Hope in Africa is a small charity and works with five African men across three countries who all have long standing relationships with the trustees. These men are trusted colleagues and so this mitigates some of the risks involved with working with the continent.

Hope in Africa is linked with several churches across the UK particularly with three in Worthing which is the home of the directors of HIA.

Hope in Africa is also linked to Avail, a mission charity based in Leeds. One of their trustees is on the HIA board, and they are a help, in particular with procedural issues.

**Summary of the main activities undertaken for the public benefit in relation to these objects (include within this section the statutory declaration that trustees have had regard to the guidance issued by the Charity Commission on public benefit)**

During this year HIA has continued its regular support of children and teachers in all the schools we are linked with. Five primary schools, one secondary school and one vocational college.

The trustees see it as important to visit the projects and keep up the relationships that we have with the Africans. This engenders trust both ways. Our main ethos is to come alongside these men, seeing what they are doing and their vision under God, and then we assist where we can, rather than imposing our ideas on the men.

This year, Jamie and Christine Wright have been able to visit all the projects in Uganda and Matthew and Michelle Barrow have spent time in Kenya. Latterly, Matthew led a team of four UK builders out with him to start work on a new vocational block for Morning Star Academy in Nakuru that will be the only vocational school in the area of Engashura in Nakuru, Kenya. This will be of great help to the community.

It is noted that the trustees have had regard to the guidance issued by the Charity Commission on public benefit.

**Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year**

In May/June, Matthew and Michelle Barrow visited Kenya. Seeing the A-Kili Foundation in Itigo, (with the national board in Nairobi), they found their suggestions for the regional governing body having been implemented, making the day to day running much easier. The local board are working towards the opening up of the Wellness centre. This is the new name for the rehabilitation Centre that has been under construction. HIA have been involved in the setting up of several workshops for vocational training.

In July/August, Jamie and Christine Wright were able to visit all the schools in Uganda. This enabled them to see the progress of each school as well as to see the current challenges, and the future vision of the men we are working with.

Matthew Barrow worked towards getting everything ready for the team trip in September. Each member of the team paid for their own flights, insurance, board and keep. The overall trip was supported well particularly by two churches.

In September the team were able, with the assistance of local labour, dig the foundations of a 50 metre long building that was going to be constructed on a slope. The foundations had to be right! One of the churches was able to provide the funds enabling us to buy a cement mixer, and that meant that we could also lay 80% of the foundations in the time we were there as well. Since the team left, the local workforce have continued with the work and by the end of the year had completed all walls up to lintel level. As all the funds for the vocational block were designated, this meant that all the regular payments continued going to each school month by month.

In Malawi, the new nursery block and headmaster's office were completed, however, due to lack of funds, there has been a delay in furnishing these rooms. We were also able to help with repairs in the Elohim schools in Uganda, to the borehole and a collapsed wall being rebuilt and strengthened.

We used a new method of transferring funds to Kenya and Malawi, which helped our support as the exchange rates were more favourable. We are working on a better way to transfer to Uganda.

In the second half of the year our overall donations were not as good as 2023, we had to limit the spending of funds to the essential support of schools and no extra building work, other than essential maintenance, was carried out.



Normally it is Matthew and Michelle Barrow that visit the projects. This year Anton Green came with Matthew to Uganda, and it has been decided that Jamie and Christine Wright will visit Uganda in 2024 as trustees.

Especially in this year as there was a legacy received, as well as gifts 'in memory of' from another donor's family.

**Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year**

This year Matthew Barrow visited and spent time with each of the visionaries, and visited each of the projects. He was challenged by the vast need in each place. None of the projects had as yet recovered from the covid time. It is estimated that at least a further four years will be needed to recover financially and practically from covid.

In Itigo, Kenya, Matthew undertook a concrete block management seminar. This was partly in response to seeing the poor use of the blocks, and partly as a marketing strategy for the A-Kili centre.

The A-Kili Nairobi board had seen that their decision making was hampered by distance and so have appointed a local board of management, made up of skilled individuals who will each bring the necessary gifts to making the centre flourish. Equally, In Nairobi, the national board of Trustees was happy to see the local people take control of the centre.

In Nakuru, Patrick has begun to get ready for the construction of the new vocational block in the school. Matthew gave Patrick a set of plans that he has taken to the local building control department and the education and health offices. These plans will be approved before the UK team in September of next year will travel to set out the foundations of the block.

In Malawi, Damson had yet to finish the posho mill as the electricity supplier had said that workload was preventing the connection from happening. Damson also took Matthew to visit an area that had been decimated by the cyclone in March.

In the UK, two churches were visited: Early Christian Fellowship in Reading St Matthew's Church in Worthing, as well as The Barrow's home church, Clifton Community Church in Worthing.

He also spoke at the New Life Conference at Quinta where he shared about the project.

We have produced a three monthly news update keeping our supporters up to date with news from Africa, but the prayer meeting that had been held before, was now amalgamated into the Clifton Church Monthly mission meeting.

Regarding the trip to Nakuru in September in 2024, a small team of four men has been identified, and these men will travel with Matthew to Kenya to set out the stepped foundations of the new vocational block for Morning Star Academy.

We have been able, particularly with a legacy and gifts 'in memory of', to complete a multi-purpose school hall, that sub-divides into three classrooms in the Ray of Hope school in Kakubansiri, Lugazi, Uganda.

We have started the construction of a new nursery block and a head master's office in Penuel School in Limbe, Blantyre, Malawi. Although it was noted that the currency was devalued in the last quarter of the year, so we found a new way to transfer the donations over to Malawi that returned a better rate of exchange.

During the December school holidays, we were able to assist Sebastian Juma in concreting the school hall floor at Elohim Primary school, Magoro, Uganda.






In Malawi, Damson had yet to finish the posho mill as his builder had let him down, as had the electricity supplier.






Still hampered by the remains of covid globally, the charity was not able to travel to Africa during 2021. Also fundraising was very limited by the inability to visit churches and friends.

To that end, we have only put out monthly news updates to keep the public in the UK aware of our ongoing work in sub-Saharan Africa. We also have prayer needs published by Avail Mission once per month.

The Trustees have had regard to the guidance issued by the Charity Commission on public benefit.

We were able to set up charitable links with Amazon and Paypal. This has given us a very small income stream but we are still grateful for these two companies.

We have no policy on grant making as all our funds go to specific project that we are involved with.

We do not have sufficient funds to consider an investment of funds at this time. In addition to this, interest rates are so low that any saver account has had such low interest rates that it is uneconomic to even place reserved funds in interest bearing account.

At this time we have no volunteers for the project within the UK, other than the trustees who are working towards achieving the goals of the trust.

**Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year**

Once again, as with 2020, our charity set out to keep the educational projects that we are involved in viable during the lockdown. We were sending funds to help keep teachers paid something small on a regular basis, as well as reaching the communities around with poverty relief payments. We were amazed to find that UK donors were still able to support the work despite the times of hardship here at home.

All the schools we support have had times of lockdown; the ones in Uganda suffering most.

We have been able to start three income generation projects this year. In Malawi, a Maize grinding business and in Uganda, a photo and video business, as well as a wholesale business in Lugazi.

The young man from the Child2Child project, Ibrahim, has once again undergone chemotherapy and also treatment for pneumonia and Hope in Africa has helped with some of the hospital fees for these treatments. As well, James, the last young man from that project has been supported in his college course.

We have not been able to visit any of the projects but look forward in 2022 to visiting every country we are involved with.






This year we have given most of our donations to help the school communities that we help to maintain some level of salary for teachers during the local lockdowns in the different countries. We have also, through the kindness of people's donations, been able to provide a community poverty relief package each month for the visionary men to reach their communities around the schools with basic commodities.

The above was started in April after a trustees meeting and carried on for the remainder of the year.

After March there was no opportunity to visit any of the projects due to a cessation of international travel due to covid.

A very strange year with the corona virus impacting all we usually do.

A visit was undertaken to Uganda in February, 2020, when Matthew identified needs particularly in Ray of Hope School, Kakubansiri, Lugazi. It was the intention to return home and start a fund raising effort for this school, but the targeted businesses that it was hoped would assist with the effort either put all their workers on furlough or closed down completely.

So due to this, we have explored other avenues of funding and are awaiting news from them once local lockdowns cease.

No other activity other than keeping in touch as often as possible with the visionary men in Africa by WhatsApp and Facebook messenger and regularly holding meetings to pray for the situations over in Sub-Saharan Africa.



