TO RELIEVE DISTRESS AND SUFFERING OF CATS AND KITTENS MAINLY IN THE BEDFORDSHIRE AREA BY PROVISION OF RESCUE, FOSTERING AND REHOMING, PLUS VETERINARY TREATMENT WHERE AND WHEN REQUIRED.

A SUMMARY OF THE MAIN ACTIVITIES UNDERTAKEN BY STRAY CAT RESCUE FOR THE PUBLIC BENEFIT:

SHELTER

LOOKING BACK OVER THE PERIOD 1 NOVEMBER 2022 - 31 OCTOBER 2023, OUR AIM CONTINUED TO BE TO RESCUE, HELP AND RE-HOME AS MANY CATS AND KITTENS AS WE ARE ABLE WITHIN BEDFORDSHIRE AND SURROUNDING AREA. IN DOING THIS WE HAVE STRIVED TO MAKE A DIFFERENCE TO THE LIVES OF ALL CATS IN OUR CARE.

WE HAVE CONTINUING ISSUES WITH VAST NUMBERS OF CATS BEING ABANDONED. WE BELIEVE THIS TO STILL BE ANIMALS HOWNED DURING THE PANDEMIC AND NOW UNWANTED AS KITTENS ARE NO LONGER SO MUCH IN DEMAND AND THE COST OF KEEPING A PET IS INCREASING. WE CONTINUED TO RESCUE & REHOME AS MANY CATS AS POSSIBLE AND HAVE INTRODUCED PRE-BOOKED REHOMING DAYS, WHICH ARE PROVING TO BE VERY SUCCESSFUL.

STRAY CAT RESCUE IS VERY GRATEFUL TO THE VETS IN LEIGHTON BUZZARD, BARTON LE CLAY, BEDFORD & LUTON FOR DISCOUNTING THEIR SERVICES TO US. WE ARE ALSO SO GRATEFUL TO OUR FOSTERERS ALONG WITH THOSE WHO COLLECT THE CATS, DO THE VET RUNS AND THE RE-HOMING CHECKS.

IN ORDER TO STILL REHOME CATS & KITTENS WE HAVE CONTINUED TO UTILISE VIDEO CALLS FOR THE MAJORITY OF THE HOME CHECKS, INSTEAD OF PHYSICAL CHECKS. THIS HAS PROVEN TO BE A TIME & COST-EFFECTIVE WAY OF OPERATING & NO MORE CATS HAVE BEEN RETURNED FOLLOWING ONLINE CHECKS THAN WITH PHYSICAL CHECKS.

OUR 2023 CALENDAR FEATURED STORIES ABOUT SOME OF THE CATS & KITTENS WE HAVE RESCUED AND AGAIN THIS PROVED VERY SUCCESSFUL. WE WILL CONTINUE TO USE THIS FORMAT AS IT'S SO POPULAR AND SETS US APART FROM A CALANDER JUST WITH PICTURES.

THE OPEN DAY WAS BY FAR OUR MOST SUCCESSFUL TO DATE AND WE AIM TO CONTINUE BUILDING ON THE SUCCESS OF THIS.

MEMBERS AND SPONSOR EVENTS WERE COMBINED WITH CATS N CAKES FUNDRAISING EVENTS AND ARE VERY POPULAR.

FUNDRAISING

AT THE END OF 2022 WE FOCUSSED OUR EFFORTS ON SELLING MERCHANDISE FOR THE UPCOMING CHRISTMAS PERIOD INCLUDING OUR OWN DESIGN SCR CHRISTMAS CARDS AND OUR SCR CALENDAR (2023 EDITION), WHICH WERE ONCE AGAIN RECEIVED VERY WELL AND SOLD IN GOOD QUANTITIES.

OUR EFFORTS TO FUND RAISE HAVE BEEN HEAVILY BIASED AROUND SOCIAL MEDIA ACTIVITIES ON INSTAGRAM AND FACEBOOK.

THIS HAS GIVEN US A NEW SOURCE OF DONORS, WHO ARE WILLING TO GIVE US DONATIONS, BUY OUR MERCHANDISE AND SUPPORT VARIOUS EVENTS.

WE HAVE INSTIGATED A 'DONATE A POUND ON PAYDAY' SCHEME WHICH NOW HAS OVER 700 MONTHLY DONATORS.

WE HAVE ALSO INCREASED THE FREQUENCY OF OUR 'CATS & CAKE' AFTERNOON TEA AND CAKE EVENTS AT THE SHELTER, WHICH HAVE BEEN VERY SUCCESSFUL AND EXTREMELY POPULAR.

WE CONTINUE TO DO EVENTS IN THE LOCAL COMMUNITY AND ATTEND THE SUMMER FETES OF VILLAGES AND TOWNS IN OUR SURROUNDING AREA.

THIS IS LARGELY DONE TO KEEP OUR PROFILE HIGH IN THE LOCAL COMMUNITIES WE SERVE AND RAISE ADDITIONAL FUNDS BY SELLING MERCHANDISE AND PROMOTING OUR MEMBERSHIP AND SPONSORSHIP SCHEMES.

OUR OPEN DAY HELD IN SEPTEMBER 2023 WAS VERY SUCCESSFUL AND WELL ATTENDED, RAISING A GOOD AMOUNT OF FUNDS FOR US.

WE ALSO RECEIVE A LOT OF DONATIONS FROM PEOPLE WHO HAVE HAD CATS & KITTENS FROM US PREVIOUSLY AND THEY JUST SEND US DONATIONS WITHOUT ANY PROMPTING, KNOWING WE HAVE HELPED IN THE PAST.

WE WOULD LIKE TO THANK ALL THE PEOPLE WHO HAVE SUPPORTED US THROUGHOUT THIS PERIOD AND ALSO ALL THE PEOPLE WHO HAVE SPENT THEIR TIME FUND-RAISING FOR SCR. WITHOUT OUR FUNDRAISING ACTIVITIES, WE WOULD NOT BE ABLE TO CARRY ON HELPING STRAY AND LOST CATS & KITTENS.

MEMBERSHIP

WE CURRENTLY HAVE 170 PAYING MEMBERS.

7 MEMBERS HAVE JOINED SINCE THE LAST AGM. SADLY, WE HAVE LOST 14 MEMBERS THIS YEAR BUT DESPITE THIS OUR REVENUE FROM MEMBERSHIP HAS INCREASED FROM THE LAST FINANCIAL PERIOD TO £8384, UP FROM £7269

WE CONTINUE TO BE GRATEFUL TO MANY OF THE MEMBERS WHO DONATE TO US SIGNIFICANTLY MORE THAN OUR MEMBERSHIP FEE & ALSO THOSE WHO DO VOLUNTEER WORK AT THE MAIN SHELTER, FOSTER FOR US AND HELP OUT AT & SUPPORT OUR EVENTS DURING THE YEAR.

CAT SPONSORSHIP

THE SPONSORSHIP SCHEME HAS BEEN RUNNING SINCE 2013 AND IT CONTINUES TO PROVIDE A STEADY INCOME.

MANDY BULL STEPPED DOWN FROM THE SPONSORSHIP CO-ORDINATOR POSITION IN JULY/AUGUST 2023 AND SOPHIE COOTES HAS TAKEN ON THE ROLE.

I WOULD LIKE TO THANK MANDY FOR HER HELP & ADVICE DURING THE TRANSITION PERIOD.

IN AN EFFORT TO BE MORE COST EFFECTIVE &

ENVIRONMENTALLY FRIENDLY. I IMPLEMENTED MANDY'S IDEA OF TRANSITIONING THE SPONSORSHIP PACKS, FROM A4 TO A5 THAT WOULD REDUCE THE COST OF POSTING & PACKAGING. THE SPONSORSHIP PACKS WERE GIVEN A NEW LOOK & THE A5 SIZE MAKING THEM EASIER & CHEAPER TO POST.

I AM ALSO TRIALLING A FRIDGE MAGNET PHOTO FRAME, WITH THE AIM TO SEND OUT AN UPDATE PICTURE OF THE CHOSEN CAT ON THE RENEWAL OF THE SPONSORSHIP.

THE SPONSORSHIP PACK PRICE HAS REMAINED UNCHANGED FOR THE PAST 10 YEARS AT A SUGGESTED £15 A YEAR. AFTER CAREFUL CONSIDERATION AND THE BACKING OF THE COMMITTEE, IT WAS DECIDED TO INCREASE THE SUGGESTED PRICE TO £25 PER YEAR.

WE HAVE CURRENTLY 105 ACTIVE CAT SPONSORSHIPS FROM PEOPLE SPONSORING OR GIVING GIFT OF SPONSORSHIP AND WE WOULD LIKE TO THANK ALL OF THEM FOR THEIR CONTINUED SUPPORT.

WE CURRENTLY HAVE 4 CATS ON THE SCHEME, ALL REMAIN IN FAIRLY GOOD HEALTH. ONE OF OUR BELOVED OLDIES, TESCO TED, PASSED AWAY IN EARLY NOV 2022.

OUR SPONSORS OPEN DAY WAS HELD IN JUNE 2023 AND AS ALWAYS, A GOOD CHANCE TO MEET SPONSORS OLD AND NEW.

FINANCIAL STATEMENT

IN A CLIMATE OF RISING COSTS FOR ALL, WE HAVE SEEN OUR VETS FEES INCREASE QUITE SIGNIFICANTLY THIS YEAR. THIS IS ALSO DOWN TO THE NUMBER OF CATS WE HAVE HELPED AS WELL AS THE INCREASED COSTS. IN RESPONSE TO THIS, WE DECIDED TO RAISE OUR RECOMMENDED RE-HOMING DONATIONS. A NUMBER OF RE-HOMING DAYS WERE HELD AT THE SHELTER THROUGHOUT THE YEAR AND GREATLY INCREASED ADVERTISING ONLINE HAS SEEN A REGULAR TURNOVER OF CATS THROUGH THE SHELTER.

ELECTRICITY COSTS ALSO CONTINUE TO RISE, NEARLY DOUBLED THIS YEAR. THIS HAS LED TO THE INTRODUCTION OF THE "DONATE A POUND ON PAYDAY" SCHEME, WHICH WAS LAUNCHED ON INSTAGRAM, AND CURRENTLY GENERATES APPROXIMATELY £1500 PER MONTH.

THE SPONSORSHIP SCHEME IS A GENERALLY RISING INCOME, AND IS NOW IN THE HANDS OF A NEW CO-ORDINATOR, SOPHIE, SO WATCH THIS SPACE FOR A NUMBER OF NEW IDEAS. MANY THANKS TO MANDY, FOR ALL HER YEARS OF DEDICATION TO THIS SCHEME.

WEB DONATIONS, WHICH INCLUDES DAPOP AND MISCELLANEOUS SALES FIGURES HAVE RISEN SIGNIFICANTLY. MAINLY DUE TO THE CRAFTING SKILLS OF SARAH AND CHERYL AND THE BEGGING OF LEONA AND GEORGIA, FOR DONATIONS OF GOODS FROM VARIOUS CONTACTS TO FILL THEIR CAT BOXES, WHICH SELL EXTREMELY QUICKLY.

THE OPEN DAY, WAS ONCE AGAIN VERY WELL ATTENDED, AS WERE THE REGULAR CATS N CAKES EVENTS, THROUGHOUT THE

SUMMER MONTHS. ALL OF WHICH BROUGHT IN MUCH NEEDED FUNDS.

THERE WAS AN INCREASE IN THE MAINTENANCE COSTS, BUT THIS WAS LARGELY DUE TO THE PURCHASE OF TWO NEW CAT PENS, WITHIN THE GARDENS OF SHERI AND CRISTINA.

OVERALL, AFTER WHAT HAS BEEN A CHALLENGING YEAR, AND DESPITE THE OVERSPEND OF OUTGOINGS OVER INCOME, WE FIND OURSELVES IN A REASONABLY HEALTHY FINANCIAL POSITION. WE HAD BEEN PRE-WARNED OF A WILL THAT THE CHARITY HAD BEEN NAMED IN, THE FUNDS OF WHICH WE RECEIVED TWO MONTHS LATER, DECEMBER.

SOCIAL MEDIA

THIS WAS THE FIRST FULL YEAR OF HAVING THE SOCIAL MEDIA ACCOUNT UP AND RUNNING. WE SAW A CONSIDERABLE INCREASE IN OUR FOLLOWING OVER THE 12 MONTHS AND IN HAND BEGAN TO SEE REHOMING AND DONATIONS GROW.

WE INTRODUCED THE 'DAPOP' SCHEME; DONATE A POUND ON PAYDAY, WHICH BECAME AND REMAINS VERY POPULAR. AS OF 31ST OCTOBER 2023, WE HAD £1165 COMING IN MONTHLY.

ON TOP OF DAPOP, WE SIGNED UP TO THE EASY FUNDRAISING SCHEME AND PROMOTED THIS TO OUR FOLLOWING, AS OF THE END OF OCTOBER WE HAD 63 PEOPLE SIGNED UP.

WEBBOX REACHED OUT TO US AND BEGAN MAKING GENEROUS DONATIONS OF FOOD AND TREATS IN RETURN OF US CREATING CONTENT FOR THE INSTAGRAM PAGE. THIS LATER LED TO US CREATING LETTERBOX PARCELS WITH THE REMAINING PRODUCTS TO FURTHER FUNDRAISE FOR THE CHARITY.

AN ILLUSTRATOR REACHED OUT LATER IN THE YEAR AND OFFERED TO DESIGN US SOME ANIMATED DRAWINGS OF OUR 'INSTA CAT'S'. FROM THESE DRAWINGS WE CREATED TOTE BAGS AND WINDOW STICKERS WHICH AGAIN RAISED US A CONSIDERABLE AMOUNT OF MONEY; THESE ILLUSTRATIONS WE

CONTINUE TO USE ON MERCHANDISE AND POSTERS.

FURTHER FUNDRAISING THROUGH THE INSTAGRAM PAGE CONSISTED OF TWO VERY SUCCESSFUL RAFFLES, EASTER AND HALLOWEEN. MULTIPLE ROUNDS OF CATNIP HEARTS AND PILLOWS, AND DURING THE WARMER MONTHS OUR CATS & CAKES EVENTS WHICH TURNED OUT TO BE VERY POPULAR.

INSTAGRAM AND FACEBOOK HAVE BEEN EXTREMELY POWERFUL WAYS OF US SPREADING AWARENESS OF THE CHARITY, REHOMING CATS AND FUNDRAISING OVER THE LAST 12 MONTHS AND WE PLAN ON CONTINUING TO GROW BOTH PLATFORMS SIGNIFICANTLY OVER THE COMING YEARS.



1. Accounting records were not kept in respect of the Charity as required by section 130 of the 2011 Act; or
2. The accounts do not accord with those records;
3. The accounts do not comply with the applicable requirements concerning the form and content of accounts set out in the Charities (Accounts and Reports) Regulations 2008 other than any requirement that the accounts give a 'true and fair view' which is not a matter considered as part of an independent examination.

I have no concerns and have come across no other matters in connection with the examination to which attention should be drawn in this report in order to enable a proper understanding of the accounts to be reached.
