The school aims to provide an opportunity for education for the poorest children in Kenyan society and the school is provided entirely free of charge to children within the community.

Achievements and performance

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

The school now operating as a traditional primary school continued to provide educational and welfare support with a full compliment of 92 pupils cared for by 6 teachers and 3 support staff .

We have again provided funding for all pupils leaving the school to attend middle school ensuring their ongoing education . The charity now supports 22 pupils into middle school as well as a further 11 in High School .

Whilst one teacher has left the school following its restructure to a primary school we have retained adequate teachers are available for each class along with a PT music teacher thus provided a comprehensive and creative education for all our pupils .

We also have continued to fund a food program ensuring every pupil receives a free lunch everyday .

Total income in Y/E Sept 2024 amounted to £34.0k , an increase of 5% from the prior year.

Overall expenditure reduced by £4.5k to £25.5k . The lower cost base arose from lower wages costs and overall costs benefiting from a more favourable exchange rate.



The lower cost base meant there was a surplus in the year of £8.5k. This has resulted in an increase in reserves to £30.9 at year end leaving the charity able to continue to invest in the school infrastructure and to provides reserves in case of future shortfalls .


