguing and classifying our library collections took place in March 2020 with members of CLIS (Christians in Library and Information Services). However, plans to do the work were put on hold when the lockdown was announced. We have continued to support students in a mentoring capacity online. We maintained an active social media presence on Facebook and Twitter..
