Regular weekly meetings on a Sunday morning at Stowbridge Village Hall. These involve praise and worship, preaching/teaching and mutual support and encouragement.

Weekly midweek meetings in the classrooms at the Stowbridge village hall. These involve more detailed study, prayer and further support and encouragement for one another

There is a weekly prayer meeting in one of two mobile classrooms owned by the church, adjacent to Stowbridge Village Hall.

The church helps support vulnerable people in the community.

The church supports Kuffu, a project overseas (in Uganda) which offers spiritual and practical support for needy children. These funds go to Care for Kuffu, a UK-based charity which raises awareness of the Kuffu project.

In compiling these details, the trustees have had regard to the guidance on public benefit issued by the Charity Commission.

The trustees remain grateful to each member of Grace Community Church for their financial and practical support of the objects of the church. Members give of their time, energy and talents in support of the works the church is doing.

Practical and pastoral support has been provided throughout the year by the full-time pastor, as well as the wider leadership group and others throughout the membership. This support has helped various people with their social, economic and health-related needs.
