Structure, governance and management

Type of governing document

Kathor Muslim Society of UK is constituted as a charitable trust registered with the charity commission in February 2006. It is governed by a constitution last updated 25th September 2005.

Trustee recruitment and appointment

Existing trustees find and consult on new trustees, and then put forward their recommendation.

Objectives and activities

Charitable purposes

- I. To advance the Islamic faith by any charitable means which the TRUSTEES decide
- II. To provide or assist in the provision of facilities for the recreation or other leisure time occupation for Kathorian Muslim People who live in Kathor (India) and the United Kingdom who have need of such facilities by reason of their youth, age, infirmity or disablement, poverty or social and economic circumstances in the interests of social welfare with the object of improving their conditions of life.

Summary of the main activities in relation to these objects

Fundraising & Other Income

KMS UK raised £24,373 throughout the UK and received £1,284 as interest on bank accounts, donations and accrued interest on Gift Aid. A total of £3,651 was received in Gift Aid income.

One new part membership fee of £50 was received.

Rental Income

Rental income from the two properties that the Society owns totalled £11,880

Volunteers

All the work carried out by individuals on behalf of the charity is on a voluntary basis.

Summary of the main achievements during this financial period

During the year the charity paid out grants totalling £23,084, this sum was donated to worthwhile causes. The primary beneficiaries are Kathor based NGO's and individual students needing financial support.

Our programme of support in Kathor is now well established across the spectrum of identified needs in the area. We continue to look for areas where our assistance could be of benefit, expanding areas of work as and when needed.

We also launched a UK Educational Awards programme in February 2020.

Health & Medical

Medical assistance is delivered through the Kathor Medical Trust that annually provides many thousands of out-patient and in-patient treatments covering a broad range of health services and medical procedures. The Society helped to deliver:

- Medical treatment of the teachers & students at Jamiah Haqqaniya Islamiyah, a local Islamic educational institution with over 350 students, and many of the local imams & muezzins in Kathor.
- Continued support for the provision of early diagnosis and preventative 'Health Camps' covering dentistry, family/women's health, orthopaedics and cardiology - the neediest have benefited from these camps.
- The Society covered the cost of over 300 dialysis treatments.

As in the UK many educational establishments were closed, as a result of Covid. Costs still needed to be met and our support for these organisations was maintained.

Financial support of £7,800, including £500 of interest, was provided to support these initiatives.

Education

We have continued to build upon work from previous years, this includes:

- Ongoing full financial support for five students in the Aalim class and one student of Hifz at the Jamiah Haqqaniya Islamiyah. Annual cost per student is £140.
- Supporting six undergraduate students in various disciplines. Costs can vary but is ~£500, annually per student, generally covers the shortfall on state, or other sources, of funding.
- We are currently supporting 40 students at MAI Educational Trust - a co-educational school for nearly 5,000 children from the ages of 4 to 17. £80 covers a full year's fees in the English taught medium, and as little as £30 for a full year in the Gujarati taught medium.
- A pilot vocational education programme was started, with a view to extending further if it proves a success.

Financial support of £6,850, of which £250 was interest, was provided to support these initiatives.

Social Welfare

In Kathor, the Society working with local NGOs supported this programme with £8,134:

- Providing the basic home essentials for six newly married couples through our Nikah programme.
- Our programme to support up to ten individuals in becoming self-sufficient was also started this year. Providing equipment, tools & training for trades such as sewing, carpentry, plumbing and electrical maintenance.
- The Society has introduced a widows/orphan's support programme. This is through a monthly contribution to six impacted homes.
- Emergency relief in Kathor & Karachi as a result of COVID-19 pandemic impacts
- Social & Welfare project for Kathorians in Karachi through the KSV Welfare Association.

In late March, a special appeal was launched as a result of the Covid-19 pandemic. Over £3,500 was raised to support emergency relief in Kathor.

UK Educational Awards Programme

Launched in February 2020 offering grants to support vocational, higher & professional development. One application was received by a university to student and £300 was awarded.

Financial review

Reserves Policy

The Society currently holds total reserves of £213,087, of this £134,342 is held in cash reserves. £12,725 of the cash reserves are held as Restricted Reserves.

Principal Funding Sources

Funding for the charity's activities come from two principal sources:

- 1) Fund raising through the Ramadan & Covid Appeal
- 2) Rent from the property owned by the charity

The majority of donations collected during the Ramadan appeal is in the form of Zakat. Any Gift Aid earned on donations is also used as grants to needy causes; all administrative costs are covered through other income.

Investment Policy and Objectives

Interest

The Society in line with Islamic teachings does not consider Interest earned as Halal (acceptable) and therefore we use this money for charitable causes with no benefit to the Society in line with Islamic teachings.

I report to the trustees on my examination of the accounts of the above charity ("the Trust") for the year ended 05 April 2021.


As the Charity trustees of the Trust, you are responsible for the preparation of the accounts in accordance with the requirements of the Charities Act 2011 ("the Act").
