Accounts

Tim's visits to Round House and Pune and India

Tim spoke of his revelation through the Holy Spirit in the visits he recently undertook, and how this is incredibly important in the advancing of the work- feels he has gained a greater understanding of what the work of Jigsaw has done, will do and the way it interacts with other charities and people supporting those in need.

Holy Spirit opened Tim's eyes understanding the 5 essentials of C.D (?)

Security, significance, creativity, community and boundaries.

Tim visited the 'round house' - the ministry of Gunderlina.

The round house is run for children rescued from the sex industries. Linked with Jigsaw through Dr Keith White, who invited group to meet. Located on outside of Manila. 20 feet high walls, 2 feet thick, barbed wire, huge gate etc- when Tim arrived he said it looked quite imposing/ scary from the outside, but when gates opened it was amazing and beautiful- the size of about 4 football pitches, green grass, farm, houses, lake. Tim realised the walls were not a prison but a protection. Tim spent day with children from 5-16 who had been rescued. Spent about 2 hours with Gunderlina who asked about Jigsaw- she was amazed and couldn't believe what was being done. She'd been looking for something that was a way to change the source of why this abuse has been happening. They agreed the sharing of God's love is the foundation. She said this is a serious situation which needs a serious response- she'd not heard of a response as serious as Jigsaw, please keep doing this, can it be spread across Manila.

Visiting Pune and India, an older lady (94) from Mukti mission urged us to keep Jigsaw going and saw how important it was, Mukti mision had moved their mission to be under a church, which had totally reshaped it and some children weren't going anymore etc, not a totally positive move and she pointed out that it can be important to keep the people who begin the work so that what God begins can continue and be understood.

Tim said that in India, the people were so strong inside themselves and in their culture even through much hardship. God opened Tim's mind to the brokenness of the children and the people in the Philippines- a brokenness and devastation in the people. Girls who were begging, terrible poverty. Something which Tim has never experienced before.


Time spoke about the TS Eliot quotation (mentioned at the beginning)- going back to the beginning and revealing truth. He felt there is a deep work in Jigsaw to renew brokenness. Tim has been able to see how God is healing brokenness and revealing people's identity, becoming people and knowing who they are, to find wholeness and fullness of life.

This has been quite a time for Tim! He has been able to see that Jigsaw's work is what the Philippines need. Bringing of life and identity. Tim is being spoken to about how important and needed is the work of jigsaw. Feeling power, we need to make sure that this work keeps going. It is the work of God.

Jigsaw's holiday kids club, Tim spoke to Jenna Lin- they are staying there for a week and sleeping in the slum area. She was so happy and excited because the love amongst the staff is so great. Meeting with (Jeanette)- the fire of love is in people, she said it is because they have found that love in Jigsaw.

Jigsaw AGM meeting 2024

Present: John Price, Kate Lee, Tim Lee, Stephen Conley, Mim Gosling, Jason Gosling, Elisabeth Crutchley

- Stephen apologised for being late as his screen was frozen. There were a few technology issues at the start which were commented on in the light of how these things seem to sometimes happen when there are important things that need to be said!
- Jason opened in prayer.

- Items to be discussed this evening:

Jigsaw Philippines report- Tim Lee

- Jigsaw supports children and families in extreme poverty, children on the streets from slum and squatter communities.
- What has God grown? John commented that he/ they have said for 20 years 'do what God puts in front of you'- God's vision is the one that will come to fruition.
- What has God been doing?
- With church mission society going to Philippines, set up ministry to share God's love, UK ministry, funding, partnership etc. 13 churches. Gathered us together for life giving love, with Jesus at the centre. Through all of this he has built the ministry in the Philippines called Jigsaw Philippines. Influenced by the Growth of Love book.
- Over 21 years, Jigsaw Kids ministries has strived to help provide life in all fullness for all children through Jesus. The purpose of Jigsaw is to promote children's rights through the work of the children's family centre, street family centre and so on.
- Those with needs and disabilities are particularly vulnerable when exposed to street life. Many children are exposed to extreme poverty and there is great risk for children's health and well-being.
- The family centres are places for creativity, to come to know God, to grow in faith, hope, love and well-being.

The Jigsaw Philippines ministries

- Angeles city- street family centre, in the middle of a red light district.
- Metro heights- slum area, more outside-focused- where the children are, ladies sewing ministry
- Area 4- this is where main office is for Jigsaw.
- Visayas Ave street family centre.
- Literacy school- area 4 squatter area.
- Street centre- not re-opened since Covid, running an outreach programme but physical centre not yet opened again.
- Youth ministry in area 4, agape group for 18-25 year olds where they can share and have fellowship.
- In the centres- children and youth development clubs, places to grow in faith, hope and love, be themselves and to be known and loved.

- Life groups- these are prayer, bible and discipleship groups, going very well and very popular. Where people can pray, read bible and share together, twice a week. God is working amazingly through this.
- Support services, health and welfare, responding to emergency needs and saving and building up lives. Home visits and outreach.
- Jigsaw disability program, support for children with disability as well as their families
- Literacy programmes
- Ladies empowerment sewing program In all we do, we are sharing the love of God- these are incredible places where God's love is shared. The sewing workshops also have bible and prayer group they can choose to go to if they would like to.

- Importance of us and others understanding the importance and depths of the impact of what is being done through Jigsaw.
- John asks a question- considering During period of 20 years, if you can take 1 person who has been through Jigsaw. What organisation is there that can take them on and keep what they have had through Jigsaw (ie how can the good work begun continue into adulthood?)

Tim responded that this is a journey of God. We are doing what he asks and that Jigsaw is a holistic model of ministry. Jigsaw is developing community and household ministry- children who are now adults who are forming the community, being the parents- transformation can happen through them. We are going to see changes through this ministry and adults transforming the community.

- Nations are transformed through children.
- If brokenness is healed or doesn't happen because of God's love, this is transformative in and of itself. Lots still to go, but the revelation is to do what is happening already, seeing the wholeness that is being created through the outworking of God's love.
- Jason spoke and said that this is a great affirmation about lives which have been changed and how families and communities changed through this work. Changing things through the children is the way that change happens. He mentioned how 'attacks' on this meeting this eve shows the importance of the work that is being done. Praise be to God and praise for Tim for continuing to do what he is doing.
- Clay jars, brittle jars- God trusts his love to be happening through us.

Jigsaw UK report:

- We don't understand everything but this is some of the things that we can see
- Churches being part of this and how they work into what is happening.
- Jigsaw Philippines are working hard to seek resources for monthly running of ministries
- Tim is going to visit most of the Jigsaw supporting churches
- Emma coming to work as administrator has had a massive impact on the running of Jigsaw. Lots of work is happening through Emma, emails, documentation etc, making the running of things much smoother, people are getting replies etc, databases are being updated, records, mailchimp is working. Building up of relationships with people is working very well. Emma is beginning to review school sponsorship. This has been a big blessing from God in everything that she is doing.

Update on finances (John Price/ Tim Lee)

- We are on track to be short of money per month (due to increased costs- still consistent giving but cost of resources has increased). Question is: how can Jigsaw Philippines keep going without Jigsaw UK? Would this mean cutting areas of work? This is not something that is idea. If giving does not increase we will have to consider cutting some of the areas of work/ staff etc.
- Response? Tim has prepared a Jigsaw 2024 funding appeal to increase number of supporters, churches etc. As John said, we need to do what's in front of us. Grace (Lee!) says 'God will do the rest'
- Giving has increased by about 38 supporters, which has increased giving of £1500 a month. There is still a shortfall (£1900)
- Appeal needs to go out and response needs to be fairly swift.
- Serious things need money. Responsibility of the church to fund God's mission.
- CMS have been asking what Tim's plan is into the future, when he will be thinking of retiring etc (he's not yet!)
- John spoke and mentioned orphan homes (Muller)- relied on God and only and always God. His ways are not our ways!

John mentioned how £7000 in Jigsaw accounts has been carried across to New Year 2024. But currently expenditure more than income- £7000 brought through from year before is funding the shortfall at the minute. John reminded everyone that no money is drawn out if it makes us go into the red (debt), money to Philippines only goes if the money is physically there. Gradual costs are catching us up. Extra money won't cover us forever. Jigsaw Philippines to get money themselves to cover some of their costs themselves. In another few months surplus will be sent.

John is confident the shortfall will be covered because of God, and the importance of the work

Discussion of dates for the next meeting.

- Tim mentioned that next Sunday he will be speaking at Hemingford Grey, and the Sunday after at Alconbury.
- The next meeting should be in 3 months/ 4 months
- A date was agreed upon of Tuesday July 16th 2024: 7:00pm



Jigsaw AGM meeting 2024

Present: John Price, Kate Lee, Tim Lee, Stephen Conley, Mim Gosling, Jason Gosling, Elisabeth Crutchley

- Stephen apologised for being late as his screen was frozen. There were a few technology issues at the start which were commented on in the light of how these things seem to sometimes happen when there are important things that need to be said!
- Jason opened in prayer.
- Bible readings: Ephesians 3: v17-19
- Psalm 113
- T.S Elliot quotation: "We shall not cease from exploration. And the end of all our exploring will be to arrive where we started and know the place for the first time".
- Items to be discussed this evening:
 - Jigsaw Philippines report
 - Jigsaw UK report

Jigsaw Philippines report- Tim Lee

- Jigsaw supports children and families in extreme poverty, children on the streets from slum and squatter communities.
- What has God grown? John commented that he/ they have said for 20 years 'do what God puts in front of you'- God's vision is the one that will come to fruition.
- What has God been doing?
- With church mission society going to Philippines, set up ministry to share God's love, UK ministry, funding, partnership etc. 13 churches. Gathered us together for life giving love, with Jesus at the centre. Through all of this he has built the ministry in the Philippines called Jigsaw Philippines. Influenced by the Growth of Love book.
- Over 21 years, Jigsaw Kids ministries has strived to help provide life in all fullness for all children through Jesus. The purpose of Jigsaw is to promote children's rights through the work of the children's family centre, street family centre and so on.
- Those with needs and disabilities are particularly vulnerable when exposed to street life. Many children are exposed to extreme poverty and there is great risk for children's health and well-being.
- The family centres are places for creativity, to come to know God, to grow in faith, hope, love and well-being.

The Jigsaw Philippines ministries

- Angeles city- street family centre, in the middle of a red light district.
- Metro heights- slum area, more outside-focused- where the children are, ladies sewing ministry
- Area 4- this is where main office is for Jigsaw.
- Visayas Ave street family centre.
- Literacy school- area 4 squatter area.
- Street centre- not re-opened since Covid, running an outreach programme but physical centre not yet opened again.
- Youth ministry in area 4, agape group for 18-25 year olds where they can share and have fellowship.
- In the centres- children and youth development clubs, places to grow in faith, hope and love, be themselves and to be known and loved.

- Life groups- these are prayer, bible and discipleship groups, going very well and very popular. Where people can pray, read bible and share together, twice a week. God is working amazingly through this.
- Support services, health and welfare, responding to emergency needs and saving and building up lives. Home visits and outreach.
- Jigsaw disability program, support for children with disability as well as their families
- Literacy programmes
- Ladies empowerment sewing program In all we do, we are sharing the love of God- these are incredible places where God's love is shared. The sewing workshops also have bible and prayer group they can choose to go to if they would like to.
- Education sponsorship and ALS (accelerated learning system)- where young people can join the program and they can go through school or college in 2/3/4 years.
- Jigsaw parenting, households, community development program/

This is what God has grown in Jigsaw.

Tim's visits to Round House and Pune and India

- Tim spoke of his revelation through the Holy Spirit in the visits he recently undertook, and how this is incredibly important in the advancing of the work- feels he has gained a greater understanding of what the work of Jigsaw has done, will do and the way it interacts with other charities and people supporting those in need. Holy Spirit opened Tim's eyes understanding the 5 essentials of C.D (?)
- Security, significance, creativity, community and boundaries.

Tim visited the 'round house'- the ministry of Gunderlina.

- The round house is run for children rescued from the sex industries. Linked with Jigsaw through Dr Keith White, who invited group to meet. Located on outside of Manila. 20 feet high walls, 2 feet thick, barbed wire, huge gate etc- when Tim arrived, he said it looked quite imposing/ scary from the outside, but when gates opened it was amazing and beautiful- the size of about 4 football pitches, green grass, farm, houses, lake. Tim realised the walls were not a prison but a protection. Tim spent day with children from 5-16 who had been rescued. Spent about 2 hours with Gunderlina who asked about Jigsaw- she was amazed and couldn't believe what was being done. She'd been looking for something that was a way to change the source of why this abuse has been happening. **They agreed the sharing of God's love is the foundation. She said this is a serious situation which needs a serious response- she'd not heard of a response as serious as Jigsaw, please keep doing this, can it be spread across Manila.**
- Visiting Pune and India, an older lady (94) from Mukti mission urged us to keep Jigsaw going and saw how important it was, Mukti mission had moved their mission to be under a church, which had totally reshaped it and some children weren't going anymore etc, not a totally positive move and she pointed out that it can be important to keep the people who begin the work so that what God begins can continue and be understood.
- Tim said that in India, the people were so strong inside themselves and in their culture even through much hardship. God opened Tim's mind to the brokenness of the children and the people in the Philippines- a brokenness and devastation in the people. Girls who were begging, terrible poverty. Something which Tim has never experienced before.
 - beginning and revealing truth. He there is a deep work in Jigsaw to renew brokenness. Tim has been able to see Time spoke about the TS Eliot quotation (mentioned at the

beginning)- going back to the felt how God is healing brokenness and revealing people's identity, becoming people and knowing who they are, to find wholeness and fullness of life.

- This has been quite a time for Tim! He has been able to see that Jigsaw's work is what the Philippines need. Bringing of life and identity. Tim is being spoken to about how important and needed is the work of jigsaw. Feeling power, we need to make sure that this work keeps going. It is the work of God.
- Jigsaw's holiday kids club, Tim spoke to Jenna Lin- they are staying there for a week and sleeping in the slum area. She was so happy and excited because the love amongst the staff is so great. Meeting with (Jeanette)- the fire of love is in people, she said it is because they have found that love in Jigsaw.
- Growth of love conference- he said this is the biggest expression of church that he has ever seen. Something powerful happening.
- Importance of us and others understanding the importance and depths of the impact of what is being done through Jigsaw.
- John asks a question- considering During period of 20 years, if you can take 1 person who has been through Jigsaw. What organisation is there that can take them on and keep what they have had through Jigsaw (ie how can the good work begun continue into adulthood?)

Tim responded that this is a journey of God. We are doing what he asks and that Jigsaw is a holistic model of ministry. Jigsaw is developing community and household ministry- children who are now adults who are forming the community, being the parents- transformation can happen through them. We are going to see changes through this ministry and adults transforming the community.

- Nations are transformed through children.
- If brokenness is healed or doesn't happen because of God's love, this is transformative in and of itself. Lots still to go, but the revelation is to do what is happening already, seeing the wholeness that is being created through the outworking of God's love.
- Jason spoke and said that this is a great affirmation about lives which have been changed and how families and communities changed through this work. Changing things through the children is the way that change happens. He mentioned how 'attacks' on this meeting this eve shows the importance of the work that is being done. Praise be to God and praise for Tim for continuing to do what he is doing.
- Clay jars, brittle jars- God trusts his love to be happening through us.

Jigsaw UK report:

- We don't understand everything but this is some of the things that we can see
- Churches being part of this and how they work into what is happening.
- Jigsaw Philippines are working hard to seek resources for monthly running of ministries
- Tim is going to visit most of the Jigsaw supporting churches
- Emma coming to work as administrator has had a massive impact on the running of Jigsaw. Lots of work is happening through Emma, emails, documentation etc, making the running of things much smoother, people are getting replies etc, databases are being updated, records, mailchimp is working. Building up of relationships with people is working very well. Emma is beginning to review school sponsorship. This has been a big blessing from God in everything that she is doing.

Update on finances (John Price/ Tim Lee)

- We are on track to be short of money per month (due to increased costs- still consistent giving but cost of resources has increased). Question is: how can Jigsaw Philippines keep going without Jigsaw UK? Would this mean cutting areas of work? This is not something that is idea. If giving does not increase we will have to consider cutting some of the areas of work/ staff etc.
- Response? Tim has prepared a Jigsaw 2024 funding appeal to increase number of supporters, churches etc. As John said, we need to do what's in front of us. Grace (Lee!) says 'God will do the rest'
- Giving has increased by about 38 supporters, which has increased giving of £1500 a month. There is still a shortfall (£1900)
- Appeal needs to go out and response needs to be fairly swift.
- Serious things need money. Responsibility of the church to fund God's mission.
- CMS have been asking what Tim's plan is into the future, when he will be thinking of retiring etc (he's not yet!)
- John spoke and mentioned orphan homes (Muller)- relied on God and only and always God. His ways are not our ways!

John mentioned how £7000 in Jigsaw accounts has been carried across to New Year 2024. But currently expenditure more than income- £7000 brought through from year before is funding the shortfall at the minute. John reminded everyone that no money is drawn out if it makes us go into the red (debt), money to Philippines only goes if the money is physically there. Gradual costs are catching us up. Extra money won't cover us forever. Jigsaw Philippines to get money themselves to cover some of their costs themselves. In another few months surplus will be sent.

John is confident the shortfall will be covered because of God, and the importance of the work

Discussion of dates for the next meeting.

- Tim mentioned that next Sunday he will be speaking at Hemingford Grey, and the Sunday after at Alconbury.
- The next meeting should be in 3 months/ 4 months
- A date was agreed upon of Tuesday July 16th 2024: 7:00pm

John Price closed in prayer.

Jigsaw Annual Board Meeting: 04/01/22

Present: Tim and Kate Lee, Mim and Jason Gosling, John Price, Stephen Conley, Elisabeth Crutchley.

Welcome (Jason):

Welcome and apologies for the long time between meetings this time.

Bible Reading/ Reflection: (Isaiah 9: 1-7): Kate and Elisabeth read.
Chosen because Pastor Joli reflected on these verses at Christmas party.
Feels like there isn't a lot of hope at the moment. Government in the Philippines etc. But the hope isn't in these governments but in that of God, our hope is in him not those on earth. 'The Zeal of the Lord Almighty will accomplish this' - empowerment from this.

Prayer for the meeting (Steve):

Prayed thanks for God for being the same yesterday today and forever, He is in control!
Prayed for Grace's mock exam tomorrow (iGCSE)

Financial report (John):

Income & expenditure: fairly normal year.
Jason asked how long it has been stable- John replied over 10 years, and remarked it all just balances each time! Tim only gives money that we have to Manila, and we don't give money we don't have ie we are never in debt. Money hasn't come from HMRC yet but John assumes it will be coming in January.
Not much has changed, some new givers, most remains similar to normal.

Jason asked about:

Misc expenses? £1080- Tim replied various bits of office equipment, receipts available.
Kildrick- John explained that Kildrick sent us some money (coffee morning), and then realised that they should have sent us the cheques due to gift aid, had to reprocess.

Office is St Ives, not staffed, one of contributors owns office and pays in cheques when they come through.

Jason interjected to thank John for his service, Tim concurred and added his thanks.

Tim added about giving in the Philippines:

Christmas appeal- beginning of December-
Received £5200

New Jigsaw van needed- UK plus Philippines giving has raised £9,346 so far towards this, £4654 still needed.

HMRC money is £5200- tax didn't come in so we couldn't pay end of year salary, have used £4500 from van appeal to pay their wages at this time. When HMRC money comes through it will go back into the van appeal.

Jigsaw won an award from Paypal- \$5000, more explained later.

John mentioned he has asked the treasurer of the church to give the accounts the ok which has been fine for the last number of years!

Director's report (Tim)

Jesus said 'I have come that they may have life, life in all fullness'- vision for Jigsaw.

- Goal is to transform children's lives through the love of God.
- By:
 - Giving grants to organisations
 - Human resources
 - Humanitarian resources

 - Providing education
 - Religious activity
 - Economic/ community development

1. To be an umbrella body for 'Friends of Jigsaw UK'

- Prayer
- Funding

'Friends of Jigsaw'-giving in the U.K
17 Churches have given gifts- CMS/ Jigsaw
364 Individuals- 151 given in 2021

Individual gifts important, but Church fundraising and giving is essential.
Tim went through and listed the churches, discussed the spread of the churches across the country.
Keeping enthusiastic and supportive, remarked how amazing how they have kept going through the years.

Jigsaw education sponsorship: 100 children going to school in Philippines, there are 42 sponsors in the UK, some sponsor more than 1 child.

Moving forward we could do with someone who coordinates this in the UK. Children in Philippines commit to sending 3 letters per year.

Connection with sponsors in last few years hasn't been as good as it should, mostly because there is too much to do! Pray for this moving forward.

Prayer ministry: Through newsletters, Facebook etc (this has dropped off recently), monthly prayer meetings but these have stopped at the minute. CMS could be a way of developing this further.

Communications: 4 newsletters in 2021, news and prayer updates, these take time and can be hard work so happy to have got 4 out so far.

Website- needs work, but does now have a place for giving which is electronic now, and people can fill in gift aid form online.

Moving forward, not possible to do all of these things, needs delegating- help needed with admin as there is a great deal to do.

Church visits- these are continuing to happen online or in person, in last 3 months there have been 4 which has been great.

Friends of Jigsaw- Kate helps a lot with this, but Tim feels lots of what he would like to do with this is stopped by large amount of admin.

2. To manage, facilitate funding, grants and resourcing for Jigsaw Philippines.

Fund raising/ resourcing-

Banking and payroll

Personal assistant- Debbie banks cheques, scans cheques, etc for us. Limit to how long this can continue.

Cynthia (Kate's aunt) has agreed to come and do thank you letters and communications again.

Monitoring use of funds and grants- tight set of systems and procedures in place for this. All funds sent are monitored and overseen- Tim goes through these regularly.

Funds/ grants made to Philippines in the last 6 months- £63,517

Payroll, facilities, transport, community ministries, support services, staff training, office and tech covered through this money- breakdown available.

Prayer has been requested for funds coming from the Philippines- this has started to happen, 2 lots of £2000 grants have been given, grants from ACMs for emergency hygiene kits- £1500, grant from Paypal for emergency food relief given -\$5000

Almost £10,000 given from Philippines which is big answer to prayer.

Steve checked whether typhoon affected Jigsaw's area, Tim replied that it didn't, it was a few thousand miles away from where Jigsaw operates.

Jigsaw Kids ministries Philippines

Programmes have focused on kids clubs, youth clubs and agape clubs at home- packs for children to complete at home including food bag every week, going out to more than 2500 children.

Jeanette (new director) is super enthusiastic about children's mental health through Covid, and the impact of waiting to receive packs has a massive positive effect on the children.

Literacy classes at home- packs in bags delivered out for the children to do.

Education sponsorship online- Samsung galaxy tablets- 15 altogether now to help with online schooling.

Health and well being keeps going- more food handouts, over 2000 children and families, health and well being response still going – 1-1, keeps going through Christmas.

Children with disabilities ministry- therapy (creams, toys, diagrams handed to families) and family network (online and visits) have kept going.

Street children ministry at home- weekly food bags- keeps going still.

Ladies empowerment ministry- sewing bags handed out each week with resources- things made to sell or for their own families- over 1000 ladies, prayer ministry also now which goes alongside this ministry.

Additional activities: Child trauma training- Jigsaw attended, one trained kids worker in each ministry, able to respond in better and deeper ways.

November- there was a window of around 6 weeks where Covid rates were low- Jigsaw could do face to face, UNICEF children's month. Hygiene kits handed out, and food kits handed out too.

December- Christmas parties were able to be face to face.

Jeanette today fed back that Covid is rising again and they are back in level 3.

3. Organisational, personnel and program development

Strengthening Jigsaw, big part of what Tim is doing- reviewing job descriptions and many other things being done at the moment.

Lendel, Jeanette (who Tim is mentoring), Tim, and the Jigsaw leadership team.

4. Running and implementing Jigsaw's Kids Ministries.

Tim spoke of finding it frustrating that his job is mostly sitting on a computer at a desk which is not ideal. It is however a privilege to be able to work for Jigsaw. He is still a CMS mission partner, they are excited that Jigsaw might start to develop other things throughout Asia.

Tim on a 3 year contract with them until 2024 at the moment.

Jason interjected to thank Tim on behalf of the board for his incredible work and talked about how inspirational the feedback is.

Tim thanked the board in return, and mentioned how important it is that everyone is on board spiritually as well and pray for Jigsaw.

Goals for 2022:

This will be discussed in the next meeting.

Tim spoke of feeling that we are at a crossroads, what is the purpose of Jigsaw Kids Ministries UK going forward?

God's been working through this for 18 years.

Tim asks: As Jigsaw Philippines grows, so their needs will grow. What will this mean? Do we grow more and more here in the UK, or is the vision for us to get smaller as Jigsaw Philippines gets bigger? Which is the right way to go?

Until now we have followed God step by step, feel it is important to seek God in this.

Empowering Jigsaw Philippines to raise its own funds and to be able to manage them.

Definitely needed for 1 or 2 years at least. Jigsaw UK could connect with more schools, churches etc, but there is a question over where we go from here.

Jason spoke- on our vision plans initially it was a part of the vision to make Jigsaw Philippines more self sustaining- this is the ideal, and then we move and put another fledgeling organisation somewhere in South East Asia, talked about this 3-4 years ago.

Tim- feels that we should all commit to pray for God's vision and guidance for this for Jigsaw Kids Ministries UK. The new director is fantastic, probably needs another year of support from Tim, but feels that this path might be coming to an end.

John- said there has been consolidation and growth- one major difference is the large amounts of money coming in from Philippines. Stressed this is not an individual's work, but God's work. If there needs to be an expansion in the Philippines, God will provide it. Do what is in front of us. Emphasised putting trust in God- having an expectant heart. Funding sources will come up, it's God's work.

Tim- one of our things to do is to pray as we go.

Specific things that need prayer:

- Help with admin
- For someone for Tim to work with
- A team!

Jason: suggested an intern (Tim noted this is the second time it has been mentioned)

Proposal of goals for 2022:

MOM- memorandum of agreement.

Tim will send this out- partnership agreement, please highlight any questions and send it back to Tim (next couple of weeks).

Jason asked how many meetings we should have per year- generally 3, thinking about future dates. 'Annual board meeting' wording rather than AGM, otherwise we have to invite everyone- public meeting. Legally we are not required to have an AGM.

AOB:

Mim- suggested that we need a real life face to face meeting!

Jason- asked if the Lees have a house yet?

Tim replied- No not yet, Kate's job is temporary until Easter and house renting until end of March- pray for these things!

Jason- asked about timing for another meeting? Easter 17th April, school holidays generally better.

Proposed date- Tuesday 12th 12:30

Elisabeth host- Mim and Jason can host guests if needed.

Mim- closed in prayer.

2. Jason introduced with prayer.

3. Family updates

John- had both vaccinations already, looking at God's plan, continuing 'ABC's of salvation' posting through doors. Continue to pray for Jigsaw, thanks for updates etc.

Stephen- reflected on lockdown, it has been lovely to see nature, go on walks, being able to find services on Youtube with different churches, being able to read more of the bible in the year than ever before, hidden blessings of lockdown. Debs (daughter) continuing with study. Julia sends her love.

Mim and Jason- Christmas quieter than planned, spent Christmas day with friends, feeling normal and being with friends was lovely. School interesting- Jan and Feb children taught online. When they were back to school everyone was desperate for them to be there, very happy to be back. Teaching online fun to start with but it was tough in the end. A tiring term. Jason has been struggling with long covid, headaches, aches and pains. Both are doing testing at school, concerned about potential false positives as this leads to children being off school. Children all doing very well!

Tim and Kate- all well and healthy, Christmas was challenging not being able to travel, Grace and Tim were not well at all, didn't test because if positive they would be quarantined in unpleasant gyms. Kate been back at school since January, early years centres went back before main schools. School children struggling to readjust, e.g forgotten how to share etc! Rebekah in Norwich, came back from Germany in Feb, working at a holiday club. Asked to make a lent resource which is now being used in 80 countries around the world! James is doing his A levels, and has got a place at UEA.

Elisabeth- carrying on as before, still enjoying childminding. Dominic working from home which is going well for him. Spending this week together doing lots of walks, enjoying being away from work for a while.

4. Minutes from last meeting

Agreed

5. Finance report:

Extra 20,000(ish) coming in this year. Spent another 10,000 this year. Increased giving and what has been done over the Covid period. Increased since the New Year. Everything running ok, not in debt. Gift aid income is substantial- increases the giving a lot.

John asked Tim how things are going in the Phillipines accounts wise, Tim answered that the Phillipines accounts is not connected to us, our responsibility to make sure it is done wisely. Everything is up to date and no debt. End of October (four months ago), running with small surplus in the bank. Accounts will be submitted to the charity commission.

(Jason): a real gift that giving has been going up significantly.

(Tim): March was when we made an extra appeal, £16- 18,000 came in for the emergency response.

(Jason): questioned whether this would be a yearly thing, Tim unsure at the minute.

Income reverted back to normal giving. Expenditure higher than normal expenditure but this is to get through things connected to Covid.

Accounts were proposed and agreed.

6. Directors' report

- Tim shared a powerpoint from previous meeting. Review of previous year from November. Shorter report from Jan/Feb/March.
Finance report for Jigsaw Philippines for 2020 Jan- Dec (doesn't quite match to ours timewise). Received around £107,000. MOU part of their agreement is to send their yearly accounts.
John asks if conversion rate increasing- more pasos to the pound.
Jason asks if we are still the sole provider of funds, Tim replies we are about 98%.
Other report will also be submitted as part of the AGM.
- Report which covers UK, Churches and Phillipines- update from January until now.
- Time shared that Ate Beth- one of the main workers- died, was only 51, died from terminal cancer. This death has had a huge effect on Jigsaw, young people, staff and those who knew her struggling to come to terms with her death.
- Programmes continuing- review in January, Covid still increasing in Philippines (no real plan for vaccinations), Jigsaw will continue with programmes and initiatives led throughout the virus. Reaching more than 2000 children a week. Reviews showed that almost all households are struggling for food etc. Committed to providing 1 hot meal for 2000 children per day. Extra £3000 come in February which is paying for the programme.
- Lockdown in Philippines- everything locked down but Jigsaw still has passes so can come in. Covid plans in place to make things safer. Sponsorship programme continuing online, 30 more Samsung tablets donated, used to access online schooling. Data cards given out.
Community team identifying children not on the sponsorship program but who are unable to access schooling for the extra tablets, as well as bible studies and so on.
- Children with disability program- each child has a pack specific to their needs- Gemma was initially quite negative but now sees it is happening and making a big difference. This may have opened up opportunities as this approach may be a good way to do this in future as well.
- Ladies online bible studies- good relationships being built up. 5 online bible studies, 200 ladies a week coming using Jigsaw's tablets. Being led by a trained pastor. Lots and lots of great opportunities to spread the gospel.
- Sewing at home still continuing, making things for the home etc.

Jigsaw's Leadership Team:

- Lee family called to Asia in 2019
- Pandemic surprise to us but not God!- needed for this strategic time.
- Called back believing that Jigsaw could become an independent Filipino child development ministry- this didn't seem to be happening. BUT last 4 weeks things have been changing.
- Tim recalled that God has grown ministry from the roots up, began with food, then kids club, dividing people into teams, made leadership team, admin etc.
- However, there wasn't an overall leader there which it became clear was needed. Leadership team were suffering, no real governance happening.
- Who can do this job? 3 weeks ago, became in contact with Jeanette who some years ago was Tim and Kate's cook and cleaner who had a dream of becoming social worker. Jeanette went to university and became social worker. Tim met her a few weeks ago. Previously worked for Jigsaw, and since has become one of top CIP people in Philippines. Didn't think she'd come back to Jigsaw. Jeanette felt God speak to her and called to become the director of Jigsaw.
- Jigsaw LT has someone to relate to, oversight and direction- amazing! What a miracle to happen in such a short space of time. This will allow Tim to focus on his role as director of Jigsaw UK.
- Tim will still be part of Jigsaw development team.
- Still a way to go- so pray!
- Jigsaw general assembly and board of Trustees is growing- great to have lots of people from the local community and who have had connections to Jigsaw in the past.
- Governance growing and they now have a director.
- Exciting times looking forward!
- Asia CMS- Tim has been connected with a family of a young man who arrived in Malaysia 3 years ago with his sister, father killed, mother beaten, they were offered asylum in New Zealand, but this didn't happen due to Covid and lost papers. Became believers which is dangerous here. Tim helping with their papers with the UN. None of family have been to school. Tim taking on teaching family to read

and write, to use computers etc. Very humbling experience. Pray for all practicalities, safety, and so on.

- Tim noted a change of lingo- MOA= memorandum of agreement (instead of MOU)
- Last week Tim felt God gave a big vision for Jigsaw UK. Calling to be partners in mission with Jigsaw Kids ministries Philippines. Part of discussion with CMS was to do training, Tim felt this was not going to happen but in the last week he realises it is happening.
- Early years vision opening up- early years child development ministry. Tim has been getting to know ministries across Asia and creating links. God has opened these doors to support the development of ministries. Holistic child development including early years education.
- This will be discussed in July when the Lees come home.
- Funding for this work? We don't need to take anything. We will provide air fares, God will provide *'take nothing for the journey except a staff... (Mark 6)*
- Stephen asked if Tim has spoken to CMS about this vision, Tim replies not specifically but it was written into the job description.
- John noted that Tim's vision is Jigsaw moving out into Asia, knowledge sufficient to train others.
- Tim replied it will open lots of pathways for other things as well. Time in Asia means there are so many connections to places all over Asia.

Lee family update:

- Became clear that they need to come home to UK.
- Fits with God's timing- they thought they would be there 3-4 years so things not as expected, but it does work.
- Tim continues as CMS mission partner, and will focus on role as director of Jigsaw UK.
- Praying and seeking but family will be moving to the Lake District. 1 reason because Grace has struggled in Malaysia. Family who she connects really well with in the Lake District. They all feel very called there.
- 5 other CMS people who feel called to the Lake District- interesting! Confirmation that there must be a reason for the calling.
- They still have their house in St Ives- currently being rented.
- Kate needs to get a job- not as many in Cumbria so pray for this!
- Tenants need to stay in the house for the time being. Will continue to keep renting for now.
- Family need prayer for a job for Kate, and for a place to live. Area they are looking at is Milnthorpe (Cumbria)
- Pray for training, vision and practicalities etc.

Jason- spoke for board that we feel blessed when we hear all the news of what Jigsaw and the Lee family have been doing. Work is incredible. Trustees agree.

Tim replies that board is strong, friendships and faith is strong.


