The charity is governed by a constitution. Trustees are appointed who have experience in voluntary work and fundraising. A small fundraising committee of four has been appointed.

Objectives

The objectives of the charity is to relieve the sick and / or disabled children in need (and their families and carers) in particular, but not exclusively, through the provision of shared group holidays, days out and activities that they will benefit from.

Activities

The main activities in relation to these objectives are to raise funds to cover the cost of holidays and days out, including transport , specialist transport and hotel accommodation. Activities organised through the fun club are also covered by these funds.

Achievements of the charity over the year

The impact of Covid had a massive impact on activities that were able to be arranged as all children supported by the charity were shielding. Activities and events were either cancelled or deposits carried over to future years.

The planned ball for May 2020 and the December 2020 Christmas party had to be cancelled and deposits moved to 2021.

The Disneyland holiday booked for 2020 was cancelled but has not been rearranged, and deposits paid to Ross Travel for the Disneyland 2020 trip has been carried over to 2022 and other deposits for planned day trips have been carried over to 2021.

One trip to AnyOne Can for accessible sailing for a small group of 4 children and their family members did go ahead in October 2020.

Christmas gifts were bought and delivered to all children and siblings in December 2020.

In January 2021, a Saturday Zoom club was started, managed and hosted by a children's entertainer. A number of raffles run via Facebook and WhatsApp raised funds to pay for the Zoom club.

Trustees have been unable to meet in person due to Covid restrictions, so meetings have been conducted by Zoom and telephone.

Covid has been very hard for everyone, particularly for the families and supported children who have been shielding from early March 2020, with many not being able to leave their homes for over 12 months. The charity has tried hard to keep in contact and keep supporting the children and families, but obviously not by the usual means. Phone calls, WhatsApp groups and Zoom quizzes have helped.

The Saturday Zoom club was targeted at the most profoundly disabled children and it turned out to be a resounding success.
