ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

Charitable activities

During the year, grants to charitable institutions amounted to £35,100 (2023: £30,297).

Grant making policy

Whilst not actively inviting applications, they are always prepared to accept any application which will be carefully considered and help given according to circumstances and funds then available.
