The Trustees have had due regard to the Charity Commission's public benefit guidance.

ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

The 2025 appeal went out in the spring and after a slow start to receiving donations (most of which are regular ones from charitable trusts who have been supporting us for

many years) we were left a substantial personal legacy from a wonderful lady who had run a family charitable trust in the past. We remember her with fondest memories and she was a delight to know. This resulted in an exceptional year's total donations.

JFF Bali wrote in their Donor Report - "On behalf of the entire team at JFF and those who benefited from our eye health and sight recovery services, which is only possible by your kindness, generosity and support. The funds you have contributed have made an enormous difference to so many lives and enabled the JFF Bali Team to achieve excellent outcomes this year. Thank you"

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Donations increased in 2025 to £69,470 compared with £33,050 in 2024, due to one very generous and kind legacy of £50,620. Accordingly, £67,300 was remitted to JFF (2024 - £31,400). JFF(UK) has never paid for any staff, fundraising, governance costs or office overheads (rent, heating, lighting, telephone, etc.), as work has been carried out from the Chair's home. As one donation was received just before the year-end, £3,635 was held in the bank account at 31st December 2025 (£1,602 at 2024). The policy is to hold minimum cash as reserves, as is practicable.

ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

Following the death of our Founder and Chair, Jeremy Hope, in 2023, as his widow and a fellow Trustee, I was elected as Chair. I have continued with Jeremy's amazing work to garner donations, mainly from charitable trusts, for JFF in Bali, in its humanitarian cause. I am delighted that donations increased in 2024 and will endeavor to build on this in future years.

I am pleased to report the following achievements and performance of the JFF in Bali:-

Numbers January – December 2024

- Cataract operation, 3,635
- Screened 44,701
- Glasses issued 24,908
- Prosthetic eyes fitted 134

JFF has written:

“Through our Knowledge Sharing Programs, JFF continues its international volunteer medical specialists sharing, introducing innovative surgical methods and advanced technology. Beyond the tools, it's the education, mentorship, and collaboration that create long-term impact in healthcare. By bringing updated technologies to the community and fostering these relationships, we're creating a sustainable model for eye care that can evolve with the latest advancements in the field. The gift is helping us to give back a vision, and a life to people that live in darkness. Donations will help JFF to continue their work and cure more people from blindness - women, men and children who cannot afford access to eye health care. As you know, more than 7 million people in Indonesia are blind because they are poor and they are caught up in the poverty cycle because they are blind.

This is a gift of sight. We, and those we are privileged to assist, deeply appreciate our donors' generosity.”

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Donations increased in 2024 to £33,050 compared with £23,973 in 2023. £31,400 was remitted to JFF (2023 - £24,100). JFF(UK) has never paid for any staff, fundraising, governance costs or office overheads (rent, heating, lighting, telephone, etc.), as work has been carried out from the Chair's home. The Independent Examiner acts on a pro bono basis. As one donation was received just before the year-end, £1,602 was held in the bank account at 31st December 2024 (£55 at 2023). The policy is to hold minimum cash as reserves.

OBJECTIVES, ACTIVITIES AND PUBLIC BENEFIT OF JFF(UK)

“To support the humanitarian activities in Indonesia, that are charitable at law in England and Wales, of The John Fawcett Foundation, whose aim is to relieve sickness, suffering and distress, in families of the lower socio-economic group, associated through blindness, eye disease, cleft lip and palate, and serious crippling and debilitating disease, particularly in children, through provision of medical equipment, medical care, medical advice, welfare and support services”

JFF(UK) raises funds in the UK which it forwards in its entirety (less necessitated expenses) to The John Fawcett Foundation [JFF] in Bali, as soon as practicable.

The Trustees have given consideration to the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit.

JFF(UK) ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE IN 2022

In 2022, we put out a very basic appeal due to my ongoing health problems and was delighted and surprised by the positive response we received from Trusts with whom we have built up relationships over past years. Our work continues to support JFF Bali in their outstanding work.

JFF(BALI) ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE IN 2022

Due to the extreme restrictions that the Balinese Health Authorities imposed on JFF's work, this limited our Team's activities up to the beginning of 2022. Our Team has not contracted even one case of Covid. It has been vital to retain all staff. To do otherwise would result in losing staff to other hospitals from where they would never return to JFF. It takes a minimum of five years to train them up to UK Standards.

However, Covid is not completely eradicated in Bali. Therefore, the extra high standards of handwashing are still maintained, daily 'deep-cleaning' of all facilities and equipment is carried out, patients remain at safe distances apart and protective equipment is worn at all times.

The level of poverty in Bali as well as all over Indonesia has risen. This means that there are even more people now requiring JFF's assistance. The backlog of cataract surgery has grown during Covid since few cataract operations were performed. We confirm that in 2022, 40,411 patients were screened, 3,857 cataract operations were performed, 23,835 spectacles were issued and 13,268 patients treated with antibiotic eye drops. This is just short of the number of patients being treated prior to Covid restrictions being imposed on us.

FINANCIAL REVIEW OF JFF(UK)

Donations in 2022, at £28,650, were an improvement on 2021's £14,990, so £28,500 was remitted to JFF (2021 - £14,000). Since our inauguration in 2006, a total £793,500 has been transferred to JFF in Bali. JFF(UK) has not ever paid for any staff, fundraising, governance costs or office overheads (rent, heating, lighting, telephone, etc.) as work is carried out from the Chairman's home. The independent examiner acts on a pro bono basis. The admin costs each year are only for stationery, IT, printing, postage and minimal bank charges. £203 was held in the bank account at the year-end (£823 in 2021). Funds are forwarded as soon as practicable, so minimum cash is needed to be held as reserves.
