#### Principal Activity

Midland International Aid Trust (UK) is a charitable legal entity in the UK with the aim to relieve poverty, deprivation and distress throughout the world and to relieve suffering whether chronic or acute by way of emergency intervention and /or establishing rehabilitation programmes.

In order to Complete this philosophy medical projects have been setup in Gujrat Pakistan over the last few years and in particular the building of the Maternity and the childrens Hospital. This project is now complete.

Various Health Professionals from the UK and other Countries are sent to Gujrat by MIAT to teach and train.

## FINANCIAL REPORT AND FUTURE ACTIVITIES




### STATEMENT OF TRUSTEES' RESPONSIBILITIES
