**Summary of the main activities undertaken for the public benefit in relation to these objects (include within this section the statutory declaration that trustees have had regard to the guidance issued by the Charity Commission on public benefit)**

In planning our activities for the year we kept in mind the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit at our trustee meetings. The focus of our activities at all times is to ensure that the accommodation is safe, well maintained and available free of charge to the children and their families.

This benefits the children and their families by providing some relief from the stress of their illnesses and hospital treatment without any cost as many parents have to give up work to take care of their children and also without financial penalties if for any reason they are unable to keep a booking, for example the need to obtain immediate or unexpected hospital treatment.

Any surplus funds which are not needed to pay for the regular upkeep of the accommodation and associated equipment are kept on deposit to earn interest.

Because of the need to keep the caravans of a suitable standard these surplus funds are built up to ensure that the caravans can be renewed once they no longer meet the standards set by the site owners.

The charity continues to operate a regular weekly football result prediction competition for the majority of the year to raise funds towards the upkeep of the caravans.

In planning our activities for the year we kept in mind the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit at our trustee meetings. The focus of our activities at all times is to ensure that the accommodation is safe, well maintained and available free of charge to the children and their families. Due to increased and regular usage it has been necessary to ask visitors for a small contribution to go towards the costs of cleaning between bookings.

This benefits the children and their families by providing some relief from the stress of their illnesses and hospital treatment without any cost as many parents have to give up work to take care of their children and also without financial penalties if for any reason they are unable to keep a booking, for example the need to obtain immediate or unexpected hospital treatment.

Any surplus funds which are not needed to pay for the regular upkeep of the accommodation and associated equipment are kept on deposit to earn interest.

Because of the need to keep the caravans of a suitable standard these surplus funds are built up to try to ensure that the caravans can be renewed once they no longer meet the standards set by the site owners.
