Para 1.17 and 1.19	<p>We provided humanitarian aid to the developing world by sending: 1 container of artificial limbs, furniture, equipment and supplies to hospitals; volunteer doctors to perform surgery and train local medics; food, clothing, medicine and relief goods to the to those affected by poverty and natural disasters in Pakistan.</p> <p>Free orthopaedic surgery camps were held in Karachi, Dadu & Tando Muhammad Khan. We continued our humanitarian work this year and provided relief to the poor and needy with a special focus on rural areas.</p> <p>Polio is still prevalent in Pakistan, with a large number of cases with post-polio deformities. We continued to treat polio affected patients in collaboration with Rotary International through their Karachi branch. Funds were raised for 200 surgeries which were subsequently performed.</p>
