The trustees were elected in accordance with our governing document, up to 6 elected at AGM, up to 3 co-opted and a representative from the Community Council (Joel James), Chapel (Caroline Rees) and Guiding (vacant).

Major decisions are made at a monthly meeting held on the second Sunday of the month. This year the majority of meetings have been on-line due to Covid 19.

Aims

Our aim is to provide an indoor space for local people and groups to meet and use, to improve their physical and mental health through social and physical activities.

When able we aim to hold events that bring the community together, such as a summer fete, Big Lunch, Christmas Fayre.

We are aiming to raise further funds for the renovation through fundraising events and grants.

Activities for the Year

Due to covid 19 our activities for 2020 have not been as we had planned. Restrictions have seen the hall closed for many months and then numbers of attendees severely restricted.

In normal times the hall is very well used, being booked by various groups including choirs, girl guiding, Womens Institute, yoga, Pilates, dog training, and then use by local people for parties at the weekends. We are hopeful that these groups will continue after covid 19 is controlled.

Despite the covid 19 restrictions, we have been able to organise some local community events and fundraising activities for the local community, including an outdoor pumpkin trail at Halloween for families, a creative project producing a calendar with local people's photographs, a fundraising fitness challenge, and a village Christmas window trail.

How our activities deliver public benefit

During the period of shutdown for Covid-19, the community and fundraising events mentioned above were available to everyone in our community, and fulfilled our aims of improving physical and mental health and benefitting members of the public. When planning our activities, the trustees have considered the Commission's guidance on public benefit.

Financial Report

Due to covid 19 this year our income stream from hall hire was much less than usual. We were however, able to secure grants to cover this loss and also grants towards our future renovation plans. We aim to keep at least £10,000 in reserve to cover emergencies. We are aiming to increase our balance until we are able to fund the renovations needed to keep the hall in good repair for the future.

At the end of December 2020 we had £51631.85 in our main account, and £87.48 to be used as petty cash (kept on a prepaid card).

We would like to have around £80,000 - £90,000 to be able to complete the works needed with a reasonable safety buffer for any extra expenses.

The accounts have been independently examined by Karlijn Asveld.

There are no funds in deficit and there are no concerns about the charity continuing as a going concern.

There are no funds held as custodian trustees.


