### **Directors' Report for the Year ended 31 December 2020**

The Directors of the charitable company are its Trustees for the purpose of charity law, and throughout the report are collectively referred to as the Trustees.

The Trustees present their report, together with the independently examined financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2020.

The Trustees confirm that the report and financial statements of the charity have been prepared in accordance with the charity's governing document, the Companies Act 2006 and "Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS102) (effective 1 January 2019)".

### **Structure, Governance and Management**

#### Governing Document

King's Church Darlington is a company limited by guarantee and registered with the Charity Commission (No.1113455). The company was incorporated on 10 January 2006 and its governing document is the Memorandum and Articles of Association dated 24 November 2005.

#### Recruitment and Appointment of Board of Trustees

The Church Elders, who are responsible for the day to day running of the Church, appoint the Trustees. The Board of Trustees serving during 2020 were:

**Mr P. Hillsdon** - Phil started in the building industry as a carpenter and joiner where he ran his own construction business with his brother employing 40 people. Already involved in church leadership he attended Bible College in 1996 and moved to Teesside in 1999 to lead the Oakwood Centre. Phil started employment as Main Leader with King's Church in September 2008.

**Mr R.P. Davison** – Paul was the Deputy Director for Health Protection North East for Public Health England until his retirement in October 2019. He now has a national role working on environmental public health, sustainability and climate change. He became an elder in June 2009 and his responsibilities at King's Church include leading a worship band and preaching/teaching. Paul is Chair of Trustees,

**Mr G. Kennedy** - Graham has been attending Kings Church since 1998, and has been involved in youth work, alpha courses and is part of the worship team. He was made an Elder in 2019. Graham is employed as a lecturer at Bishop Auckland College, where he has worked for over 20 years teaching hospitality and catering.

**Mrs C.M. Salt** – Carolyn has been part of King's Church since moving to Darlington in 2010. Carolyn is a Chartered member of CIPD and has worked as a Human Resources Manager for over 15 years in the Education Sector. She has also previously been a Director of a small Christian charity organisation, where she took on the role of Operations Manager.

**Mr M.A. Sowerby** – Mark has been a member of the Church, and its former Charity since 1993 and has held positions as the Church Accountant and more recently Trustee during that period. He is a Chartered Accountant and works as Group Finance Director in an international Construction Consultancy.

**Mrs C.B. Ward** - Becky has been a member of King's Church since its formation. During this time, she has volunteered in many areas of church life including a period leading the Junior Church and as a member of the extended leadership team. She is a trained teacher who has, most recently, spent around 14 years working in the charity sector for both an established national charity and a smaller start up charity.

**Mr S.T. Ward** - Steve has been a member of the church since its formation and has served in a number of roles including preaching, small group leadership and as head of music. He became an elder of the church in October 2019. He is an experienced IT manager and Business Consultant. Recently retired from full-time employment, he continues to provide business advice and mentoring in a consulting capacity.

Trustee Induction and Training

Most Trustees have previously served in positions of responsibility within churches and Charities. All are familiar with the working of King's Church Darlington, being Church members and holding various positions of responsibility. All Trustees have received a copy of the Memorandum and Articles and are familiar with their contents. M. Sowerby has served as a Director of companies in his professional life and is familiar with the workings of companies and reporting requirements. Trustees make use of Charity commission website to maintain their knowledge of current developments.

Risk Management

The company inherited a valid Risk Assessment from the former Charity. Following the relocation of the Church into the King's Centre in June 2006 a review of risks associated with the property was performed and the Risk Register updated. We were fortunate to be assisted by a Church member whose professional life is very much concerned with carrying out risk assessments for large organisations. A formal review of the risk register is performed on an annual basis.

The Church is advised by a local Insurance Broker who specialises in church matters and who has been able to visit and discuss our changing needs. This has proved invaluable and has enhanced our risk management process.

Organisational Structure

The Trustees hold quarterly Board meetings. Outside of the Board Meetings a number of sub-committees exist to ensure the smooth running of the Church. These committees are chaired by members of the Board and include other members of the Church where appropriate skills are available. The key committees are:

**Remuneration Committee** – To review all aspects of employee terms and conditions and make recommendations to the Board for approval. Paid members of the Board are not permitted to vote on issues relating to their own remuneration. It is chaired by R.P. Davison and members during 2020 include C.M. Salt, C.B. Ward, and M. Sowerby. The Trustees receive no benefits from the Church in their capacity as Trustees and give their time voluntarily. Details of Trustee remuneration and expenses in relation to services as Elders is disclosed in note 9 to the financial statements.

**Finance Committee** - The finance committee meets, as required, in the two months between board meetings. The group comprises P. Hillsdon, M. Sowerby and P. Davison, and monitors the day to day finances of the Church, dealing with financial matters arising between Board Meetings.

Related Parties

The Church is a member of the Evangelical Alliance and is affiliated to a worldwide network of churches known as Newfrontiers.

**Objectives and Activities**

The charity exists to advance the Christian faith and also bring relief to persons in conditions of need, hardship or distress, or who are aged or sick. Further objectives are the advancement of education on the basis of Christian principles, and to provide or assist in the provision of facilities in the interests of social welfare.

The Trustees have referred to the guidance contained in the Charity Commission's general guidance on public benefit when reviewing the charity's aims and objectives and in planning future activities. In particular, the Trustees consider how planned activities will contribute to the aims and objectives they have set.

The strategies employed to further our charitable purposes for the public benefit are:

- Sunday worship and other meetings which are held at the King's Centre, Darlington. The building is a former Naafi and carpet warehouse in the Whessoe Road area of Darlington and provides an active and distinctive base within a community in need of social regeneration.
- A network of midweek groups (Connect Groups), which meet on a weekly basis in various homes. They provide a supportive environment in which members can develop and provide a platform for outreach into the wider community.
- Running courses and carrying out weekly and monthly activities for adults and youth.
- Supporting the work of New Hope Uganda, a charity working within education, medicine and special needs in Uganda.
- The Church operates a Furniture recycling scheme, which receives and collects donated furniture, renovates and stores as required, and delivers to those who purchase.
- The Food bank now supports four other venues as well as the King's Centre base where food is stored and distributed to over 100 people per week over a four-day weekly period.
- King's Sports now provides sports facilities available to rent and delivers the Church's own football academy for children from 4-11 years old.
- Regular support and fundraising events for Hope for Justice, a charity with the aim to eradicate human trafficking and slavery.

**Achievements and Performance**

Due to Covid-19 in 2020, and subsequent lockdowns, the various social action works we usually undertake were severely curtailed from March. However, our Foodbank continued to operate and the need for food increased substantially. Local council and government grants helped considerably, and we were able to supply all who came with food, hygiene products and encouragement.

Our Café closed, but we operated a meals-on-wheels delivery service, to help those who struggled with preparation and cooking of food. Our average output of meals was approximately 15-20 meals a day.

The Furniture Scheme was completely closed for significant periods in the year.

Many of our staff were furloughed under the UK Government Job Retentions Scheme and a skeleton staff produced various videos, worship music and short talks to encourage those who logged onto our website.

Our main Sunday gatherings were also closed and this substantially reduced our regular church gift receipts.

2020 was definitely a year like no other and which we hope never repeats itself.

**Financial Review**

The results show a net expenditure of £48k compared to £103k in 2019. This was set against the backdrop of the Covid pandemic. It is also worth noting that the net expenditure on unrestricted funds of £109k was very close to the £106k reported in 2019. The result is after depreciation of £105k such that Earnings before Interest, Tax and Depreciation are a small negative of £4k.

Unrestricted income reduced by £126k to £375k with donations down by £54k and trading activities by £71k. Both figures reflect the reduced activities in the Church during the year and also the Covid enforced closure of the Café, Furniture Scheme and Sports activities for prolonged periods. We were grateful to Church members who continued to donate through a difficult year and to the local council who provided £27k of grant funding.

Unrestricted costs were down by £123k at £484k. Whilst salary costs were up by £24k, reflecting the full year impact of headcount increases in the previous year, premises costs were down by £24k and Furniture recycled by £38k. A large element of the cost reduction was due to the generally low level of meetings and the fact that a very prudent approach was adopted to discretionary expenditure.

Restricted income was £125k higher than 2019 at £176k. £47k of this related to Government Coronavirus Job Retention Scheme Grant and £40k to higher Foodbank donations. Grant income was also up by £38k with much of the increase being due to Foodbank related activities. Restricted expenditure was up by £67k at £115k. A significant amount of this expenditure was incurred on Foodbank costs. £3k of expenditure was spent on capital items and, the designated purpose of these funds having been discharged, the capital assets were transferred to unrestricted funds.

Closing unrestricted funds were £343k, however this figure includes fixed assets of £506k of which £483k relates to the King's Centre and the related building improvements. The Church has finance lease liability of £347k, essentially secured against the building. Net current assets, therefore, represent a fairer picture of the day to day health of the Church finances and availability of funds. Unrestricted net current assets are £159k which are down from £192k in 2019.

Closing restricted funds, all held in cash, were £80k of which £31k relates to grant funding carried forward and £46k to Foodbank donations.

Outside of normal meetings and activities the Church is investing in four initiatives; the Furniture Scheme, the Café, King's Sports and the Foodbank. The table below summarises the running costs of these activities and how these costs have been funded:

Allocated overheads represent a share of accommodation costs, based upon space usage and other overhead as relevant. Voluntary gifts are amounts received for the specific activity. Church Funds represents the shortfall in funding from sources of income specific to the activity and is therefore the amount required to be funded from unrestricted Church funds.

Outlook

The outlook for 2021 remains relatively positive with income levels reasonably robust, expenditure under control and early signs that Government Covid measures will relax as the year progresses.

Principal Funding Sources

The main source of income to the Church is through gifts and donations received from Church members. We are also able to sublet some offices at the Church premises. Incidental income is received through reimbursement for some specific, and more costly Church events. Major capital projects are usually funded from gift days and grants.

Investment Policy

The Church aims to hold minimal levels of cash reserves and thus surplus funds are retained in higher interest deposit accounts.

Reserves Policy

The Church Trustees have established a policy of ensuring that the Charity retains a minimum level of cash equivalent to between 2 and 3 months normal expenditure. At 31 December 2020 this target was estimated at between £50k and £80k. Closing unrestricted cash funds at December 2020 were £190k, of which £87k related to a legacy received in 2018. The Trustees are keen to ensure that this legacy is used for the future development of the Church through the training and development of new leaders and leveraging the capacity of the King's Centre facilities in the advancement of the Churches key objectives.

**Plans for Future Periods**

Whilst the government lockdown measures introduced in 2020 and early 2021 caused the temporary closure of the King's Centre, many of our activities have gradually started back up through 2021, with new safety measures in place. Through use of the government grants and the continued financial support of Church members, the Church has been able to navigate the financial challenges of COVID-19 pandemic.

The ongoing situation is not without its challenges and our foodbank cliental has increased by some 40% since the start of the pandemic. Fortunately, our ability to make full use of the King's Centre has now returned to normal and we are pleased to be able to welcome the charity Safe Families UK to also make use of the building.

God has continued to be faithful and we are excited as a church for all that is to come through the remainder of 2021 and into 2022.

Finally, our focus on the year ahead is to 'Transform Lives and Change Communities' by:

- Continuing to see growth in all of the projects mentioned above.
- Use of our facilities to provide a greater diversity with events catering for all ages.
- Raising the finance to accomplish this with the desire of gifting money to worthwhile causes in both the U.K. and Overseas.
- Providing rented office space to the charity Safe Families UK.
- Enhancing our work with the Youth of the Church and the wider Darlington community, through employment of a full time Youth Worker.

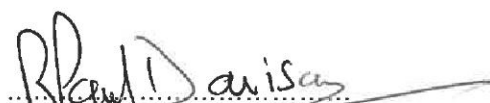

I report to the charity trustees on my examination of the accounts of the company for the year ended 31 December 2020 which are set out on pages 11 to 27.

**Responsibilities and basis of report**

**Notes forming part of the Financial Statements for the Year ended 31 December 2020**

**1. Accounting Policies**

The principal accounting policies are summarised below. The accounting policies have been applied consistently throughout the year and in the preceding financial year.

**(a) Basis of accounting**

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Companies Act 2006 and "Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS102) (effective 1 January 2019)". The charity is a Public Benefit Entity as defined by FRS102.

The accounts are prepared in sterling, which is the functional currency of the charitable company. Monetary amounts in these financial statements are rounded to the nearest £1.

**(b) Company status**

The Charity is a company limited by guarantee. The members of the company are the trustees named on page 2. In the event of the Charity being wound up, the liability in respect of the guarantee is limited to £1 per member of the Charity.

**(c) Fund accounting**

Unrestricted funds are available for use at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of the general objectives of the Church.

Restricted funds are subject to restrictions on their expenditure imposed by the donor or through the terms of an appeal.

When the restrictions placed on restricted funds have been removed, a transfer is made from restricted funds to unrestricted funds.

**(d) Incoming resources**

All incoming resources are included in the Statement of Financial Activities when the charity is entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy. The following specific policies are applied to the particular categories of income:

- Voluntary income is received by way of grants, donations and gifts and is included in full in the Statement of Financial Activities when receivable. Grants, where entitlement is not conditional on the delivery of a specific performance by the Church, are recognised when the charity becomes unconditionally entitled to the grant.
- Donated services and facilities are included at the value to the Church where this can be quantified. The value of services provided by volunteers has not been included in these financial statements. The value of food and furniture received and subsequently donated have not been included in these financial statements.
- Rental income is accounted for when it becomes receivable.
- Investment income is included when receivable.

**1. Accounting Policies (cont.)**

- Incoming resources for charitable trading activity are accounted for when they are earned.
- Incoming resources from grants, where related to performance and specific deliverables, are accounted for as the Church earns the right to consideration by its performance.
- For legacies, entitlement is the earlier of the charity being notified of an impending distribution or the legacy being received. At this point income is recognised. Where legacies have been notified to the charity however it is not possible to measure the amount expected to be distributed, the legacy is treated as a contingent asset and disclosed.

**(e) Resources expended**

Expenditure is recognised on an accruals basis as a liability is incurred. Expenditure includes any VAT which cannot be recovered, and is reported as part of the expenditure to which it relates:

- Costs of generating funds comprise the costs associated with attracting voluntary income and the costs of generating rental income.
- Charitable expenditure comprises those costs incurred by the Church in the delivery of its activities and services for its beneficiaries. It includes both costs that can be allocated directly to such activities and those costs of an indirect nature necessary to support them.
- Governance costs include the costs associated with meeting constitutional and statutory requirements of the Church and include the independent examiner fees and costs linked to the strategic management of the Church.
- All costs are allocated between the expenditure categories of the Statement of Activities on a basis designed to reflect the use of the resource. Costs relating to a particular activity are allocated directly, others are apportioned on an appropriate basis e.g. estimated building usage or estimated time committed as set out in note 6.
- Grants payable are accounted for when paid. Grants payable are payments made to third parties in the furtherance of the charitable objects of the charity.

**(f) Fixed assets**

Fixed assets are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation. Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off each asset over their expected useful life:

Music and sound systems	-	25% reducing balance.
Office furniture and equipment	-	25% reducing balance.
Computer equipment	-	50% reducing balance.
Motor vehicles	-	25% reducing balance.
Leasehold improvements	-	10 years straight line from completion.
Property	-	straight line over the term of the lease.

Assets costing less than £250 are not capitalised.

**(f) Fixed assets (cont)**

Depreciation is not provided on assets under construction until the asset is completed. After completion, periodic impairment reviews of the leasehold improvements will be performed.

**(g) Gifts in kind**

The value of gifts in kind is recognised as income within the financial statements at the point at which the Church is deemed to realise a benefit for the gift. Such income is valued at the estimated market value of the benefit where this can be quantified.

**(h) Leases**

Assets obtained under finance leases are capitalised as tangible assets and depreciated over the shorter of the lease term and their useful lives. Obligations under such agreements are included in creditors net of the finance charge allocated to future periods. The finance element of the rental payment is charged to the Statement of Financial Activities so as to produce a constant periodic rate of charge on the net obligation outstanding in each period.

Rentals payable under operating leases are charged against income on a straight-line basis over the lease term.

**(i) Format of financial statements**

The trustees have adapted the formats for financial statements set out in The Small Companies and Groups (Accounts and Directors' Report) Regulations 2008, to suit the nature of the company's activities. This format remains consistent with SORP (FRS102).

**(j) Critical accounting policies**

The accounting policies which have the most material impact on the financial statements of the charity relate to fund accounting and treatment of fixed assets. In particular:

- The Church has acquired a property under a long-term lease. See notes 1 (f) and 17. This has the effect of introducing a material asset and loan into the balance sheet.
- The Church has expended significant funds in developing the property. These leasehold improvements are being depreciated over a 10-year period as per note 1(f).
- Details of restricted funds operated by the Church can be found at note 17.

**(k) Going concern**

The financial statements have been prepared on a going concern basis as the trustees believe that no material uncertainties exist. The trustees have considered the level of funds held and the expected level of income or expenditure for 12 months from authorising these financial statements. The budgeted income and expenditure is sufficient with the level of reserves for the charity to be able to continue as a going concern.

**(i) Exceptions to SORP (FRS102)**

The nature of the charity means that Church members will regularly provide the church with their services on a voluntary basis. Examples of the contribution made by volunteers include organisation of events and meetings, and support to the café, food bank, sports facilities and furniture scheme to augment the work of paid employees. As per note 1 (d), these services have not been valued and included as income as the trustees believe that it is impossible to quantify the value of these services and that the inclusion of such an estimate would not add to the understanding of the financial performance of the charity.

The Church operates a Furniture recycling scheme which receives donated second-hand furniture. The furniture is then sold to the community at a nominal fee intended to cover operating costs only. Valuation of the donated goods is not possible and so the Church recognises the gift income and associated cost at the same value as the income actually received when sold. Whilst the Church holds a level of stock at a given time the trustees have chosen not to include the value of the stock in its balance sheet on the basis that it is not possible to value the stock until it has been sold and on the basis that the value is not material to the understanding of the financial statements.

**9 Trustees Remuneration and Related Party Transactions**

There was only one trustee who received remuneration in the year (2019: two) for their services as Elders, as permitted by the Memorandum and Articles of Association. This was the only key management person who received remuneration in the current or previous year. Total emoluments were £53,731 (2019: £65,374), including pension contributions of £3,041 (2019: £2,902).

The highest paid trustee, Phil Hillsdon, received emoluments in the year of £53,731 (2019: £53,331) including pension contributions of £3,041 (2019: £2,902). Phil Hillsdon's spouse received emoluments in the year of £5,541 (2019: £5,500) including pension contributions of £314 (2019: £299), for her services as a Pastoral Assistant.

The trustees mentioned above were reimbursed for expenses totalling £1,802 (2019: £5,950). These expenses were incurred performing their duties as Elders, and mainly comprised travelling, hospitality and telephone costs.

In addition to the above, Graham Kennedy's spouse received emoluments in the year of £16,694 (2019: £16,283) including pension contributions of £928 (2019: £886), for her services as Café Manager. No other Director or other person related to the management of the Church had any personal interest in any contract or transaction entered into by the Charity during the year.

**10 Grants Made by the Charity**

In the year, the Church made charitable grants from unrestricted funds of £19,964 (2019: £25,203) which comprised £18,728 to organisations (2019: £18,884) and £1,236 to individuals (2019: £6,319). The largest gifts were £12,000 towards the works of Christ Central, being the organisation which co-ordinates the subgroup of NewFrontiers to which the Church is affiliated, and £2,400 to Hope for Justice, an organisation which exists to bring an end to modern slavery by rescuing victims, restoring lives, and reforming society.

No grants were made from restricted funds in the year (2019: £5,283).

In all cases gifts were made to further the aims of the charity being to further Christian faith and also bring relief to persons in conditions of need, hardship or distress, or who are aged or sick.

**11 Taxation**

As a charity, King's Church Darlington is exempt from tax on income and gains falling within section 505 of the Taxes Act 1988 or s256 of the Taxation of Chargeable Gains Act 1992 to the extent that these are applied to its charitable objects. No tax charges have arisen in the Charity.

Purpose of the Gift Day Fund

This fund is built up from gift days held the Church to fund specific activities and grants to be paid. It is supplemented by adhoc donations to the Church to fund these specific activities.

At 1 January 2020 the brought forward fund included £8,670 collected towards the works of the Foodbank. Further gifts of £82,156 were received specifically towards the Food Bank costs. Expenditure incurred by the Foodbank was £44,553 such that closing funds were £46,273.

Pastoral Help Fund (formerly Poverty Relief Fund)

This fund is available to meet the needs of those in financial difficulties. A balance of £2,834 was brought forward and remained unutilised in the year.

Grant Income

**Foodbank:** The Church brought forward a grant fund of £854 towards the improvement of Foodbank Facilities. A further £10,000 was received in the year and £7,055 was expended to leave a closing balance of £3,799. A brought forward grant to support clients of the Foodbank who were in need of £2,762 was added to by a further £3,000 grant in the year. £2,364 was expended leaving a carried forward balance of £3,398. There was also a balance of £410 brought forward for the purchase of food. A further £3,000 was received in the year leaving a carried forward balance of £3,411. Grants totalling £31,573 were received towards the running of the scheme. £18,541 was utilised in the year, leaving a carried forward balance of £13,032.

**Furniture Scheme:** The Church holds grant funding designated to fund the running costs of a Furniture Recycling Scheme van. The opening balance was £1,517. An additional £3,200 was received in the year leaving a closing balance of £4,717.

Other: In the year, £1,250 was received towards the purchase of a video camera and this was fully utilised in the year, with the associated asset being capitalised. A brought forward grant of £1,000 towards the replacement of Kitchen appliances was added to by a further £800. £1,675 was spent and the assets capitalised in the year, leaving a balance of £125. A brought forward balance of £170 towards fundraising activities was utilised in the year and £1,033 was used against a brought forward £1,385 to fund equipment for King's Sports, leaving a balance of £352 to carry forward. A number of brought forward funds remained unchanged in the year. In particular, £950 towards the funding of the Soup Kitchen, £200 towards Youth Work, and £994 towards upgrade of the PA systems.

The Church received government grants under the Coronavirus Job Retention Scheme totalling £41,471 and these were fully utilised in the year.
