The Trustees are empowered to invest monies of the Charity not immediately required for the furtherance of its objects in or upon such investments, securities or property as may be thought fit, nevertheless subject to such conditions (if any) and such consents (if any) as may for the time being, be imposed or required by law

OBJECTS AND ACTIVITIES

As set out in the Model Charitable Trust document, the object of the charity is to relieve poverty, sickness and distress and to help give a quality of life to the needy.

Last year the Charity carried out fund raising to help the Rohingyas and their needy in the flood affected areas North of Bangladesh; giving winter clothes to children and adults.

The Charity spent 51% of the fund raised to distribute food and medicine for Rohingyas in Bangladesh North of Bangladesh 23% of the fund was used to distribute food packages and clothes to the flood-stricken people living in boats and this included adults and children.

The Charity is committed to furthering its objectives in the future in the UK – this year - by giving 26% of funds to supporting the local community initiatives.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

The Trust tend to spend most of the monies in the year of collection. There is no deficit. No remuneration is drawn by the 3 Trustees.
