Independent examiner's report to the Trustees of Bradford Chinese Christian Church

I report on the accounts of the Charity for the year ended December 31, 2024.

Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner

The charity's trustees are responsible for the preparation of the accounts. The charity's trustees consider that an audit is not required for this year under section 144(2) of the Charities Act 2011 (the 2011 Act) and that an independent examination is not needed. It is my responsibility to:

- examine the accounts under section 145 of the 2011 Act;
- to follow the procedures laid down in the General Directions given by the Charity Commission under section 145(5)(b) of the 2011 Act; and

Basis of independent examiner's report

My examination was carried out in accordance with the General Directions given by the Charity Commission.
