Fundraising events

£118,889.40 was raised throughout the year. Funds were raised from our annual sponsored walk, three churches, private organisations on line donations as well as a number of individual donations from supporters and online donations. Our main is not one event; it is continuous, month on month.

The school we are supporting, Nsoke Community School, relies on Teacher Aid to pay a salary to the teachers, buy food, books, uniform material as well as provide bursary funding for the school's graduate students. The monthly donations in 2024 from our regular supporters averaged £3,500.00. It is a continuous fundraising programme which is the backbone of the school.

The Gower Yomp 2024 was for raising funds for the Nsoke School further food support, because there has been a drought throughout Zambia as well as in the surrounding countries, with crops failing. Food prices are escalating to a level that becomes unaffordable not only for the school but for the surrounding communities.

2024 was the 4th graduation for 12 Grade students. The students will have a gap year and will be placed with local organizations to gain basic skills in order to follow their own careers. Hopefully most of these students will be sponsored by the Zambian government for their university studies. Teacher Aid through the Nsoke School administration will provide bursary funding for those students that will not be sponsored by the government and with no means to provide their cost of their education.

We have not visited the school as usual at the end of October due to Mike Papadacos illness that prevents him to no longer travel.

Expenditure

Full details of the expenditure in the year £72,072.90 are in the accounts which are available to all. Nsoke Community School, received £67,868,76. The remainder was spent on Bursary support and general internal costs. Details are included in the annual accounts.

The school we are supporting, Nsobe Community School, relies on Teacher Aid to pay a salary to the teachers, buy food, books, uniform material etc. The monthly donations in 2023 averaged £5,000.00. It is a continuous fundraising programme which is the backbone of the school.

The building of the secondary school library had been completed and the reading extension was built and completed before and completed at the beginning of the year.

Hopefully most of these students will be sponsored by the Zambian government for their university studies. Teacher Aid through the Nsoke School administration will provide bursary funding for those students that will not be sponsored by the government and with no means to provide their cost of their education.

We visited the school at the end of October with additional 20 computers for the school. It was a great trip and much was achieved. The building of the secondary school library had been completed and the reading extension was now completed before and furnished with desks for the students to read.

Mike Papadacos inspected the electrics and solar panels and advised for necessary repairs and upgrades where needed.

Expenditure

Full details of the expenditure in the year (£72,707.24) are in the accounts which are available to all. Nsoke Community School, received £67,253.62. The remainder was spent on Computers and parts as well as for shipment of books to the school, including necessary marketing for social media. Details are included in the annual accounts.

The students will have a gap year and will be placed with local organizations to gain basic skills in order to follow their own careers. Hopefully most of these students will be sponsored by the Zambian government for their university studies.

Expenditure

Fund Raising events

£139,177.04 was raised throughout the year.

Funds were raised from our annual sponsored walk, together with The Big Give as well as funding from two NGOs, three churches, on line donations as well as a number of individual donations from supporters.

Our main fundraising is not one event; it is continuous, month on month. The school we are supporting, Nsoke Community School, relies on TA to pay a salary to the teachers, buy food, books, uniform material etc. It is the support fund which incorporates the pen-pal scheme. This popular scheme for UK and Zambian children is educational and caring for both children, whereby UK parents pay a monthly sum of £15 minimum, not to the child but direct to TA's bank. During the year sponsors have increased from 88 to 108.

The monthly donations in 2021 averaged £3,200.00 . It is a continuous fundraising programme which is the backbone of the school.

Events under Covid- 19

During the year of 2021 Teacher Aid managed only one our annual Gower Yomp.

We visited the School in our usual month of November. It was a great trip and much was achieved. The building of the vocational works had been completed by the time we arrived. Mike Papadacos, our treasurer, is a Computer expert and electronics engineer. He was pivotal in installing solar energy in 2021 and under his guidance the specifications for the full installation of all electrics and equipment to school's new vocational workshops by the local tradesmen. The audio visual room had the 1KWh solar system upgraded 2.5KWh, essential for the expansion of the extra computers needed for the primary school.

Our Safe House for which we fundraised in 2020's Gower Yomp through the picturesque village of Rhossili, had been completed, fully furnished and 9 vulnerable girls moved in under the care of a host mother. The safe House was named "Rhossili House".

The Vocational workshops building had been finished. During our stay Mike arranged for the installation of a 4Kwh solar system and designed the electrical wiring for the full project. The electrical wiring will be completed by the first quarter of 2022.

2021 was also the year for the first Grade 12 to be graduated since was the primary school established 12 years ago. Expenditure

Full details of the expenditure in the year (£107,053.79) are in the accounts which are available to all. Nsobe Community School, received £105,017.04. The remainder was spent on computer parts for the school, credit card processing from our online donations, Edukit the funding application specialists and website development.

We invested £34,160.00 in order to gain interest for our bursary fund to support graduate students with no financial means in order to follow their planned careers.

Throughout the year donations and funding came from friends, churches and supporters of Teacher Aid making it another bumper year for us which is incredible!

Summary of Activities throughout the year Fundraising Programme Fundraising
events**

£82,281.54 was raised throughout the year.

Funds were raised from two main events: a Greek Evening including our annual sponsored walk, together with a project event from our trustee Keith and a number of individual donations from supporters.

Our main fundraising is not one event; It is continuous, month on month. The one school we are now supporting, Nsoke Community School, relies on TA to pay a salary to the teachers, buy food, books, uniform material etc. It is the support fund which incorporates the pen-pal scheme. This popular scheme for UK and Zambian children is educational and caring for both children, whereby UK parents pay a monthly sum of £15 minimum, not to the child but direct to TA's bank. This is sent to Nsoke's bank account quarterly for the child's teacher. During the year sponsors have increased from 88 to 100. The monthly donations in 2020 averaged £3500.00. It is a continuous fundraising programme which is the backbone of the school.

Expenditure

Full details of the expenditure in the year (£38,396.30) are in the accounts which are available to all. Nsoke Community School, received £37,000.00. The remainder was spent on TWAM for the transportation of tools and equipment to the school, credit card processing from our online donations, Edukit the funding application specialists and bank charges.

Covid- 19

During the pandemic year of 2020 Teacher Aid managed to put on a fundraiser, a Greek evening, on March 7th, a few days before the lockdown. We raised £6500. Our annual Gower Yomp was held on September 11th when we raised £19,000, thanks to a doctor who donated £7000 and other generous donors. We visited the School in November – it was a great trip and much was achieved. Mike Papadacos, our treasurer, is a Computer expert and electronics engineer. He was pivotal in introducing solar energy in 2018 and under his guidance the full installation of all electrics and equipment to school' s computer room by the local tradesmen. The computers were connected to Rachel Pi educational computer network. The same was repeated to a smaller scale by installing a 1kw solar system in the audio visual room created specifically for the primary school. It was fitted with all electrics and facilities to run 8 computers with a scope for expansion also connected to Rachel Pi network, as well as well as a TV screen for the primary school children that knew nothing of such technology. With his guidance he also had an overhead projector and an electric screen fitted in the newly built school' s assembly hall. This has given the opportunity to for the whole school, as well as the community to watch educational videos and films.
