

Status update on Prior Year issues

1. Some of the parishes do not have bank accounts. Although the funds handled by these parishes are not material, all church collections should be banked into an account in the name of the Charity.

2023 Update - *Ended 2023 with 2 Parishes without bank accounts, they had very insignificant activities in 2023. Bank accounts now been opened and operational by Q4 of 2024.*

2. The decentralised nature of record keeping at parish level affects the quality and completeness of financial records. Trustees should consider the introduction of a centralised accounting system.

2023 Update - *New accounting system implemented in 2024, being rolled in Q424 across all Parishes. This will enable approvals and cash disbursements to be managed centrally.*

3. International budget contributions - a formal agreement should be put in place between the charity and head to cover all funds sent overseas - and should outline their purpose, how the charity benefits and the due diligence performed by the charity to ensure the funds are being used for their intended purposes

2023 Update - *Discussions underway. Hopeful this will be in place in 2025.*

4. Oversight of funeral funds - there should be oversight by the trustees as there is no consistency in how the funeral funds are managed across the parishes. Trustees should consider reviewing and approving the constitutions or arrangements which parishes would have in place.





