Report of the Trustees for the year ended 30 September 2023

The Trustees present their report with the financial statements of the trust for the year ended 30 September 2023.

INCEPTION

The Fulani Ministries Trust is a registered charity, governed by a Declaration of Trust dated 9th October 2002.

OBJECTS

The main objects of the Charity are to further the Christian Faith primarily among the Fulani People and to relieve poverty and suffering and to promote education among the Fulani people.

PRINCIPAL ACTIVITIES

In fulfilling the charity objects, the trust works with a team of Fulani Nationals based and working in Burkina Faso and in some other sub-Saharan African countries.

The trust provides monthly support for the Fulani Team's work and gives additional help from time to time at and through the Jam Tan Centre located approximately 55 kms from the capital city of Ouagadougou. The trust maintains regular contact with our partners in Burkina.

The team and associated helpers in Burkina Faso work to develop Christian Ministry and train church planters and workers. Regular church services are held along with various community events and activities including sporting events and football tournaments for local villages. Additionally, the trust works with the team to provide education and give medical help at a clinic and to provide skills training to equip individuals to earn a living and be self-sufficient.

The Jam Tan centre has continued to hold health days about 6 times in the year. These days are staffed voluntarily by doctors and nurses from the capital city. The local police work alongside the team on clinic days and provide some security and administrative civic help for those without national identification papers. Local politicians and other dignitaries attend from time to time and have particularly praised this help given. There has been a continued development of good relations with the security forces and police is part of the value added consequence of these events and actions and the help is very favourably received.

As part of the promotion of good health, Jam Tan have continued the building development of a permanent medical centre, that will in future be staffed by volunteer doctors and nurses, in order to provide local people with immediate care on a more regular basis.

In the early part of 2023 Jam Tan received a national award from the government for their positive contribution to the building of community within Burkina Faso.

As continuation of promoting education, Jam Tan the primary school continues to flourish, plus the building of a high school, this is in order to help to establish a continuity in the education of

Something strategic for the Trust was the relaunch in August of the Fulani Ministries website, this was primarily sponsored by the Fulani Ministries Trust. We are pleased with the result as it is helping to promote awareness of the Trust and Jam Tan activities.

There continues to be increased security problems in Burkina Faso and other neighbouring countries are a serious concern as terrorist activity is widespread. There have been attacks on churches and police, security forces and on the general population. Some pastors and church members have been killed and others displaced. Many schools have closed due to terrorist attacks, and people are displaced.

The increased threat to people and villages particularly in the north of the country from terrorists from other countries has caused a significant increase of displaced people within Burkina Faso to 2.6 million people.

We acknowledge with thanks all who help us with support and encouragement and to the team members in Burkina Faso who are at the sharp end of the trust's activities. The trustees continue to monitor the security situation with a view to taking such steps as may become necessary. However, Fulani Ministries continues to operate and see progress in Burkina Faso among the Fulani.

Independent examiner's report to the trustees of Fulani Ministries Trust

I report on the accounts of the Charity for the year ended 30 September 2023, which are set out on these pages.

Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner

As the charity's trustees you are responsible for the preparation of the accounts; you consider that the audit requirement of section 43(2) of the Charities Act 1993 (the Act) does not apply. It is my responsibility to state, on the basis of procedures specified in the General Directions given by the Charity Commissioners under section 43 (7)(b) of the Act, whether particular matters have come to my attention.

Basis of examiner's statement

My examination was carried out in accordance with the General Directions given by the Charity Commissioners.
