TRUSTEES' REPORT

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2023

The Trustees are pleased to present their report and the financial statements of the Charity for the year ended 30 June 2023.

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

The Charity's aim is to help relieve poverty and sickness in children worldwide. Recently, main awards are focused on UK charities supporting and encouraging children to stay in school and achieve their potential. Other awards went to community projects, sporting and charitable activities relating to health and poverty.

We would like to thank the Trustees, Committee Members and Volunteers for their continuing efforts for the Charity and the Directors and staff of the London & Capital Group for providing ongoing support.

FINANCIAL OVERVIEW

The Charity's principal activity is raising funds for charitable causes in accordance with its objectives.

During the year, the Charity received donations of £36,449 (2022: £33,906) and paid or pledged donations of £44,820 (2022: £14,890). After interest and other expenses, it had net expenditure of £8,381 (2022: profit of £18,733). The Charity still holds accumulated reserves of £32,299. This year there were various fundraising activities raising funds to support our nominated charities. The ongoing plan is to build up the reserves in order to fund larger projects in the future.

FUNDRAISING EVENTS

During the year, donations were received primarily from London & Capital Group, its staff, connected friends and family, and clients.

DONATIONS

We supported two nominated charities during the year, raising £15,000 for Roald Dahl's Marvellous Children's Charity and £10,000 for Bookmark Reading. We also raised £9,820 for Grief Encounter and paid £10,000 to our 2022 charity partner, London Youth Rowing.

NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2023

01. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

a) Basis of preparation

The accounts have been prepared with the assumption of going concern, under the historical cost convention and in accordance with Accounting and Reporting by Charities – Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP FRS 102) and the Charities Act 2011 and applicable accounting standards.

The principal accounting policies of the Charity are as follows:

b) Income recognition

The Charity recognises donations receivable when they are due, reasonably certain and reliably measurable on an accruals basis. Gift Aid tax relief is only recognised when received.

c) Donations paid

Donations paid are recognised when they have been pledged.

d) Expenses

Expenses are accounted for on an accruals basis.

There are no payments to Trustees except for the re-imbursement of expenses on behalf of the Charity.
