Summary of the purposes of the charity as set out in its governing document	Para 1.17	Children of Peace is a non-partisan UK charity founded in 2004 that aims to work with both Palestinian and Israeli children aged between 4 and 17 years to develop a shared spirit of friendship, reconciliation, trust and understanding via the arts, education, health and sports programmes regardless of community, culture, faith, gender or heritage – so that a future generation and their communities might live and work in peace side-by-side in two future independent states.

Para 1.17 and 1.19	<p>2021 saw numerous developments, projects and programmes that enhanced our work and outcomes for our beneficiaries.</p> <p>Our <i>Coalition of Peace</i> remained the single largest peace network across the Middle East with affiliate CBOs/NGOs in Bahrain, Egypt, Gaza, Israel, Jordan, Lebanon, Morocco, Oman, Turkey, UAE and the West Bank with affiliates across Europe and North America.</p> <p>In 2021 the following NGOs joined the Coalition of Peace as affiliates:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- Deserts Stars (Bedouin, Israel)</li><li>- Wallrunners (Gaza, France)</li><li>- Playgrounds4Palestine(UK) (</li><li>- Gazze Destek Association (Turkey)</li></ul> <p>As Partners:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- Global Imams Council</li><li>- Jerusalem Peace Institute</li><li>- Watergen</li><li>- Muslims Against Antisemitism</li></ul>

Para 1.20	<p>The charity acts as a peacebuilding, conflict resolution and child protection NGO working with CBOs and NGOs in Israel and Palestine often missed by international bodies, global charities and governments. We act as a catalyst for change and as a conduit of dialogue between communities divided or alienated by conflict that might have had little or no contact before.</p> <p>Our main achievement is to provide grants for grassroots organisations that work directly with beneficiaries in key areas of the arts, education, sports and healthcare. To date we have assisted over 134,000 children in Gaza, Israel and West Bank Palestine since 2004 through our affiliate driven <i>Coalition of Peace</i> which to date has over 341 affiliates and is now the <i>single largest peace network in the Middle East and North Africa</i>.</p> <p>Fund raising has been centred around a small number of events organised by our own Events Committee. We also enjoy support from student bodies at schools and</p>



		<p>colleges throughout the UK, including secular and Jewish, Christian and Muslim communities, RAG Committees and through independent fund raising.</p> <p>Our website continues to be a valuable tool for promoting the charity and raising awareness, in addition to being a channel for receiving donations. In 2021, it received 118,023 worldwide new visits. Our Social Media team consists of three young volunteers and they have increased our presence in Instagram, Reddit, Facebook and Twitter. Our Twitter following rose to over 11,200 and contributors are based in the UK, Israel, West Bank Palestine, Egypt, Turkey and Gaza.</p>





