Independent examiner's report to the trustees of THE BRADFORD BULLS FOUNDATION ('the Company')

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charitable company, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Companies Act 2006. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Going concern

The Trustees have prepared budgets and cost projections that are prudent and show that without careful management and a commitment to income generation that the Charity may have cash headroom pressures. However, as in previous years the Trustees are confident that they will outperform budget and that there are certain discretionary costs that can be actively managed to protect the cash reserves of the Charity. As such the Trustees deem it appropriate to prepare the financial statements on a going concern basis.

Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received, and the amount can be measured reliably.

Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings, they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Taxation

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.

Pension costs and other post-retirement benefits

The charitable company operates a defined contribution pension scheme. Contributions payable to the charitable company's pension scheme are charged to the Statement of Financial Activities in the period to which they relate.

Community Floodlights	Funding from the Rugby League World Cup capital grants scheme to upgrade the floodlights for evening usage at Odsal Stadium, for the benefit of all of the community.
Luvabulls	The 'Luvabulls' are a dance and cheer project creating opportunities for young people aged 3-18 years of age.
Holiday Activities Fund	A Department for Education funded scheme which provides enjoyable activities and nutritious meals for school-aged children who are eligible for benefits-related free school meals.
Raise your Game	In association with the Bradford Youth Fund, 'Raise your game' is working with young people with known associates being already known to the police.
HMRC Furlough Scheme	The Government scheme, known as the Coronavirus Job Retention Scheme, to help support employees through the Covid-19 pandemic, by funding employers up to 80% of an employee's salary for those that would otherwise have been made unemployed.
Sir Ken Morrison Fund	This is a reading project getting Dads and sons to attend the Odsal stadium to read before home fixtures and increase parent and child reading opportunities.
Veterans Foundation	This project focuses on supporting local veterans from the Bradford district.
Women's Team	A project to provide playing opportunities for women in the sport of Rugby League. This project is a holistic approach to Rugby League focusing on playing fixtures, specific training regimes, personal development whilst enhancing aspiration and confidence.
Bradford MDC ARG	Funding to support the growth, sustainability, visibility and profile of the Foundation.
Back-on-side	In conjunction with Rugby League Cares and Harrogate Health Authority, to engage inactive men, aged between 35-65, into a programme of 'fun, team focussed' activities that reintroduces them to physical activity, in a way that builds stamina, strength, confidence, self-esteem, friendship networks and encourage sustainable active habits for life.
