Frome Canoe Club Trustees Annual Report

The trustees present their annual report and accounts for the year ended 31 December 2022. The board of trustees are satisfied with the performance of the charity during the year and the position at 31 December 2022 and consider that the charity is in a good position to continue its activities during the coming year, and that the charity's assets are adequate to fulfil its obligations.

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

To promote the community participation in healthy recreation for the inhabitants of Mendip and neighbouring districts, by the provision of facilities and opportunities to participate in the sport of canoeing, the term covering the use of both canoes and kayaks.

Running a sporting club whose main activity is canoeing.

We provide weekly canoeing sessions catering for people aged 8 years and older. We aim to provide opportunities for members to participate in competitive and recreational canoeing. Underpinning this is a robust programme of coaching and training.

In the summer months the weekly sessions are on the river next to the clubhouse. In the winter the sessions are in the local Sports and Fitness Centre, where we use the swimming pool. In addition we provide targeted slalom training all the year round on two evenings per week.

Our competitive focus is canoe slalom and we offer support for members to participate in national events.

Every year we organise and run two slaloms which are part of the national series of slaloms coordinated by British Canoeing. Canoeists come from all over the country to take part.

We organise a programme of courses so people can improve their skills.

Other activities we offer are white water canoeing, canoe polo, river running and recreational canoeing. We have a calendared programme of trips and events for these and they take place at weekends throughout the year. The trustees plan the programme of training and events in the monthly committee meetings.

We also offer sessions where members of the general public can come and try out the sport. All the specialist kit is provided and appropriate supervision is in place so that the people experience an enjoyable and safe introduction to canoeing.

We actively encourage youth participation in canoeing, providing opportunities for youth organisations and the local community college to come and try the sport.

We have a strong youth section and we positively support young people to progress within the sport, and to take on leadership and coaching roles within the club.

Trustees have had regard to the guidance issued by the Charity Commission on public benefit, with the aim to provide maximum opportunities for participation by both members of the club and non-members. The club's inclusive ethos together with minimal charges levied, enables members from all sectors of the community to participate, thus making a positive contribution to social impact in Mendip.

We promote and support the development of coaches within the club, making a contribution towards the training and assessment costs for individuals, who in return work voluntarily for the club for an agreed number of sessions.

All our activities are staffed by volunteers. The contribution made by the volunteers is significant. The Charity relies on their involvement to operate. 2022 recognised again the contributions made by young people as they work alongside adult coaches. The positive atmosphere created by the volunteers has had a significant impact and has generated a more welcoming and inclusive environment.

Costs to members and to the general public are kept to a minimum. They are effectively heavily subsidised because of the input from the volunteers, making the participation in our activities good value for money and a definite benefit to the wider community.

ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

As a club with Quality Club status from British Canoeing, we are reviewed by our national governing body on a regular basis. We continue to operate to a set of consistent and accepted operating standards in respect of the training programme and club activities, duty of care, working within the community and club management. In addition, we have been awarded Top Club Paddle Ability Status by British Canoeing, in recognition of the way we support paddlers with disabilities.

The main achievements of the club in the year 2022 include:

Our winter activities at the beginning of the year were able to run as normal as the restrictions resulting from the Covid Pandemic eased. We successfully returned to a programme of winter river trips. We also extended our offering to include sea kayaking through a third party. The club opened as normal for our usual river sessions from April onwards.

We have continued to offer our river sessions throughout the week, in a six-month season, starting from April. These have included youth fun and games, polo matches, slalom training and adults. This year we introduced a 6-week youth starter course to enable interested youths to gain the necessary skills and experience to be able to fully partake in all paddling activities, if they decided to join the club. We ran 4 courses over the spring/summer period with 40 youths taking part overall. This resulted in 25% uptake in youth memberships from participants, with many memberships being extended to family ones.

Our adult and families group was incredibly successful causing us to consider extending this to other evenings. We also ran a Taster Day that resulted in 52 members of the local community trying canoeing for the first time.

We have run several courses over the year including a Core Coaching course, enabling our coaches to further enhance and develop their coaching skills and White Water Safety and Rescue. Some of our coaches have also independently improved on their qualifications, being supported in part by local and British Canoeing Bursary's and the club.

We have supported the Frome Carnival by helping with a charitable duck race and have supported the Frome Town Rotary by providing them with equipment for a charitable raft race they took part in.

Our slalom section continues to be a strong part of the club. We ran two successful national Div3/4 slalom competitions at Langham Farm with all members of the club helping. Many members of our team continued training throughout the year at the club, as part of a Talent Programme or with British Canoeing Slalom Schools. We currently have 18 slalom paddlers who competed this year. We have had an incredibly successful year in slalom. A core group of our paddlers have been Promoted up the divisions. We now have four juniors in Premier Division, four in Division 1 and seven in Division 2. Our top three female juniors are part of the British Canoeing Talent Programme. We also had three junior athletes competing for Selection into the Junior GB Team resulting in one being a reserve for the Extreme Slalom Team. A handful of our juniors also went to training camps and competed at World Ranking and Junior European Championships in Europe. Some of our adults have also tried the sport for the first time this year.

We have had an incredibly successful year in slalom especially considering the short racing season. A core group of our paddlers have been promoted up the divisions. We now have three juniors in Premier Division, two in Division 1 and three in Division 2. Our top five juniors are part of the British Canoeing Talent Programme, two are on the SRDS (Southern Regional Development Squad) and three are on ENTS (England National Talent Squad). Our top male junior finished the 2021 season ranked 4th in the UK and our top female junior finished ranked 15th in the UK. Some of our adults have also tried the sport for the first time this year.

Our Talent Club Partnership (TCP) funding is continuing and although we didn't recruit as many new junior slalom paddlers as we aimed to, we have noted that this is an issue within the whole of the sport with a decrease in junior slalom paddlers of 30% across the 5 TCP clubs in England. We will carry on trying to grow the sport at our club on the back of our continued success at it.

PUBLIC BENEFIT

The trustees have had regard to the guidance issued by the Charity Commission on public benefit, with the aim to provide maximum opportunities for participation by both members of the club and non-members. The club's inclusive ethos together with minimal charges levied, enables members from all sectors of the community to participate, thus making a positive contribution to social impact in Mendip.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

The charity made an operational deficit after depreciation of -£18,159 (2021 - surplus £9,201).

The purpose of the reserves is to ensure continuity in the event of a large variation of income. The actual general reserves at 31st December 2022 were £57,690.

During 2022 the club received grants as follows:

British Canoeing Talent Club Partnership Grant £5,000. This is for the purpose of promoting canoe slalom within the club.

RESERVES POLICY

The charities reserve policy is that the club has three months running cost of the club and building.

The club has designated funds of £20,000 set aside to contribute towards the cost of a boat store extension. The club has also received insurance monies of £9,338 for the replacement of the canopy to the clubhouse building which has yet to be commissioned.

PLANS FOR FUTURE PERIODS

We will continue to pursue grant funding to increase the size of the boat store, and offer the activities at a minimal cost to attract additional members, we will consider increasing the number of activities or events.

1 Accounting policies

Basis of accounting

These financial statements have been prepared in compliance with FRS102, The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland, the Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standards applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland, and the Charities Act 2011.

Incoming resources

All membership, donations and club income is recorded when the money is received. All income for events and activities are recorded when the event or activity has been completed.

Resources expended

Resources expended are recognised in the period they are incurred and include any VAT.

Costs which are directly attributable to meeting charitable objects are classified as provision of charitable services. These costs are directly allocated to activities.

Costs associated with the general running of the charity which are not attributable to meeting charitable objects are classified as management and administration costs.

Depreciation

Tangible fixed assets are measured at cost less accumulated depreciation and any accumulated impairment losses. Depreciation is provided on all tangible fixed assets, other than freehold land, at rates calculated to write off the cost, less estimated residual value, of each asset evenly over its expected useful life, as follows:

Land and buildings	25 years
Equipment	5 years

Funds

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objects at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes. Expenditure which meets these criteria is charged to the fund. Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.

Debtors

Debtors are recognised at the amount due. Prepayments are valued at the amount prepaid net of any trade discounts due.

Creditors

Creditors are recognised where the charity has a present obligation resulting from a past event that will probably result in the transfer of funds to a third party and the amount due to settle the obligation can be measured or estimated reliably.

Taxation

The charity is exempt from tax on income and gains falling within section 505 of the Taxes Act 1988 or section 252 of the Taxation of Chargeable Gains Act 1992 to the extent that these are applied to its charitable objects.

Judgements and key sources of estimation uncertainty

The preparation of the financial statements requires management to make judgements, estimates and assumptions that affect the amounts reported. These estimates and judgements are continually reviewed and are based on experience and other factors, including expectations of future events that are believed to be reasonable under the circumstances.

No significant judgements have had to be made in preparing these financial statements.

We promote and support the development of coaches within the club, making a contribution towards the training and assessment costs for individuals, who in return work voluntarily for the club for an agreed number of sessions.

All our activities are staffed by volunteers. The contribution made by the volunteers is significant. The Charity relies on their involvement to operate. 2021 recognised again the contributions made by young people as they work alongside adult coaches. The positive atmosphere created by the volunteers has had a significant impact and has generated a more welcoming and inclusive environment.

Costs to members and to the general public are kept to a minimum. They are effectively heavily subsidised because of the input from the volunteers, making the participation in our activities good value for money and a definite benefit to the wider community.

ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

As a club with Clubmark status (a national cross sports quality accreditation scheme for clubs with junior sections), we are reviewed by our national governing body on a regular basis. We continue to operate to a set of consistent and accepted operating standards in respect of the training programme and club activities, duty of care, working within the community and club management. In addition, we have been awarded Top Club Paddle Ability Status by British Canoeing, in recognition of the way we support paddlers with disabilities.

The main achievements of the club in the year 2021 include:

Whilst our winter activities at the beginning of the year were somewhat curtailed by the Covid 19 pandemic we were able to open the club activities as normal for our usual river sessions from April onwards.

We have continued to offer our river sessions throughout the week, in a six-month season, starting from April. These have included youth fun and games, polo matches, slalom training and adults. This year we introduced a women's only group, polo skills taught by some newly qualified Paddlesport Instructors and an adult and families group allowing children and their parents to paddle together.

We have been able to re-introduce river trips to a variety of locations and have introduced a regular weekend slot at our sister site, Langham Farm.

During 2021 we have run several courses resulting in new Paddlesport Instructors who have taken on an active coaching role and many members of the club have qualified in their FRST. One of our coaches achieved his Slalom Coach Award. We have two Shepaddles ambassadors and one of our youth members won the British Canoeing Rising Star Award for the considerable time and effort she puts into supporting our club community.

Our membership has remained stable with any members not returning after the pandemic being replaced by new members eager to get active outdoors in the local community.

We have supported the Frome Carnival by helping with a charitable duck race and have supported the Frome Town Rotary by providing them with equipment for a charitable raft race they took part in.

Our slalom section continues to be a strong part of the club. We ran two successful national Div3/4 slalom competitions at Langham Farm with all members of the club helping. Competitions didn't start until the end of May but many members of our team continued training throughout the year at the club, as part of a Talent Programme or with British Canoeing Slalom Schools. We currently have 32 ranked slalom paddlers although not all competed this year.

We have had an incredibly successful year in slalom especially considering the short racing season. A core group of our paddlers have been promoted up the divisions. We now have three juniors in Premier Division, two in Division 1 and three in Division 2. Our top five juniors are part of the British Canoeing Talent Programme, two are on the SRDS (Southern Regional Development Squad) and three are on ENTS (England National Talent Squad). Our top male junior finished the 2021 season ranked 4th in the UK and our top female junior finished ranked 15th in the UK. Some of our adults have also tried the sport for the first time this year.

We have also applied for and secured funding to be a Talent Club Partner (TCP). In return for funding and support, for four years, we are aiming to recruit 15 new J12 juniors to the sport every two years.

PUBLIC BENEFIT

The trustees have had regard to the guidance issued by the Charity Commission on public benefit, with the aim to provide maximum opportunities for participation by both members of the club and non-members. The club's inclusive ethos together with minimal charges levied, enables members from all sectors of the community to participate, thus making a positive contribution to social impact in Mendip.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

The charity made an operational surplus after depreciation of £9,201 (2020 - deficit -£10,335).

The purpose of the reserves is to ensure continuity in the event of a large variation of income. The actual general reserves at 31st December 2021 were £61,422.

During 2021 the club received grants as follows:

British Canoeing Talent Club Partnership Grant £3,750. This is for the purpose of promoting canoe slalom within the club.

Covid-19 Grants thro' Mendip District Council:

National and Local Restrictions Support Grants for November and December 2020 £1,039.

National Lockdown Grants January and March 2021 £9,669.

Restart Grant June 2021 £8,000.

RESERVES POLICY

The charities reserve policy is that the club has three months running cost of the club and building.

The club has designated funds of £20,000 set aside to contribute towards the cost of a boat store extension.

PLANS FOR FUTURE PERIODS

We will continue to pursue grant funding to increase the size of the boat store, and offer the activities at a minimal cost to attract additional members, we will consider increasing the number of activities or events.



1 Accounting policies

Basis of accounting

These financial statements have been prepared in compliance with FRS102, The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland, the Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standards applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland, and the Charities Act 2011.

Incoming resources

All membership, donations and club income is recorded when the money is received. All income for events and activities are recorded when the event or activity has been completed.

Resources expended

Resources expended are recognised in the period they are incurred and include any VAT.

Costs which are directly attributable to meeting charitable objects are classified as provision of charitable services. These costs are directly allocated to activities.

Costs associated with the general running of the charity which are not attributable to meeting charitable objects are classified as management and administration costs.

Depreciation

Tangible fixed assets are measured at cost less accumulated depreciation and any accumulated impairment losses. Depreciation is provided on all tangible fixed assets, other than freehold land, at rates calculated to write off the cost, less estimated residual value, of each asset evenly over its expected useful life, as follows:

Land and buildings	25 years
Equipment	5 years

Funds

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objects at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes. Expenditure which meets these criteria is charged to the fund. Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.

Debtors

Debtors are recognised at the amount due. Prepayments are valued at the amount prepaid net of any trade discounts due.

Creditors

Creditors are recognised where the charity has a present obligation resulting from a past event that will probably result in the transfer of funds to a third party and the amount due to settle the obligation can be measured or estimated reliably.

Taxation

The charity is exempt from tax on income and gains falling within section 505 of the Taxes Act 1988 or section 252 of the Taxation of Chargeable Gains Act 1992 to the extent that these are applied to its charitable objects.

Judgements and key sources of estimation uncertainty

The preparation of the financial statements requires management to make judgements, estimates and assumptions that affect the amounts reported. These estimates and judgements are continually reviewed and are based on experience and other factors, including expectations of future events that are believed to be reasonable under the circumstances.

No significant judgements have had to be made in preparing these financial statements.
