Report of the Trustees For the year ended 31 March 2022

The Trustees, who are also directors for the purposes of company law, have pleasure in presenting their report and the financial statements for the charitable company for the year ended 31 March 2022. The Trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and the Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019).

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

The primary objective of the World Wide Family of God Churches is to further the Kingdom of God in the United Kingdom and beyond through:

- The advancement of the Christian Faith in the UK and abroad.
- The advancement of the public benefit of religious and other education.
- The relief of financial hardship and poverty either generally in the United Kingdom or people living in Africa and any other disadvantaged nations.
- Such other charitable purposes as the trustees in their absolute discretion may think fit.

Objectives and aims

Meetings and gatherings

Church meetings and gatherings are open to everyone and are fundamental for the World Wide Family of God Churches to advance its vision and to build a church based on:

- Real and dynamic worship.
- Community Outreach to non-Christians,
- Teaching and Training one another in the living of Christian values.

Meetings are open to anyone who would like to worship God as part of a Christian community and to learn and experience more about living as a Christian.

These gatherings fall into the following categories:

1. Sunday Church Services

The Church has branches in several cities and towns in the United Kingdom where people meet on Sunday for worshipping together and for teachings based on the Bible.

2. Small groups

The churches are subdivided into small groups which meet mid-week for fellowship and prayer and also for worshipping and teaching. These group settings are primarily focused on the community aspects of friendship and pastoral care during happy times and times of adversity.

3. Conventions/Seminars

The church holds regular national conventions to cater for the spiritual needs of the members and to facilitate continued unity and vision sharing with the church's founding international leadership from whom presenters are invited to minister through preaching, teaching, music and arts. As such the following annual conventions are held:

February Prophetic Word Convention, May UK Preaching of the Cross Convention, August UK and World Harvest Convention, Youth Convention in July and other ad-hoc conventions or seminars as directed.

The church encourages and supports other international conventions particularly the Pan- African and World Christian Churches Convention in Bulawayo, The Preaching of the Cross Convention in Harare, the Rural Conventions in Zimbabwe and other conventions in Africa and Australia.

The Church rents church and community halls weekly for the purposes of worship.

Mission Houses are also rented and are used as offices and for community related activities like family home groups meetings, prayer meetings and as a place to stay for visiting Bishops / Pastors, and some needy people.

Weekly church venues are rented in our primary UK areas of London, Birmingham, Southampton and Leeds. Other venues are also rented for our smaller churches under the stewardship of the area churches.

Statement on public benefit

The trustees have considered the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit, including the guidance 'public benefit: running a charity (PB2)'.

Volunteers

The charity has volunteers who assist the Church in achieving its objectives.

ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

CHURCHES IN UK

Worldwide Family of God (FOG) Church in UK had congregations in the following cities: London, Leeds, Birmingham, Southampton, Manchester, Leicester, and New Castle.

The year ending 31 March 2022 was just as challenging as the previous one because of the coronavirus pandemic and the attendant medical, social, and economic consequences - people fell ill, and loved ones passed away. The church continues to seize this spiritual opportunity by offering pastoral care, counselling and hope for the sick, bereaved and those in need of help to restore their livelihoods. Online services became the link line to people in need - a line without borders.

CHURCH SUNDAY SERVICES

Services continue to hold by attendance on live streaming on YouTube, Facebook and Zoom platforms. Weekly attendance approximates at 150 for UK online attendees. A permanent record of the number of attendances is on YouTube and Facebook under Africa Revival TV.

The online live-streaming meetings hold every Sunday from 9am GMT or 10am BST.

MID WEEK AND PRAYER MEETINGS

Online meetings hold as follows: Monday Leaders Meeting, Tuesday Home-group meetings, Thursday Midweek Service and Friday Hour of Power Prayer Meeting. All meetings held in the evenings at 4:30pm (GMT) or 5:30pm (BST).

UNITED KINGDOM AND INTERNATIONAL APOSTOLIC CONVENTIONS AND GATHERINGS FOR YEAR UP TO 31 MARCH 2022

The charity participated in the following convocations/conventions during the year under review:

- May/June 2021 UK Preaching of the Cross Convention: Not held during year under Review.
- Africa Day Celebration Services: Held Online with rest of Worldwide FOG Churches
- July 2021 Youth Convention: Held Online with rest of Worldwide FOG Churches
- November 2021: Two convocations held in Leicester and attended by about 120 people and The Overseer General Apostle Andrew Wutawunashe officiated.
- February 2022 UK Prophetic Word Convention: held in Birmingham at the Village Hotel near Dudley. A convocation held at community center in Leicester.

INTERNATIONAL CONVENTIONS

International conventions in the year ending 31 March 2022 held as follows:

1. December 2021 Pan African and World Christian Churches Convention. This was the only live international attendance meeting of the year. A UK delegation went to Bulawayo, Zimbabwe. Most attended online. The Theme was 2022 THE YEAR OF HANDS THAT BUILD NEW THINGS.
2. Preaching of the Cross Easter 2021 Convention: This convention took place online with a worldwide viewership of over two thousand people.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

In the year to 31st March 2022, the charity reported a total income of £77,519 (2021: £81,367) and a net surplus of £4,706; (2021: £13,510), accumulated funds were £9,302 (2021: £4,596).

The Trustees continue to place emphasis on financial management to ensure that the funds within the organisation are properly managed.

Reserves

The Trustees believes that unrestricted funds which have not been designated for a specific use should be maintained so that in the event of a significant drop in funding, they will be able to continue the Charity's activities. The Church is working towards meeting this objective.

Going concern

At the time of approving the accounts, the Trustees have a reasonable expectation that the Charity has adequate resources to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future. Thus, the Trustees' continue to adopt the going concern basis of accounting in preparing the accounts.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing document

World wide Family of God Churches is a charitable company registered on the 8th of November 2005 and is controlled by its governing document, a memorandum and articles of association incorporated on 21st February 2005 as amended by special resolution dated 3rd October 2005.

Recruitment and appointment of trustees

Trustees are appointed by the leaders of the Church based on their character, experience, and suitability to serve the Charity's best interests. Retiring Trustees can be re-appointed. New trustees are made aware of the legal responsibilities they take on.

I report to the trustees on my examination of the accounts of the charitable company for the year ended 31 March 2022.

Responsibilities and basis of report

1. Accounting Policies

Basis of accounting

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, except for investments which are included at market value and the revaluation of certain fixed assets and in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102), and the Companies Act 2006.

WORLD WIDE FAMILY OF GOD CHURCHES meets the definition of a public benefit entity under FRS 102. Assets and liabilities are initially recognised at historical cost or transaction value unless otherwise stated in the relevant accounting policy note(s).

Going concern

At the time of approving the accounts, the Trustees have a reasonable expectation that the Charity has adequate resources to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future. Thus, the Trustees' continue to adopt the going concern basis of accounting in preparing the accounts.

Statement of cash flows

The Trustees have taken advantage of the exemption in SORP FRS 102 from including a cash flow statement in the financial statements on the grounds that the charitable company is small.

Funds

Fund is mainly through voluntary donations of tithes and offerings by the church members and the government gift aid scheme.

Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included in the statement of financial activities when the Charity is entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy. The following specific policies are applied to particular categories of income.

Resources expended

Liabilities are recognised as resources expended when there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the Charity to the expenditure.

Charitable activities

Charitable activities are those costs relating to activities carried out to meet the objectives of the charity and include directly attributed costs as well as support costs.

Allocation and appointment of costs

Direct costs attributable to a single activity are allocated directly to that activity. Shared costs which contribute to more than one activity and support costs which are not attributable to a single activity are apportioned between those activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Taxation

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

Tangible fixed assets

Tangible fixed assets, other than freehold land, are stated at cost or valuation less depreciation and any provision for impairment. Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost or valuation of fixed assets, less their estimated residual value, over their expected useful lives on the following basis:
