One person wrote a book for the first time. We produced a series of inspirational videos of the story of how one person in our community unexpectedly discovered her passion for 'prophetic' art. This series on social media with the accompanying booklet has impacted many. It was especially poignant for us as she had been diagnosed with a terminal illness and yet she managed to have enough energy to be filmed in her home for this series.
