Para 1.20	Ongoing Human Elephant Conflict Programme Development, Kenya Our partner Born Free continued to roll out the human elephant conflict programme developed by No Strings in the previous reporting period in the Kenyan Amboseli and Menu National Parks. This followed successful delivery of a training to 25 staff working in the parks the previous year, and the use of giant, multi-operator elephant puppets for use by community members with an objective of creating knowledge, attitude and behaviour change among farming and pastoral communities living adjacent to the parks whose safety and livelihoods are impacted by elephant encroachment into farming and village areas. A key focus has been attitude change, along with crisis reduction responses that de-escalate potentially dangerous elephant responses when the animals are present. Roll-out of the tools has been ongoing throughout the period. Born Free has worked with an independent specialist to monitor and evaluate the project, with research ongoing. No Strings conducted informal interviews with lead education staff on the ground to understand and support with potential issues affecting impact and guide effective delivery. Born Free continue to collect data for an overall understanding of effectiveness. Ongoing: Handwashing with Soap in Schools, Nairobi, Kenya No Strings' project to increase rates of handwashing with soap in schools in Nairobi, Kenya, has been ongoing. The programme was initially introduced in 2021 and research findings over the period revealed that soap making practices in schools were continuing and systems in classrooms to support hand washing practices before school lunches were active and effective. Northumbria University, who we partnered with on research design, were successful in winning a £1million award based on sharing of how the programme was conducted and evaluated. Ongoing: Zimbabwe WASH Films Development Rollout of short films created by No Strings in part-

		nership with Save the Children Zimbabwe has been ongoing. The films are designed to increase behaviours relating to hand washing with soap after using the latrine, and before eating. The films aim to appeal to both adults and children as target audiences, and are disseminated through social media. November 2023 and Ongoing: Psychosocial Support Programme, Rohingya in Bangladesh Working in partnership with Catholic Relief Services, CRS, and Caritas Bangladesh, CB, No Strings delivered a two-week training in Cox's Bazaar, Bangladesh, for facilitators working directly in Kutapalong Camp with Rohingya refugee children. This followed previous trainings that were delivered to CB staff in the months preceding the Covid lockdowns. The 10-session programme is supported with tools that include large numbers of frog hand puppets and facilitator manual, along with our Butterfly and Corner Frog films that were made especially for this response. The programme focuses on psychosocial wellbeing and social and emotional learning. A small team of CB facilitators were established to oversee the programme as their sole duty, and support staff working directly with children in camp community facilities. Over the period, staff reported that children were engaging enthusiastically with the different activities and were able to record positive changes in both behaviour and attitudes according to research design indicators. Ongoing: Afghanistan Meetings with our Afghan partner OMAR, the Organisation for Mine Clearance and Afghan Rehabilitation, have continued over this period to understand how they have been able to continue rollout of our landmine awareness given additional pressure resulting from the change in government regime. Discussions also centred on how they might avail of social media to widen their dissemination, and to possibly include additional films focusing on health. Ongoing: Madagascar Partnering with CRS, dissemination of numerous No Strings programmes has continued, including Nutrition, Malaria, WASH and Disaster Risk Reduction. No Strings has worked with CRS remotely to understand and support with dissemination best practice. Ongoing: Middle East Our two films-based programmes continued to reach communities affected by conflict in the region, including children in Syria and Iraq, as well as refugee communities in Turkey, Jordan and Lebanon.

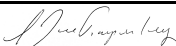

Para 1.20	Note on Coronavirus Pandemic Having completed the Bangladesh psychosocial support training side of the programme in March 2020 in partnership with CRS / Caritas Bangladesh, the lockdowns and travel disruptions for the whole of this period necessitated in No Strings working solely from the UK office. Along with the project work outlined below, time was dedicated to strengthening ongoing partnerships with international organisations and developing relationships with additional organisations that will allow us to significantly scale programming into the future. June / July / August 2020: Coronavirus Hand Washing Song Video Development No Strings worked with a number of organisations to support country-wide level efforts to limit coronavirus infection through hand washing with soap (HWWS). We were able to adapt the existing HWWS song and video with specific messages around Covid 19. The song was dubbed into Shona for use in Zimbabwe, working with Save the Children, and into Creole for use in Haiti through a partnership with Population Media Center. The film and song were aired on prime time TV and numerous local radio stations, and widely circulated through established WhatsApp groups. No Strings was able to donate all services. June / July / August 2020: Completion of PSS Training Manuals, Rohingya Project, Bangladesh An extensive training document was created to support the ongoing rollout of the Butterfly and Frog psychosocial support programmes in Cox's Bazar, Bangladesh. The document outlines ten 90-minute sessions for each of the film projects, which focus on improving the wellbeing of Rohingya children and teenage boys and girls living in the camp.

Para 1.20	September 2020: Additional Training Proposal Submissions, Rohingya Project, Bangladesh Additional proposals were completed with our partners in Bangladesh to continue the training programme once the situation allows. Ongoing throughout Period: Handwashing with Soap Programme, Nairobi, Kenya While schools in the Kawangware district where much of our previous programming were closed over chunks of time during this year, we were able to keep abreast of progress with the systems and practices we had established with our school partners there while children were in class. From discussions with staff it would appear that both are still going strong with the majority of children handwashing with soap in school before lunch and after latrine use. Soap making practices continued and the equipment we had put in place to support this remained well looked after by children and staff. Ongoing throughout Period: Human Elephant Conflict Programme Development, Kenya The implementation of this programme was inevitably put on hold during this period but we were able to continue discussions with the Born Free Foundation to further understand the needs of both humans and elephants living in / around the Meru and Amboseli national parks in Kenya, and to create a full training concept involving use of an elephant puppet to help support the rights of people living near the national parks along with elephant populations. Implementation of the project will now take place in May 2022.

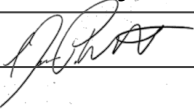

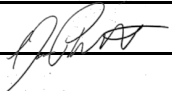
