Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

1. The charity has continued to be involved with a 'Green Hydrogen' project at Nottingham Trent university, which also has the potential to have value in the field of ADP (Alzheimer's, Dementia and Parkinson's) research. During late 2023 and early 2024, meetings have been held with the team at NTU to explore means to continue the cooperation.
2. Following a change in the chairperson of the charity due to ill-health, progress has been made in the development of the charity's wider grant funding and other strategies, governance and oversight approach, with the aim of implementing this during 2024/25.
3. The solar farm constructed by West Beacon Solar Ltd (which is wholly owned by the Charity) continued to operate effectively during 2023, resulting in ongoing income for the company during the financial year.





As the charity's trustees, you are responsible for the preparation of the accounts in accordance with the requirements of the Charities Act 2011 ("the Act").


