## UMMAH HELPING HANDS: ANNUAL REPORT 2024

Ummah Helping Hands (UHH) was established in 1997 by Hafiz Hifzur Rahman Tarapuri for the charitable cause of helping the most remote villages near Anand, which is in the state of Gujarat, India. Due to poverty and poor education combined with past riots, flooding and financial pressures affect many preventing them to meet their most basic needs.

What is special about UHH is that we go out to villages where only few Muslims are residing and where they are in a fragile minority position. Having no transport themselves, they cannot go out to collect money. Hence, they rely on UHH volunteers to visit these villages once a month, offering selected help towards the neediest families.

### Over the last year

Last year thanks to our donors, hardworking staff and volunteers, UHH were able to continue our valuable work for the poor people in villages around Anand.

With the help of Allah (SWT) UHH was able to bring help to the needy and destitute. However, there is much yet to do.

Thousands of Muslims in the area still suffer from poverty, disease, illiteracy and lack of economic opportunities. UHH not only provides financial assistance but a source of much needed hope to the particularly vulnerable in society: orphans, young girls, widows, the old and the infirm. We ask Allah (SWT) to allow us to help more of those who require assistance urgently.

UHH thanks all those who have supported us and hope that Allah rewards them better in this life and the Hereafter. One again with Allah's help and blessings, we can bring change to these people and their lives.

### Our Current Projects Widows

We at UHH are currently helping **125 vulnerable widows** in areas where there is no provision or care. UHH offers every widow a monthly relief package where they are also personally given the donation. We are currently operating this project in **8 villages** on a regular basis. Last year we spent on this project **£15000**

### Al-Huda Orphanage, Vejalpur, Gothra

*Over the past 7 years, we have successfully established a dedicated orphanage which currently provides for 63 orphans. With your generous donations, we have been able to clothe them, feed them and provide them with lodging/boarding within an Islamic environment. Here we deliver secular and Islamic education to pave a bright future for these young orphans.*

*To sponsor an orphan, you can donate £30/month. You will also receive an annual report on the orphan you sponsor. Last year we spent £28000*

**HealthCare:** In India, the medical market has been commercialised, consequently causing difficulties for the poor people to pay for health and medical services/bills. Therefore, **UHH** have established Faizan Hospital situated in Anand, Gujarat. Within this hospital we also have a dedicated maternity home allowing us to help many poor, vulnerable families with minimal charges. And many people taking benefit from this last year we help 108 individual we spend in this **£6500**

**Marriage helps for orphan girls:** Marriage is a social obligation upon every Muslim, which completes half of one's *deen*. Orphan girls have consequently been unable to get married due to the loss of their parents and their poor background. We at **UHH** can give you the opportunity to be a major part in changing their situation as we currently distribute basic marriage kits for these disadvantaged young brides. This kit includes: A suitcase, clothes, bangles, utensils and a copy of the *Qur'an*. This kit only costs £60. last year we help about **60 girls**. We spend last year **£3000**

**Self-Reliance:** It is essential that those in need get a helping hand to establish their own businesses to help themselves. **UHH** assist unemployed male head of households with carts on which they can start a street vending business. Ladies of poor families are provided with sewing machines allowing them to start a business within the home or saving family money allowing them to become self-dependent. **45 individuals with their businesses £4000**

**Ramadan & Eid:** Every Ramadan, **UHH** distributes iftar packages for more than 200 poor families in remote villages around Anand. This allows them to comfortably fast in the month of Ramadan without any worries or concerns with regards to food and drink. We also provide poor children with Eid gift packages so they can have an enjoyable Eid with other children. Last year, **UHH** managed to distribute more than **200** food package and **150** Eid gift packages. we spend in this **£13000**

**Education:** is a vital part of Islam and essential for the poor and wealthy. Education will enable poor children to be free from poverty and labour. This will also improve their situation for themselves and their families for a brighter and secure future. **UHH** help poor students by providing them with books, uniform and school fees. **The Messenger of Allah (pbuh) encouraged the believers to remove themselves from poverty due to its significant impact it had on faith. Last year we helped more than 100 students with your support. spend £18000.**



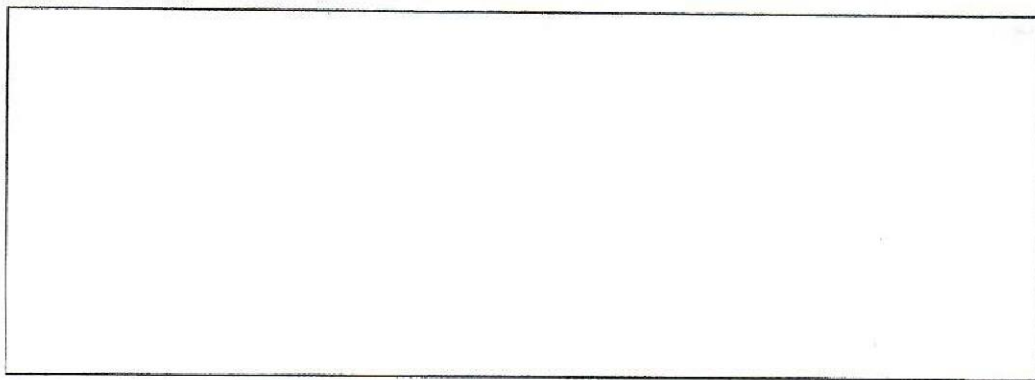

**Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year****Over the last year**

As a thriving charity, with confidence we can state that we have been making a huge difference in the lives of the poor and needy in India (Gujarat) with the help and support that we get from our generous donors. We are constantly reviewing and visiting different villages so we can really grasp what the poor and needy need. You can see this by the on-going projects we have been working on. Day by day the charity is doing better and we feel that more people are approaching us for help and support. UHH assists those who suffer from poverty, illiteracy, diseases and lack of economical support. UHH strives hard to aid the most vulnerable in society, namely the widows, young girls, orphans and the elderly.

**Widow help**

We are providing monthly aid to the residence of 9 poor villages, 110 widows, amongst them, 10 have got several health conditions.

**Education**

UHH believes that education is vital for every individual in their life. UHH also believes that education is one of the paths to remove poverty and the road to a brighter future for the poor and needy. We help each individual with good quality education in English by helping them with their fees, uniform, books bags and essentials that they would need on a day to day basis. We want the children to aim high by ensuring they progress to higher education with our help and support.

Last year we helped more than 38 individuals to get higher education which will help them in the future and we helped more than 109 children in secondary school by giving them uniform, books and fees.

**Al Huda Orphanage- Our new project**

In the previous year, we have been helping orphans in different schools. However, we were not able to help as many as we wanted. Therefore, UHH decided to build an orphanage in an extremely poor and needy village in Gujarat (Vejalpur, near Ghodra) where orphans are offered education with boarding and lodging. There are now 40-50 orphans who are benefitting from this orphanage in a safe and secure gated environment. We thank all the people who donated for this very rewarding project.

**Marriage**

Every marriage incurs expenses. UHH helps individuals to have a good start in their married life by aiming to ease the financial burden. Last year UHH have helped 74 girls get married by providing essential items such as clothes, Quran, suitcases etc.

### **Health Care**

As many of you are aware, health care in India is very commercial therefore it is very hard for the poor to get treated correctly due to financial difficulties. UHH helps them by paying their bills in various hospitals. Faizan maternity Hospital continues to get financial assistance from UHH which is a no-profitable medical centre based in Anand Gujarat. UHH specialises in the maternity field. Every year many patients receive treatment from the hospital and Last year we helped more than 85 individual people pay for their medical bills.

### **Self-Reliance**

UHH aims to encourage every poor young individual to sustain for their families by providing them with a small grant to start their own business or help them financially with their already running business. We do this by providing them with valuable equipment carts, bicycles, sewing machines etc. Last year we were able to help 41 poor people in Self-Reliance

### **Ramadhan**

As Ramadhan and Eid is a very special time for every Muslim, UHH believes that every family should have the means to get through Ramadhan at ease. We provide Iftaar packages which includes basics such as, rice, flour, oil, lentils etc. In addition UHH do not forget the poor families in the happy occasion of Eid. We help 300 families during Ramadhan and 100 families during Eid.

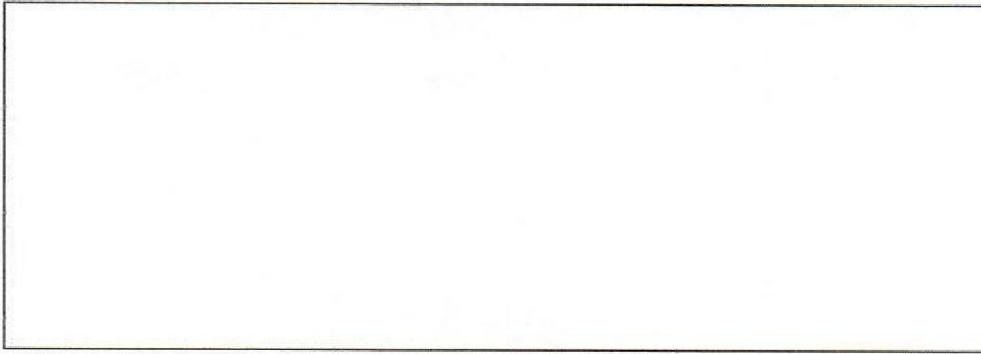
### **COVID Lockdown**


